

THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA

1926

Ottawa, January 1923. A report is herewith presented on the Hat and Cap Industry in Canada for the calendar year 1926. Reports were received from 138 establishments, an increase of 19 over the total for the preceding year and were located by provinces as follows:- Ontario 60; Quebec 62; Manitoba 7; Alberta 3; British Columbia 2; New Brunswick 2; Nova Scotia 1; Saskatchewan 1. In order not to divulge information concerning the operations of individual establishments, statistics for the last four provinces have been combined and are shown throughout this report as "Other Provinces."


PRINCIPAL STATISTICS



PRODUCTION

The quantity and value of the varicus products of the industry is given by provinces in Table II for the calendar year 1926. The total value of production rose from \$11,862,745 in 1925 to \$13,671,126 in 1926, an increase of \$1,808,381. The principal items showing substantial increases in value were, - Caps, cloth; hats fur felt women's; hats velour men's; and all other women's hats of silk, velvet, felt, satin, etc.



CAPITAL INVESTMENT

The capital employed in the industry during the calendar year 1926 is given by provinces in Table III. The total capitalization fell from \$7,168,891 in 1925 to \$7,107,380 in 1926, a decrease of \$61,511 over the two year period. The decrease in capital investment in 1926 is due to a modification in the questionnaire used in 1925 by the omission of "the estimated value of land, buildings, and machinery, if leased or rented" because it was found that when several manufacturing concerns were housed in the same building each gave the estimated value of the whole building instead of the premises actually occupied by them. On this account fixed capital decreased by \$286,227 although the number of establishments reporting had increased by 19. Working capital on the other hand for this reason increased from \$4,998,027 in 1925 to \$5,222,743 in 1926 or an increase of \$224,716. Of the total investment the province of Ontario contributed \$3,847,943 or 54.1 per cent, Quebec was accountable for \$2,710,263 or 38.1 per cent whilst the remaining 7.8 per cent was contributed by the other six provinces.

A measure of the size and importance of the establishment in the industry from the standpoint of capital investment is shown by certain groupings in the following summary.



EMPLOYEES, SALARIES AND WAGES

The total number of persons employed in the industry is given by provinces in Table 4 for the calendar year 1926 by (a) classes of employment, (b) sex and (c) salary and wage payments. The total number of persons in all classes employed during the calendar year 1925 was 3,782 whilst for the period covered by this report the total employees were 4,203, an increase of 421. The total payroll rose from \$3,454,172 in 1925 to \$3,936,522 in 1926, an increase of \$482,350 or nearly 14 per cent.

OTHER EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS


The number of days the factories were in operation during the calendar year 1926 together with the number of hours per day and per week normally worked by wage-earners will be found in Table V(a). The number of wage-earners employed during the same period is shown by sex and months in Table V(b). Employment reached its maximum in the month of September with 3,865, whilst the month of least employment was June with 3,402.

FUEL CONSUMPTION

The quantity and value of the various kinds of fuel consumed in the industry during the calendar year 1926 is given in Table VI. The total cost of all fuel consumed rose from \$58,522 in 1925 to \$65,471 in 1926, an increase of \$6,949. Coal of all kinds holds first place in importance with a total of \$52,815 followed by gas with \$8,575 whilst fuel oil takes third position with \$2,086.

POWER INSTALLATION

The power installation of the industry is given in Table VII for the calendar year 1926 by (a) classes of power (b) number of units in each class and (c) horse-power capacity according to manufacturers' rating. The number of units actually in use rose from 217 in 1925 to 246 in 1926, an increase of 29, whilst the horse-power capacity fell from 1,362 in 1925 to 1,342 in 1926, a decrease of 20 H.P. over the two year period.

MATERIALS USED

The cost value of all materials used in the industry rose from \$5,891,213 in 1925 to \$6,770,526 in 1926, an increase of \$879,313. The value of the various materials used in the industry during the calendar year 1926 is given by provinces in Table VIII.




THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1926.IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

The value of raw and partly manufactured materials and finished products of the industry imported into and exported from Canada during the calendar year 1926 will be found in Table IX (a), (b), and (c). The total imports of raw or partly manufactured materials during 1926 amounted to \$2,637,414, wholly manufactured articles to \$3,092,066 or a grand total of imports amounting to \$5,729,480. Exports of goods manufactured in Canada totalled \$69,023.






