



This report is divided into three sections, (1) Combined principal statistics and products of the hosiery and knitted goods and the fabric glove and mitten industries (2) The hosiery and knitted goods industry and (3) The fabric glove and mitten industry.

Section 1.

The combined hosiery, knitted goods and fabric glove and mitten industries had a gross value of production of \$151,560,265 in 1948, gave employment to 28,396 persons and paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$43,594,281. Materials used cost \$70,807,875.

Table 2 gives the products in summary form and makes it possible to show the total value of fabric gloves produced in the two industries.

SECTION 2. - THE HOSIERY AND KNITTED GOODS INDUSTRY, 1948.

Reports were received from 271 establishments operating in the hosiery and knitted goods industry in 1948. These establishments had a gross value of production amounting to \$148,556,159. Employment was given to 27,634 persons who were paid in salaries and wages the sum of \$42,807,416. The cost of materials used was \$69,114,815.

In 1948 the gross value of all goods produced in the industry increased by \$20,718,589 or 16.2 per cent when compared with the previous year. Employment was given to 1,123 more persons, an increase of 4.2 per cent, and the disbursement in salaries and wages was greater by \$7,160,753 or approximately 20 per cent. The cost of materials used in 1948 exceeded that reported for 1947 by \$9,557,388 or 16 per cent.

In the table immediately following, the production of hosiery, underwear, sweaters, cardigans, pullovers, etc., is given for the years 1946, 1947, and 1948. This table makes clearly evident the unimportant position now held by real silk in respect of hosiery production.

Yarns of various kinds, particularly cotton, woollen, worsted, nylon and rayon comprise the greater part of all the materials used. In 1948 the consumption of all yarns was 38,797,151 pounds, valued at \$49,430,518. Of this, the largest single item was cotton, which totalled 18,783,187 pounds worth \$14,673,138.

In 1948 employment was given to 24,875 wage-earners. August, with 23,961, was the month of minimum employment, while February with 25,691 represented the maximum.

SECTION 3. - THE FABRIC GLOVE AND MITTEN INDUSTRY, 1948.

In 1948 the fourteen establishments reporting operations in the fabric glove and mitten industry produced goods worth \$3,004,106, or about 14.4 per cent more than in 1947. They employed 762 persons, an increase of about 7.6 per cent, paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$786,865, and expended \$1,693,060, on materials.

Production of cotton work gloves was 704,486 doz. pr. in 1948 as against 626,930 doz. pr. in 1947. Dress gloves were produced to the extent of 89,950 doz. pr. in 1948 compared with 118,624 doz. pr. in 1947.
