THE HAT, CAP AND FUR INDUSTRY, 1918.

A preliminary report on the above industry for the calendar year 1918 has been completed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. The report covers the operations of 199 individual establishments for the whole of Canada, of which 93 were in the province of Ontario, 71 in Quebec, 20 in Manitoba, 7 in Alberta, Saskatchewan and British Columbia, and 8 in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

Capital Investment.
