Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as comprehensive, for similar products are also to be found as secondary ones in other industries such as the cotton, wool, silk, etc., industries.

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THE HOSIERY, KNITTED GOODS AND FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1932.

The following report on the hosiery, knitted goods and fabric glove industries is divided into three sections. The first one covers (a) the combined principal statistics of the woollen textile group of industries, and (b) the hosiery and knitted goods and fabric glove industries. Section 2, tables 6 to 19 inclusive, covers the manufacturing operations of the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1932, and in Section 3, tables 20 to 31, perform a similar function for the fabric gloves and mittens industry.

The combined woollen industries reported a gross value of production of \$66,553,767 in 1932, a decline of \$6,659,973 or 9.1 per cent from the previous year. The capital investment also declined from \$100,260,448 in 1931 to \$95,144,672 in 1932, a decrease of \$5,115,776 or 5.1 per cent. Employment was given to 26,241 persons in these industries, an increase of 335 persons over the number employed in 1931. They were paid \$20,596,314 in salaries and wages, a decrease, however, of \$777,891 or 3.7 per cent from 1931. The cost of all materials used was \$30,126,404, a drop of \$3,417,941 or 10.2 per cent from 1931, while the value added by manufacture, amounting to \$36,427,363 in 1932, also showed a decline of \$3,242,032 or 8.4 per cent. These principal statistics and the comparison of them may be observed in tables 1 and 2.

Tables 3, 4 and 5 cover the combined principal statistics of the hosiery and knitted goods and fabric glove and mitten industries, and a summary of their production. It will be unnecessary to devote attention to them here, as they will be dealt with in detail under their respective headings.

SECTION 2. - HOSIERY AND KNITTED GOODS.

Reports were received from 169 establishments operating in the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1932, which represented an increase of eight over the number reporting the previous year.

They reported a gross value of production of \$43,252,752, a capital investment of \$52,604,950, an employment of 17,655 persons who were paid \$13,474,974 in salaries and wages, a total cost of \$19,349,634 for materials and a value added by manufacture amounting to \$23,903,118. These were all recessions from the previous year, however, and the individual items showed declines as follows: gross value of production \$4,504,951 or 9.4 per cent, capital investment \$4,568,824 or eight per cent, employees forty-three persons, salaries and wages \$473,596 or 3.4 per cent, cost of materials used \$2,702,784 or 12.3 per cent and the value added by manufacture \$1,802,167 or 7.1 per cent.

The variations in the principal statistics in 1932 as compared with 1931 are shown herewith by provinces.

From the foregoing table it will be observed that somewhat over two-thirds of this industry is concentrated in the province of Ontario.

Some of the more important articles of production in this industry are silk hosiery, cotton underwear, wool underwear, sweaters, cardigan jackets, etc., knitted suits and dresses and worsted yarns. The entire output for 1931 and 1932 is shown in detail in table 8.

In this industry, yarns of various kinds, particularly cotton, woollen, worsted, silk and artificial silk, compose the greater proportion of the materials used. In 1932 the consumption of all yarns was 22,889,775 pounds costing \$13,466,485 or 69.6 per cent of the total cost of all materials used. In 1931, this consumption was 22,072,197 pounds costing \$15,379,749 or 69.7 per cent of the total. All materials used are shown in detail in table 9 for both 1931 and 1932.

The amount of capital invested in the industry declined by \$4,568,824 in 1932. Fixed capital decreased by \$1,031,770 and working by \$3,537,054, principally in the items for materials, stocks, miscellaneous supplies and cash, bills and accounts receivable.

In this industry in 1932 the output of sixty establishments was valued at \$36,996,721 or 85.5 per cent of the total production, fifty-seven establishments supplied \$46,745,458 or 88.9 per cent of the total capital investment, while 14,661 persons were furnished employment by fifty-three establishments which was 83.4 per cent of the total number employed.

The trend of employment was practically the same in both 1931 and 1932. In the former year, 16,366 wage-earners were employed and 16,230 in the latter. In 1932 the month of highest employment was March with 16,814 wage-earners employed and August with 15,369 was the lowest. In 1931, April with 16,813 was the highest and January with 15,827 was the lowest. Considering the number employed, this spread was quite small.

Imports of hosiery and knitted goods decreased from a value of \$3,211,095 in 1931 to \$2,009,103 in 1932, a decline of \$1,201,992. Our purchases from the United Kingdom amounted to \$1,395,009 in the latter year and \$2,105,795 in the former.

HOSIERY AND KNITTED GOODS.

In 1932 exports amounted to \$1,090,592, an increase of \$280,046 over the previous year. Socks and stockings constituted the principal exports in 1932, and 138,735 dozen pair valued at \$1,016,354 were shipped abroad. This is a decided increase over 1931 when exports amounted to 76,075 dozen pair worth \$695,041. In 1932 British South Africa dislodged New Zealand as our best customer by purchasing 50,499 dozen pair valued at \$394,844, while those of New Zealand amounted to 41,406 dozen pair worth \$263,686.

THE HOSIERY, KNITTED GOODS AND FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1932.

SECTION 3. - FABRIC GLOVES AND MITTENS.

A recession in activity occurred in the manufacturing operations of the fabric glove and mitten industry in 1932. Eight establishments reported their operations, a decrease of one from 1931. Their total output was valued at \$360,579, a decrease of \$398,762. Capital investment, \$554,993, also declined by \$464,049. Employment was furnished to 173 persons, 155 less than in 1931 and their salaries and wages, amounting to \$113,183, declined by \$106,509. The cost of materials used was \$176,345, a decrease of \$197,355, while the value added by manufacture, \$184,234, declined by \$201,407.

Gloves and mittens comprise the principal items of production in this industry. In 1932 the output of men's cotton work gloves was 230,411 dozen pairs valued at \$295,850, the corresponding production for 1931 being 257,765 dozen pairs worth \$362,611. The output of all other gloves and mittens was 6,069 dozen pairs worth \$42,187 in 1932 and 25,896 dozen pairs valued at \$211,124 in 1931.

Fabrics, including cotton, canton, jersey, drills and denims was the largest single item of materials used in both 1931 and 1932. In 1932 the consumption was 441,914 yards costing \$95,216 against a cost of \$167,458 in 1931. Yarns consumed were 5,045 pounds costing \$7,718 in 1932 and 39,346 pounds costing \$90,197 in 1931.

Capital investment declined by over forty-five per cent in 1932, the decrease being fairly evenly distributed over all four items.

Wage-earners also showed a drastic decline in 1932. The month of highest employment was May with 173 employed and July with only 115 was the lowest. In 1931 September was high with 314 and July low with 267.

Imports of gloves and mittens amounted to \$759,379 in 1932 against a valuation of \$944,231 in 1931. The largest quantity was imported from Germany in both years. Exports were relatively small, amounting to \$26,732 in 1931 and only \$8,376 in 1932.
