Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as comprehensive, for similar products are also to be found as secondary ones in other industries such as the cotton, wool, silk, etc., industries.

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THE HOSEIERY, KNITTED GOODS AND FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1934.

The following report on the hosiery, knitted goods and fabric glove industries is divided into three sections. Section 1 covers (a) the combined principal statistics of the woollen textile group of industries and (b) the hosiery and knitted goods and fabric glove industries. Section 2, tables 6 to 19 inclusive, covers the manufacturing operations of the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1934, and Section 3, tables 20 to 31, comprises the fabric glove and mitten industry.

SECTION I(a).

The combined woollen industries reported a gross value of production of \$78,829,653 in 1934, an increase of \$8,472,360 or 12 per cent over the amount reported during the previous year. The capital investment, however, declined from \$93,709,376 in 1933 to \$92,271,198 in 1934, a decrease of \$1,438,178 or 1.5 per cent. Employment was provided for 28,614 persons in these industries, an increase of 1,623 over the number employed during 1933. The total payroll was \$22,025,455, an increase of \$1,530,976 during the two year period. The cost of all materials used rose from \$34,277,725 in 1933 to \$39,895,840 in 1934, an increase of \$5,618,115, whilst the value added by manufacture, amounting to \$38,933,793, showed an increase of \$2,854,245. The principal statistics compared for the years 1933 and 1934 are shown in tables 1 and 2.

Tables 3, 4 and 5 cover the combined principal statistics of the hosiery, knitted goods and fabric glove and mitten industries, together with a summary of their production.

SECTION 2. - HOSIERY AND KNITTED GOODS.

Reports were received from 167 establishments operating in the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1934 which represented a decrease of three over the number in operation during the previous year.

The gross value of production was \$44,957,047, and the capital investment was \$49,446,669. The total number of persons employed was 17,978 with a total payroll amounting to \$13,565,616. The cost of materials used was \$21,831,064 and the value added by manufacture was \$23,125,983. There were considerable increases reported for each of the above items, except capital investment. Variations in the principal statistics for the two year period, 1933 and 1934, are shown by provinces in the following table.

The 167 establishments comprising this industry in 1934 were located by provinces as follows: - Ontario 99, Quebec 53, Manitoba 6, Nova Scotia 3, British Columbia 3, Alberta 2 and New Brunswick 1.

The following table illustrates by provinces the percentage distribution of the principal statistics in 1933 and 1934.

THE HOSIERY, KNITTED GOODS AND FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1934.

From the foregoing table it will be apparent that approximately two-thirds of this industry is at present concentrated in the Province of Ontario.

The principal articles of production in this industry comprise, - silk hosiery, cotton underwear, woollen underwear, sweaters, cardigan jackets, etc., knitted suits and dresses and worsted yarns. The entire output for the year 1933 and 1934 is shown in detail in table 8.

In this industry yarns of various kinds, particularly cotton, woollen, worsted, silk and artificial silk, supply the larger proportion of all materials used. In 1934 the consumption of all yarns was 24,507,352 pounds at a cost of \$14,700,417, approximately 67 per cent of the total cost of all materials used. In 1933 the consumption was 23,586,312 pounds with a cost value of \$13,560,035 or 70 per cent of the total. All materials used are shown in detail in table 9 for the years 1933 and 1934.

The amount of capital invested in the industry declined to the extent of \$39,103. Fixed capital contributed \$404,832 to this decrease, whilst working capital was accountable for an increase of \$365,729.

In this industry in 1934 the output of fifty-nine establishments was valued at \$38,550,991 or 85.7 per cent of the total production. Fifty-five establishments supplied \$43,649,160 or 88.3 per cent of the total capital investment, while 14,984 persons were furnished employment in fifty-three establishments, being 83.3 per cent of the total number employed.

Employment experienced a slight expansion during 1934, the total number of wage-earners in that year being 16,510 against 15,728 in 1933. For the period covered by this report the maximum number recorded was 16,953 in the month of April, whilst the minimum month was July with 15,846. The corresponding months in 1933 were October with 16,980 and January with 14,633.

Imports of hosiery and knitted goods increased in value from \$1,380,545 in 1933 to \$1,464,054 in 1934, an increase of \$83,509. Purchases from the United Kingdom amounted to \$1,179,736 in 1934 as against \$1,063,760 in 1933.

In 1934 exports amounted to \$1,812,278, an increase of \$433,615 over the previous year. The exports to British South Africa accounted for the largest amount of this increase, they were \$1,016,538 in 1934 against \$685,105 in 1933, an increase of \$331,433. The exports to the United Kingdom rose from \$222,151 in 1933 to \$286,427 in 1934, an increase of \$64,276.

Details of imports and exports are shown by principal countries for the years 1933 and 1934 in tables 18 and 19.

SECTION 3. -- FABRIC GLOVES AND MITTENS.

There was practically no change in this industry during the period covered by this report, the number of active establishments remaining the same as in 1933, viz., 8. However, some increases occurred in the items of principal statistics. The total value of production rose from \$387,447 in 1933 to \$538,764 in 1934, an increase of \$151,317. Capital investment showed a decline amounting to \$4,541. Additions to the number of persons employed were recorded to the extent of twenty-three with a corresponding inflation of the payroll amounting to \$23,404. An increase of \$86,367 was reported in the cost of materials used. The value added by manufacture was \$64,950 more than the previous year.

Gloves and mittens comprised the principal items of production. In 1934 the output of men's cotton work gloves was 252,572 dozen pairs valued at \$333,443, which was an increase of 50,311 dozen pairs in the number manufactured during 1933 and the selling value was \$83,909 more than in the previous year.

Fabrics, including cotton, canton and jersey, together comprised the largest item of materials used, with a cost of \$184,761. Yarns of various kinds were also used to the extent of 10,904 pounds with a cost value of \$18,869.

Detailed statistics relating to production and materials used, compared for the years 1933 and 1934, are given in tables 22 and 23.

Imports of gloves and mittens amounted to \$892,033 in 1934 as compared with \$735,425 in 1933, an increase of \$156,608 over the two-year period. Exports showed an increase during 1934, being \$34,602 in that year and \$13,597 in the previous year. Imports and exports for the years 1933 and 1934 are shown by countries in tables 30 and 31.
