


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THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY

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NOTICE

THE HAT AND CAP INDUSTRY

1953

The level of activity of the hat and cap industry in 1953 was little different from that of the previous year. The factory shipments made by it in the year under review had a value f.o.b. plant of \$29,631,952, practically unchanged from the \$29,606,155 worth of products shipped in 1952. Employment was down a little, 5,005 in 1952 against 4,928 in 1953, while salary and wage payments increased slightly over the two years from \$10,791,897 to \$11,057,900. Only in cost of materials used was there an appreciable change. This item fell from \$12,610,052 in 1952 to \$11,741,210 in 1953, a drop of \$868,842 or about 7 per cent.

While the level of operations of the industry as a whole remained about the same, fairly substantial changes occurred in the sections which comprise it. The largest section, "women's and children's hats", reported an expansion in the value of products shipped from \$14,306,528 in 1952 to \$15,221,459 in 1953. The "men's hats" section and the "caps" section, on the other hand, reported contracted activity. The factory shipments of the first fell from \$7,431,907 to \$6,841,638 and of the second from \$6,832,998 to \$5,478,299 over the two years. The remaining section, "hat and cap maker's materials", shipped goods in 1953 worth \$2,090,556, approximately double the 1952 figure of \$1,034,722. The change in the relative importance of the four sections is shown by a comparison of the percentages of total shipments each was responsible for in 1952 and 1953. These, with 1952 figures in brackets, are as follows: women's and children's hats, 51 (48); men's hats, 23 (25); caps, 19 (23); hat and cap maker's materials, 7 (4).

Men's fur felt hats was the industry's most important single commodity. Factory shipments of these in 1953 amounted to 103,377 dozen valued at \$5,298,591, practically the same as the 1952 figures of 103,989 dozen and \$5,274,903. Shipments of other main commodities in order of importance were; women's straw hats, 137,547 dozen valued at \$5,180,098; cloth caps, 259,896 dozen at \$2,724,059; women's velour hats, 51,756 dozen at \$2,400,968; women's wool felt hats, 75,236 dozen at \$2,066,185; and women's fur felt hats, 31,399 dozen at \$1,653,342. Full detail of products shipped will be found in Table 4 of this report.

The 166 establishments were distributed provincially as follows; Nova Scotia 3, New Brunswick 1, Quebec 76, Ontario 70, Manitoba 12, Alberta 3 and British Columbia 1. As indicated by the number of establishments, Quebec and Ontario dominated the industry. Quebec accounted for 48 per cent of shipments and 48 per cent of employment; Ontario for 42 per cent of shipments and 39 per cent of employment.

The hat and cap industry is comprised of establishments which vary considerably in size. From Table 10 it will be seen that the sizes range from 26 firms with shipments of under \$25,000 to 3 firms with shipments in excess of \$1,000,000. Out of a total of 166 establishments, 81 reported shipments varying between \$50,000 and \$200,000.

Employment of wage-earners fell steadily throughout the year from 4,421 in January to 3,858 in December. The monthly average was 4,234, 2,613 being female workers.

Imports of materials used and products made by the hat and cap industry rose from \$3,553,458 in 1952 to \$4,622,622 in 1953. Exports showed a decline from \$203,332 to \$180,952 over the same period. For full details of imports and exports reference should be made to Tables 6 and 7 of this report.

Detailed information on the industry's use of fuel and electricity during the year and on its power equipment will be found in Tables 11 and 12. Prior to 1948 this information was collected annually but since then it is being collected only every fifth year.
