

THE HOSEIERY, KNITTED GOODS AND FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1933.

The following report on the hosiery, knitted goods and fabric glove industries is divided into three sections. Section 1 covers (a) the combined principal statistics of the woollen textile group of industries and (b) the hosiery and knitted goods and fabric glove industries. Section 2, tables 6 to 19 inclusive, covers the manufacturing operations of the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1933, and Section 3, tables 20 to 31, comprises the fabric glove and mitten industry.

The combined woollen industries reported a gross value of production of \$70,357,273 in 1933, an increase of \$3,803,506 or 5.7 per cent over the amount reported during the previous year. The capital investment, however, declined from \$95,144,672 in 1932 to \$93,709,376 in 1933, a decrease of \$1,435,296 or 1.5 per cent. Employment was provided for 26,991 persons in these industries, an increase of 750 over the number employed during 1932. The total payroll was \$20,494,479, a decline of \$101,835 during the two year period. The cost of all materials used rose from \$30,126,404 in 1932 to \$34,277,725 in 1933, an increase of \$4,151,321, whilst the value added by manufacture, amounting to \$36,079,548, showed a decrease of \$347,815. The principal statistics compared for the years 1932 and 1933 are shown in tables 1 and 2.

Tables 3, 4 and 5 cover the combined principal statistics of the hosiery and knitted goods and fabric glove and mitten industries, together with a summary of their production.

## SECTION 2. - HOSIERY AND KNITTED GOODS.

Reports were received from 170 establishments operating in the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1933, which represented an increase of one over the number in operation during the previous year.

The gross value of production was \$40,997,210, the capital investment was \$49,485,772. The total number of persons employed was 17,159 with a total payroll amounting to \$12,610,093. The cost of materials used was \$19,473,785, and the value added by manufacture was \$21,523,425. There were considerable decreases reported for each of the above items except cost of materials covering the two year period 1932 and 1933 which are shown by provinces in the following table.

The 170 establishments comprising this industry in 1933 were located by provinces as follows: - Ontario 105, Quebec 49, Manitoba 7, Nova Scotia 3, British Columbia 3, Alberta 2 and New Brunswick 1.

The following table illustrates by provinces the percentage distribution of the principal statistics in 1932 and 1933.

THE HOSIERY, KNITTED GOODS AND FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1933.

From the foregoing table it will be apparent that approximately two-thirds of this industry is at present concentrated in the province of Ontario.

The principal articles of production in this industry comprise, - silk hosiery, cotton underwear, woollen underwear, sweaters, cardigan jackets, etc., knitted suits and dresses and worsted yarns. The entire output for the year 1932 and 1933 is shown in detail in table 8.

In this industry yarns of various kinds, particularly cotton, woollen, worsted, silk and artificial silk, supply the larger proportion of all materials used. In 1933 the consumption of all yarns was 23,586,312 pounds at a cost of \$13,560,035, approximately 70 per cent of the total cost of all materials used. In 1932 the consumption was 22,889,775 pounds with a cost value of \$13,466,485 or 69.6 per cent of the total. All materials used are shown in detail in table 9 for the years 1932 and 1933.

The amount of capital invested in the industry declined to the extent of \$3,119,178. Fixed capital contributed \$2,634,281 to this decrease, whilst working capital was accountable for \$484,897.

In this industry in 1933 the output of fifty-seven establishments was valued at \$34,506,483 or 84.2 per cent of the total production. Fifty-six establishments supplied \$43,364,477 or 87.6 per cent of the total capital investment, while 14,236 persons were furnished employment in fifty-four establishments, being 82.9 per cent of the total number employed.

Employment experienced a slight contraction during 1933, the total number of wage-earners in that year being 15,728 against 16,230 in 1932. For the period covered by this report the maximum number recorded was 16,980 in the month of October, whilst the minimum month was January with 14,633. The corresponding months in 1932 were March with 16,814 and August with 15,369.

Imports of hosiery and knitted goods declined from a value of \$2,009,103 in 1932 to \$1,380,545 in 1933, a decrease of \$628,558. Purchases from the United Kingdom amounted to \$1,063,760 in 1933 as against \$1,395,009 in 1932.

In 1933 exports amounted to \$1,378,663, an increase of \$288,071 over the previous year. The exports to British South Africa accounted for the largest amount of this increase being \$685,105 in 1933 against \$429,464 in 1932, an increase of \$255,641. The exports to the United Kingdom rose from \$217,751 in 1932 to \$222,151 in 1933, an increase of \$4,400.

Details of imports and exports are shown by principal countries for the years 1932 and 1933 in tables 18 and 19.

SECTION 3. - FABRIC GLOVES AND MITTENS.

There was practically no change in this industry during the period covered by this report, the number of active establishments remaining the same as in 1932, viz., 8. However, slight increases occurred in the items of principal statistics. The total value of production rose from \$360,579 in 1932 to \$387,447 in 1933, an increase of \$26,868. Capital investment showed an expansion amounting to \$76,118. Additions to the number of persons employed were also recorded to the extent of thirty-nine with a corresponding inflation of the payroll amounting to \$13,399. An increase of \$24,832 was reported in the cost of materials used. The value added by manufacture was \$2,036 more than the previous year.

Gloves and mittens comprised the principal items of production. In 1933 the output of men's cotton work gloves was 202,261 dozen pairs valued at \$249,534, which was a decrease of 28,150 dozen pairs in the number manufactured during 1932 and the selling value was \$46,316 less than in the previous year. The production of all other gloves and mittens was 6,692 dozen pairs worth \$32,556 as against 6,069 dozen pairs with a selling value of \$42,187 in 1932.

Fabrics, including cotton, canton and jersey together comprised the largest item of materials used, of which a total of 410,300 yards were consumed at a cost of \$82,300. Yarns of various kinds were also used to the extent of 7,278 pounds with a cost value of \$12,499.

Detailed statistics relating to production and materials used, compared for the years 1932 and 1933, are given in tables 22 and 23.

Imports of gloves and mittens amounted to \$735,425 in 1933 as compared with \$759,379 in 1932, a decrease of \$23,954 over the two-year period. Exports showed a small increase during 1933, being \$13,597 in that year and \$8,376 in the previous year. Imports and exports for the years 1932 and 1933 are shown by countries in tables 30 and 31.
