THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA

1930

Ottawa, December, 1931. - A report on the hat and cap industry in Canada is herewith presented for the year 1930. Reports were received from 153 establishments, located by provinces as follows:- Ontario 71, Quebec 65, Manitoba 8, Alberta 3, New Brunswick 3, British Columbia 2 and Nova Scotia 1. It should be remembered that the statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of such manufacturing establishments as make hats and caps as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are therefore not to be regarded as comprehensive, since such products as fur hats and caps, knitted hats and caps and children's headwear are also found as secondary products of other industries, such as "Fur Goods", "Hosiery and Knit Goods" and "Women's Factory Clothing".

Firms whose principal products were hats and caps numbered 153 in 1930. These establishments reported a capital investment of \$7,274,087, they furnished employment to 4,207 persons who were paid \$4,238,305 in salaries and wages and produced goods valued at \$14,224,789.

On referring to table 1, it may be seen that 1928 was the peak year for this industry. In that year, the output was valued at \$16,973,193 and the persons employed numbered 4,917. The steady growth experienced by this industry since 1922 was, however, checked in 1929, a year in which the majority of the industries reached the apex of their productive activity. Compared with the previous year, there was a decrease of \$455,345 in the capital invested, 255 in the number of persons employed and \$1,449,817 in the value of production. This downward trend continued in 1930 with a still further decline of \$435,183 in the capital invested, 455 in the number of employees and \$1,298,587 in the value of production.

Detailed statistics of capital invested, value of production, employment, fuel used, power, equipment and imports and exports are given in the tables following.

PRODUCTION

The quantity and value of the various products of the industry is given by provinces in Table 2 for the calendar year 1930. The total value of production fell from \$15,523,376 in 1929 to \$14,224,789 in 1930, a decrease of \$1,298,587.

Size of Establishments

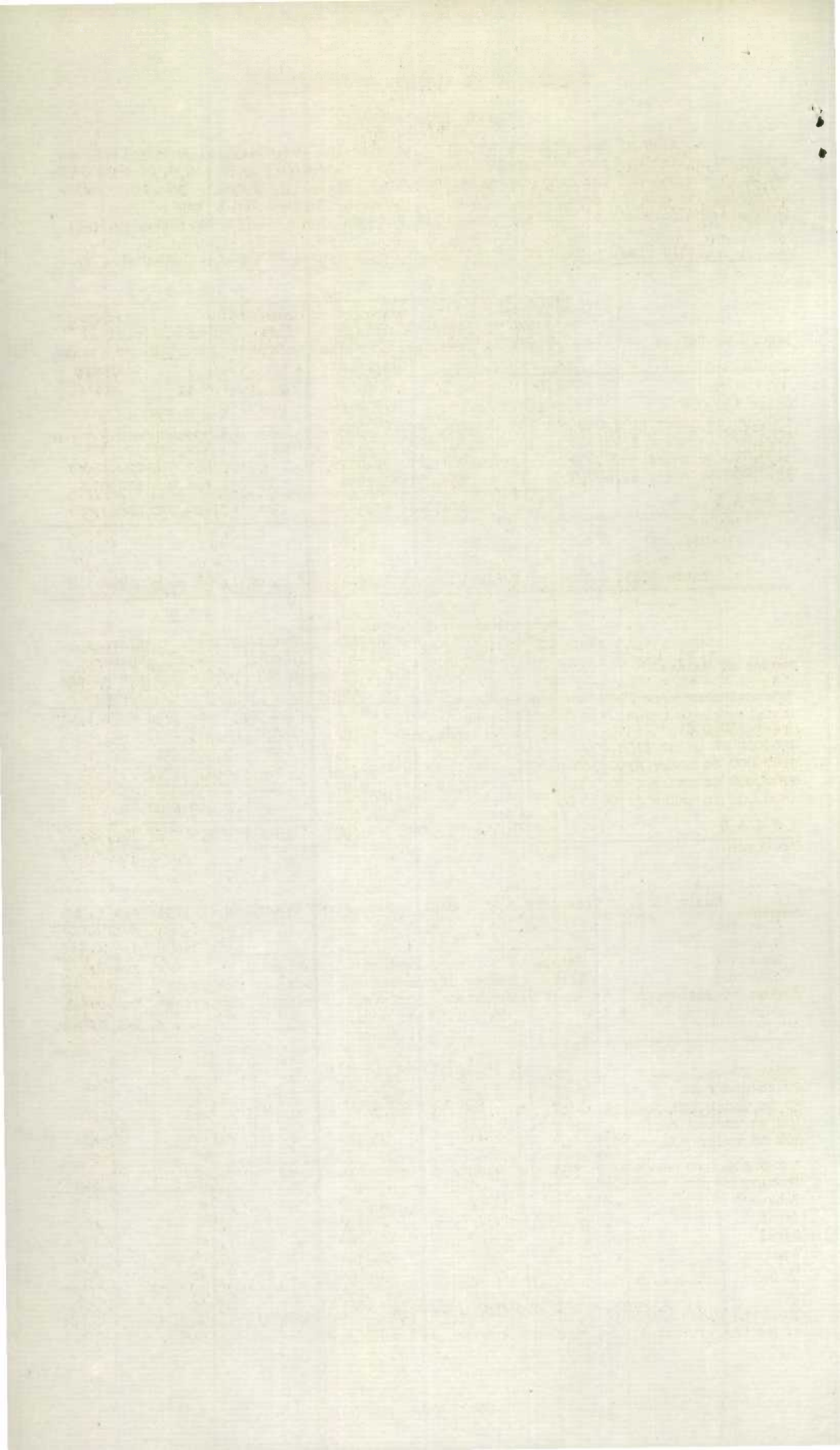

THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1930.

Capital Investment

The capital employed in the industry during the calendar year 1930 is given by provinces in Table 4. The total capitalization dropped from \$7,709,270 in 1929 to \$7,274,087 in 1930, a decrease of \$435,183 over the two year period. Fixed capital increased by \$2,579. Working capital decreased from \$5,587,948 in 1929 to \$5,150,186 in 1930, or a decrease of \$437,762. Of the total investment the province of Ontario contributed \$4,096,215, or 56.3 per cent. Quebec was accountable for \$2,680,081, or 36.8 per cent, whilst the remaining 6.9 per cent was contributed by the other five provinces.

EMPLOYEES, SALARIES AND WAGES

The total number of persons employed in the industry is given by provinces in Table 5 for the calendar year 1930 by (a) classes of employment, (b) sex and (c) salary and wage payments. The total number of persons in all classes employed during the calendar year 1929 was 4,679, whilst for the period covered by this report the total employees were 4,207, a decrease of 472. The total payroll fell from \$4,455,829 in 1929 to \$4,238,305 in 1930, a decrease of \$217,524, or 4.9 per cent.

From the above table it will be noted that employment reached its maximum in the month of September with 4,064, whilst the month of lowest employment was December with 2,715.

THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1930.

Fuel Consumption

The quantity and value of the various kinds of fuel consumed in the industry during the calendar year 1930 is given in Table 7. The total cost of all fuel consumed rose from \$62,149 in 1929 to \$62,976 in 1930, an increase of \$827. Coal of all kinds holds first place in importance with a total of \$47,726 followed by gas with \$11,862, whilst oil takes third position with \$1,572. The cost of electricity used for power purposes fell from \$40,076 in 1929 to \$39,890 in 1930, a decrease of \$186.

POWER INSTALLATION

The power installation of the industry is given in Table 8 for the calendar year 1930, by (a) classes of power (b) number of units in each class and (c) horse-power capacity according to manufacturers' rating. The number of units actually in use fell from 371 in 1929 to 364 in 1930, a decrease of 7, whilst the horse-power capacity fell from 1,814 in 1929 to 1,790 in 1930, or a decrease of 24 h.p. over the two year period.

IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

The value of raw and partly manufactured materials and finished products of the industry imported into and exported from Canada during the calendar year 1930 will be found in Table 9(a), (b) and (c). The total imports of raw or partly manufactured materials during 1930 amounted to \$1,922,838, wholly manufactured articles to \$2,291,718, or a grand total of imports amounting to \$4,214,556. Exports of goods manufactured in Canada totalled \$82,106.

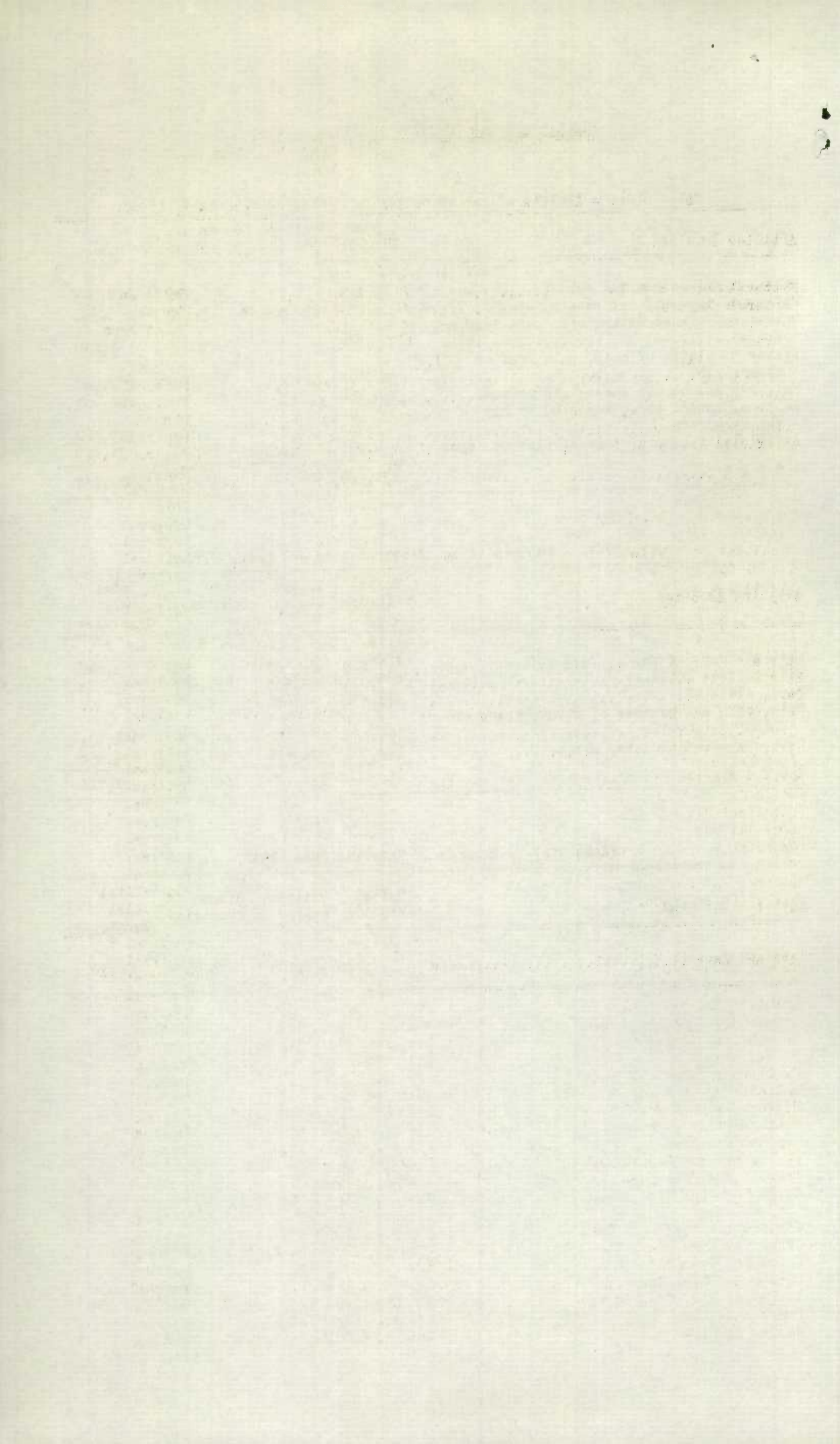

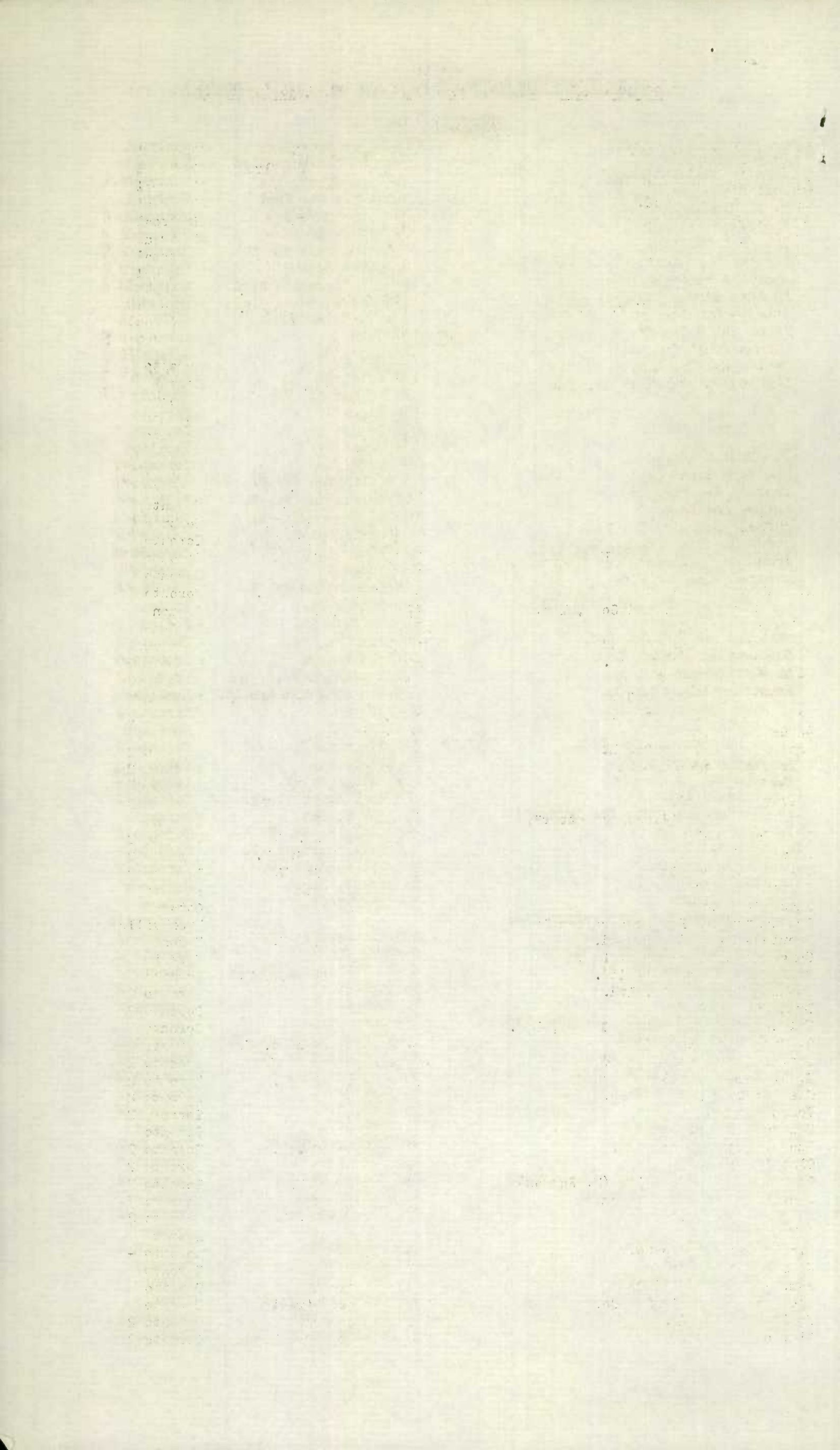
