THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

Reports were received in 1932 from 130 establishments whose principal output consisted of hats, caps and millinery. This represented a decrease of fourteen from the number reporting the previous year. The location by provinces in 1932 is as follows: Quebec fifty-six, Ontario fifty-six, Manitoba eight, British Columbia four, Alberta three, New Brunswick two and Nova Scotia one. The following table shows the percentage distribution of the principal statistics in these provinces in 1931 and 1932.

This industry showed a recession in every phase of its manufacturing operations in 1932 in comparison with 1931. For 1932 they reported a gross value of production of \$9,464,267, a decline of \$2,573,385 or 21.4 per cent. The amount of capital investment was \$5,891,615, a decrease of \$1,043,527 or fifteen per cent. Employment was furnished to 3,095 persons which was 584 persons or 15.9 per cent less than the number employed in 1931. The salaries and wages paid them totalled \$2,950,088, a decrease of \$692,625 or nineteen per cent. All materials used cost \$4,522,711, a drop of \$1,584,586 or 25.9 per cent and the value added by manufacture, \$4,941,556, declined by \$988,799 or 16.7 per cent. These actual variations in the principal statistics in 1932 in comparison with 1931 are shown by provinces in the following table.

The value of production of women's straw hats headed the list in both 1931 and 1932, the figures being 158,167 dozen valued at \$2,872,665 in the former year and 128,271 dozen worth \$2,070,201 in the latter. The production of caps was 211,529 dozen worth \$1,307,299 in 1932 against 257,596 dozen valued at \$1,851,818 in 1931. Hats, wool felt, 129,567 dozen worth \$1,646,478 in 1932 and 187,064 dozen worth \$2,645,969 in 1931. There were also 81,133 dozen fur felt hats produced in 1932 against a production of 71,909 dozen valued at \$1,891,751 in 1931. Other items of production are listed in detail in table 4.

In 1932 the capital invested in this industry showed a loss of over one million dollars in comparison with 1931, all of which was accounted for in the lower value of liquid assets.

The tendency to concentrate in large establishments is quite noticeable in this industry. By referring to table 6, it will be observed that twenty-six establishments were responsible for an output of \$5,973,907 or 63.1 per cent of the total; thirteen establishments supplied \$3,251,621, 55.2 per cent of the entire capital investment, and seventeen establishments furnished employment to 1,462 persons 47.2 per cent of the total number employed.

The average number of wage-earners showed a decrease of 498 in 1932 compared with 1931. In 1932 the month of highest employment was April with 3,155 persons, while December with 1,593 was the lowest. Corresponding figures for 1931 were March high with 3,700 persons and December low with 2,222.

Imports of raw materials used in the manufacture of hats and caps together with the partly manufactured and fully manufactured articles were valued at \$2,191,044 in 1932 and \$3,195,299 in 1931. Exports were quite small, having a value of \$21,626 in 1932 against a value of \$40,834 in 1931.
