## THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY

### 1950

The production of the hat and cap industry in 1950 showed a small decrease from the previous year dropping from \$26,244,201 to \$26,082,396. Items of production such as men's fur felt hats, women's wool felt hats and women's fur felt hats all showed decreases. On the other hand the value of some important items showed increases, for example the output of women's straw hats and cloth caps. Exports of hats and caps decreased from \$584,969 in 1949 to \$322,450 in 1950. There was a particularly sharp drop in the exports of felt hats from 9,022 dozen valued at \$423,772 in 1949 to 4,647 dozen valued at \$186,657 in 1950.

While the value of production of this industry dropped by .6 per cent in 1950 the cost of materials rose by 1 per cent from \$11,268,684 in 1949 to \$11,379,834 in 1950. Employment was up from 4,760 in 1949 to 4,825 in 1950, an increase of 1.4 per cent and salaries and wages were up by 3 per cent from \$9,004,917 in 1949 to \$9,260,609 in the year under review.

Of the 157 establishments in the hat and cap industry in 1950, Quebec accounted for 68, Ontario 69, Manitoba 10 and the balance was found in Nova Scotia, Alberta, New Brunswick and British Columbia. Quebec was responsible for 47 per cent of production and 47 per cent of employment in the industry. Ontario accounted for 43 per cent of employment and 44 per cent of production.

The hat and cap industry is divided into four sections. The largest section included women's and children's hats and had an output of \$12,859,648 or 49 per cent of the output of the whole industry. The section classified as men's hats produced goods to the value of \$7,526,516 or 29 per cent of the total. Firms making caps accounted for \$4,254,683 and firms producing hat and cap makers' materials accounted for \$1,441,549.

The hat and cap industry as a whole was made up of establishments of varying sizes. Three establishments each had an output in excess of \$1,000,000 and produced goods to the value of \$5,343,568 or 20 per cent of total production. Out of a total of 157 establishments 76 had an output that varied between \$50,000 and \$200,000. The employment of wage-earners in the industry varied from a high of 4,212 in September to a low of 3,912 in December. Out of a total of 4,067 wage-earners, females accounted for 2,353 or 58 per cent.

The chief item of production in the industry was men's fur felt hats and in 1950, 107,751 dozen valued at \$5,171,118 were produced. Women's straw hats were produced to the extent of 125,950 dozen valued at \$4,183,085. The output of women's wool felt hats was 159,382 dozen worth \$3,307,791 and women's fur felt hats involved 56,908 dozen valued at \$2,698,583. Other items of production in excess of one million dollars included cloth caps at \$1,901,234 and wool felt hat bodies in the rough which were valued at \$1,082,818.
