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

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NOTICE

THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY

The gross value of output of the hat and cap industry rose from \$26,082,396 in 1950 to \$27,291,766 in 1951. However, the physical production of some of the leading items showed a small decrease while their value rose. For example, the output of men's fur felt hats in 1951 was 107,437 dozen valued at \$5,258,857 compared with 107,751 dozen worth \$5,171,118 in 1950. Women's straw hats were reported to the extent of 122,642 dozen worth \$4,435,064 in 1951 compared with 125,950 dozen at \$4,183,085 in the previous year. Women's wool felt hats dropped from 136,382 dozen worth \$3,307,791 in 1950 to 97,858 dozen valued at \$2,618,014 in 1951. Women's fur felt hats decreased from 56,908 dozen to 43,478 dozen over the same period. On the other hand the output of cloth caps increased from 165,280 dozen valued at \$1,901,234 in 1950 to 192,340 dozen worth \$2,327,624 in 1951.

There were two additional establishments in the hat and cap industry in 1951 but employment was at approximately the same level, 4,835 in 1951 compared with 4,825 in 1950. Salaries and wages showed an increase from \$9,260,609 in 1950 to \$9,796,747 in 1951. The cost of materials increased moderately from \$11,379,834 in 1950 to \$11,549,016 in 1951.

Of the 159 establishments in the hat and cap industry in 1951 Quebec accounted for 69, Ontario 68, Manitoba 12, and the balance was found in Nova Scotia, Alberta, New Brunswick and British Columbia. Quebec was responsible for 47 per cent of production and 47 per cent of employment in the industry. Ontario accounted for 41 per cent of employment and 43 per cent of production.

The hat and cap industry is divided into four sections. The largest section included women's and children's hats and had an output of \$13,024,638 or 48 per cent of the output of the whole industry. The section classified as men's hats produced goods to the value of \$7,539,491 or 28 per cent of the total. Firms making caps accounted for \$5,678,836 and firms producing hat and cap makers' materials accounted for \$1,048,801.

The hat and cap industry as a whole was made up of establishments of varying sizes. Three establishments each had an output in excess of \$1,000,000 and produced goods to the value of \$5,268,781 or 19 per cent of total production. Out of a total of 159 establishments 82 had an output that varied between \$50,000 and \$200,000. The employment of wage-earners in the industry varied from a high of 4,333 in March to a low of 3,765 in December. Out of a total of 4,049 wage-earners, females accounted for 2,424 or 60 per cent.

Imports of materials used and products made by the hat and cap industry rose from \$2,772,779 in 1950 to \$3,320,073 in 1951. At the same time exports showed a decline from \$322,450 to \$276,219 over the same period. For full details of imports and exports reference should be made to tables 6 and 7 of this Report.
