


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

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THE HOSIERY, KNITTED GOODS AND FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRIES
IN CANADA, 1947

This report is divided into three sections, (1) Combined principal statistics and products of the hosiery and knitted goods and the fabric glove and mitten industries (2) The hosiery and knitted goods industry and (3) The fabric glove and mitten industry.

Section 1.

The combined hosiery, knitted goods and fabric glove and mitten industries had a gross value of production of \$130,464,637 in 1947, gave employment to 27,219 persons and paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$36,395,006. Materials used cost \$60,955-367.

Table 2 gives the products in summary form and makes it possible to show the total value of fabric gloves produced in the two industries.

SECTION 2. - THE HOSIERY AND KNITTED GOODS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1947.

Reports were received from 262 establishments operating in the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1947. These establishments had a gross value of production amounting to \$127,837,570. Employment was given to 26,511 persons who were paid in salaries and wages the sum of \$35,646,663. The cost of materials used was \$59,557,427.

In 1947 the gross value of all goods produced in the industry increased by \$22,628,871 or 21.5 per cent when compared with the previous year. Employment was given to 1,570 more persons, an increase of 6.3 per cent, and the disbursement in salaries and wages was greater by \$5,436,156 or approximately 18 per cent. The cost of materials used in 1947 exceeded that reported for 1946 by \$12,286,548 or 26 per cent.

In the table immediately following, the production of hosiery, underwear, sweaters, cardigans, pullovers, etc., is given for the years 1945, 1946 and 1947. This table makes clearly evident the unimportant position now held by real silk in respect of hosiery production.

Yarns of various kinds, particularly cotton, woollen, worsted, nylon and rayon comprise the greater part of all the materials used. In 1947 the consumption of all yarns was 38,029,628 pounds, valued at \$42,490,767. Of this, the largest single item was cotton, which totalled 18,380,794 pounds worth \$12,556,317.

In 1947 employment was given to 23,926 wage-earners. August, with 23,444 was the month of minimum employment, while November with 25,110 represented the maximum.

SECTION 3. - THE FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1947.

In 1947 the sixteen establishments reporting operations in the fabric glove and mitten industry produced goods worth \$2,627,067, or about 20.9 per cent more than in 1946. They employed 708 persons, an increase of about 9.6 per cent, paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$748,343, and expended \$1,397,940 on materials.

Production of cotton work gloves was 626,930 doz. pr. in 1947 as against 652,246 doz. pr. in 1946. Dress gloves were produced to the extent of 118,624 doz. pr. in 1947 compared with 117,423 doz. pr. in 1946.
