The total value of producte reported at $\$ 27.717 .460$ for the year 1919 dropped by $\$ 6,891,034$ to a total of $\$ 20,826,426$ for 1920 . The porcentage decrease is of 24.86 per cent.

The capital invostod is shown by itoms and clessces of plants in the accompaivering tablo. The total jnvestment is repurted at $\$ 49,435,428$ for tho calenciar rear 1920 as comparcd wi th $\$ 38,629,146$ in 1919. The increase of $\$ 10,807,282$ is mostly due to hi. gher stocks of naterials, etc., and larsir operating accounts. The capital roportod for mon's Eicthing factorios totals $\$ 37,920,004$.

Wot only is there a large propontion of handwork involved but the meeninery uecd is mostly of light type roquiring only a small amount of power to operete. It is also to bo noted that in a large number of cstabishments mochanical power is dispensed with and the li cht machinos in usc aro foot operatod.
