THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1934.

In 1934 reports were received from 168 establishments whose principal output consisted of hats, caps and millinery. This was an increase of nineteen establishments as compared with the number reporting during the previous year.

The hat, cap and millinery industry is mainly centered in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec. The seventy-five establishments in Ontario in 1934 employed 52.4 per cent of the capital, as well as 45.1 per cent of the total employees, and paid 48.4 per cent of the total salaries and wages. These establishments also produced 47.8 per cent of the total gross value of all production in this industry. The seventy establishments in Quebec during the same year employed 37.4 per cent of the capital, 45.9 per cent of the employees and paid 44.8 per cent of the total salaries and wages. The gross value of the Quebec establishments was 44.4 per cent of the total. The location of the other factories was as follows: Nova Scotia one, New Brunswick two, Manitoba thirteen, Alberta three and British Columbia four.

Considerable improvement was shown by this industry during 1934. Capital investment rose from \$5,521,356 in 1933 to \$5,812,476, a gain of over 5 per cent, while the gross value of production increased from \$8,786,642 to \$10,845,759, a gain of over 23 per cent. Employment was given to 3,957 persons as compared with 3,350 in 1933, an increase of 607 or approximately 19 per cent, and the remuneration paid these employees increased from \$2,755,766 to \$3,331,879 or more than 21 per cent. In 1934 there was also an increase of \$770,646 or 15.7 per cent in the value added by manufacture, as well as in the cost of the materials used which rose from \$3,900,160 to \$5,188,631, an increase of more than 33 per cent.

Out of the 168 establishments reporting in 1934, eighty-seven produced mainly hats and caps, seventy one factory made millinery and ten straw hats and shapes. Compared with 1933 this is an increase of five hat and cap factories, fourteen millinery establishments and no change in the number producing straw hats and shapes. The hat and cap group is the most important insofar as it employs over 66 per cent of the capital and 47 per cent of the employees, as well as producing over 47 per cent of the total gross value of the products made by this industry.

Women's straw hats to the number of 135,609 dozen valued at \$1,941,954 was the most important item of production. Women's felt hats numbering 140,717 dozen and valued at \$1,703,240 was next in order and men's and boys! cloth caps followed with 224,380 dozen valued at \$1,462,884. Men's fur felt hats numbering 68,750 dozen with a sale value of \$1,546,150 occupied the fourth place. Other items of production are listed in table 4.

Statistics covering materials used in this industry are not collected in detail. Therefore, only the total cost is shown.

Of the 3,364 wage earners employed by this industry in 1934, 1,932 were male and 2,025 or over 60 per cent female. Maximum employment was reached in September with

3.917 employed, whilst the minimum number recorded was 2,499 in December.

The imports of raw materials, partly manufactured and fully manufactured hats and caps during the year 1934 were valued at \$1,666,767 or \$61,504 higher than the imports of the previous year. Hatters' fur to the value of \$413,698 and hat braids valued at \$281,992 were respectively the two largest items of raw and partly manufactured materials imported. The largest fully manufactured product imported was hair felt hats to the value of \$319,430.

The hats and caps exported during 1934 amounted in value to \$71,044 as compared with \$24,622 in 1933. Newfoundland received 43.1 per cent of the export and the United Kingdom 34.8 per cent.
