THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA.

Ottawa, March 1927.- A report is herewith presented on the Hat and Cap Industry in Canada for the calendar year 1925. Reports were received from 119 establishments, an increase of 10 over the total for the preceding year and were located by provinces as follows,- Ontario 50; Quebec 54; Manitoba 5; Alberta 4; British Columbia 2; New Brunswick 2; Nova Scotia 1; Saskatchewan 1. In order not to divulge information concerning the operations of individual establishments statistics for the last four provinces have been combined and are shown throughout this report as "Other Provinces".

PRINCIPAL STATISTICS

A summary of the principal statistics of the industry is given in Table K by provinces for the calendar year 1925.

THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA - 1925

PRODUCTION

The quantity and value of the various products of the industry is given by provinces in Table II for the calendar year 1925. The total value of production rose from \$10,373,987 in 1924 to \$11,862,745 in 1925, an increase of \$1,488,758. The principal items showing substantial increases in value were, - Caps, cloth; hats fur felt men's; hats velour women's.

THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA 1925

CAPITAL INVESTMENT

The capital employed in the industry during the calendar year 1925 is given by provinces in Table III. The total capitalization rose from \$6,665,700 in 1924 to \$7,168,891 in 1925, an increase of \$503,191 over the two year period. Of the total the provinces of Ontario contributed \$4,102,740 or 57.2 per cent, Quebec was accountable for \$2,575,207 or 35.9 per cent whilst the remaining 6.9 per cent was contributed by the other six provinces.

EMPLOYEES, SALARIES AND WAGES

The total number of persons employed in the industry is given by provinces in Table 4 for the calendar year 1925 by (a) classes of employment, (b) sex and (c) salary and wage payments. The total number of persons in all classes employed during the calendar year 1924 was 3,225 whilst for the period covered by this report the total employees were 3,782, an increase of 557. The total payroll rose from \$3,185,384 in 1924 to \$3,454,172 in 1925, an increase of \$268,788.

OTHER EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The number of days the factories were in operation during the calendar year 1925 together with the number of hours per day and per week normally worked by wage-earners will be found in Table V(a). The number of wage-earners employed during the same period is shown by sex and months in Table V(b). Employment reached its maximum in the month of September with 3,519 whilst the month of least employment was June with 3,123.

FUEL CONSUMPTION

The quantity and value of the various kinds of fuel consumed in the industry during the calendar year 1925 is given in Table VI. The total cost of all fuel consumed fell from \$68,595 in 1924 to \$58,522 in 1925, a decrease of \$10,373. Coal of all kinds holds first place in importance with a total of \$52,393 followed by gas with \$4,877 whilst coke takes third position with \$993.

POWER INSTALLATION

The power installation of the industry is given in Table VII for the calendar year 1925 by (a) classes of power (b) number of units in each class and (c) horse-power capacity according to manufacturers' rating. The number of units actually in use rose from 213 in 1924 to 217 in 1925, an increase of 4, whilst the horse-power capacity fell from 1,673 in 1924 to 1,362 in 1925, a decrease of 311 H.P. over the two year period.
