

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THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1942

In 1942 reports were received from 171 establishments whose principal output consisted of hats and caps and hat and cap makers' materials. These establishments had a production valued at \$21,703,134 they employed 5,708 persons, paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$6,645,083 and expended \$10,978,307 for materials. Capital invested amounted to \$9,677,788.

The hat and cap industry is mainly centered in Quebec and Ontario. Quebec, with 76 establishments in 1942 accounted for over 45 per cent of the capital invested, 50 per cent of the persons employed, 48 per cent of the salaries and wages paid and over 47 per cent of the gross value of production. Ontario with 78 establishments in the same year, reported over 45 per cent of the capital, 40 per cent of the persons given employment, over 44 per cent of the amount paid out in salaries and wages and over 42 per cent of the gross value of all production in the industry.

A general improvement throughout the hat and cap industry continued during 1942. The gross value of production increased by \$2,647,929 or over 13 per cent, 64 more persons were given employment, an increase of over 1 per cent, and the payroll also expanded to the extent of \$633,607 or over 10 per cent. The cost of materials increased by \$1,378,124 or over 14 per cent. Capital invested however decreased by \$617,973 or over 6 per cent, the decline being due chiefly to a decrease in the fixed assets.

In the hat and cap industry as a whole "women's wool felt hats" with a value of \$3,337,146 was the most important item of production in 1942. This was followed by "men's fur felt hats" with \$3,282,711 "uniforms caps" \$2,223,102 "women's, straw hats" \$1,971,483 women's fur felt hats \$1,834,010 and "cloth caps" \$1,500,612. These items represented approximately 65 per cent of the total production for the industry. Moderate increases were reported in the production of most of the principal items. For details of production see Table 4.

Statistics covering materials used in the industry are not collected in detail. Therefore, only the total cost is shown.

Of the 4,660 wage-earners employed by the hat and cap industry in 1942 males numbered 1,872 and females 2,788. Maximum employment was reached in March with 5,243 employed while the minimum number was 4,129 in June. The proportion of female wage-earners working in this industry increased as a result of the war, the percentage advancing from 50 in 1939. to 60 in 1942.
