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THE CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1921.PART 1. MEN'S WEAR

Ottawa, March, 1924.- A report on the Men's Wear section of the Clothing industry in Canada for the calendar year 1921 is herewith presented by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. The report deals with the industry under two distinct heads, viz: Factory Clothing and Custom Clothing.

The total number of returns received by the Bureau under each head is summarized below, by provinces:-

PRINCIPAL STATISTICS

The accompanying table shows the principal statistics of the industry under each head. The total production for the industry as a whole amounted to \$59,287,678, made up of factory clothing valued at \$43,766,569 and custom clothing valued at \$15,521,109. Owing to changes in the classification as between Men's Clothing and Men's Furnishings, the statistics for previous years are not comparable.

The capital invested in the industry in 1921 was \$37,441,945, of which factory made clothing represented \$30,244,384 or 80.8 per cent of the total, and custom made clothing \$7,197,561 or 19.2 per cent. Fixed capital in the factory clothing section, comprising Land, buildings and fixtures, and Machinery and tools, amounted to \$4,983,198 or 16.5 per cent, while working capital, including Materials on hand, stocks in process, etc., and Cash, trading and operating accounts, amounted to \$25,261,186, or 83.5 per cent. Capital in custom clothing plants was not separated as to items in 1921.

The number of persons employed in the entire industry in 1921 was 16,057, of which 10,755 were employed in factories and 5,302 in custom or merchant tailor shops. In the clothing factories, 1,658 were employed on salaries, of whom 1,290 were males and 368 females; whilst those on wages number 8,464, of whom 4,044 were males and 4,420 females.

The total of outside piece-workers was 633, of whom 383 were males and 250 females.

The total amount paid out for services and labour during the year to factory workers was \$12,456,980 of which salaried employees received \$3,286,257, employees on wages, \$8,765,158 and outside piece-workers \$405,555. The average salary paid to all employees in 1921 was \$1,982, the average wage paid was \$1,035 and the average payment to piece-workers was \$642.

The total number employed in Merchant and Custom tailor shops was 5,302, regardless of sex, and the average earnings for the year was approximately \$900.

Fuel consumed in the industry in 1921, delivered at the factory, cost \$73,031, of which coal alone contributed almost 85 per cent of the total cost.

Miscellaneous expenses for both sections of the industry totalled \$7,230,852. Of this total \$5,456,702 was chargeable to factory operations and \$1,774,150 to merchant and custom shops.

The cost of materials used in the factory section was \$22,740,413, and in the custom and merchant section, \$6,985,352, or a total for the entire industry of \$29,725,765.

PRODUCTION

The statistics of production are presented in Table 2 for factory operations and in Table 2(a) for custom or merchant tailoring establishments. The statistics show the quantity and selling value at the factory or shop of the principal products of the industry by provinces. The Province of Quebec leads in factory production with over 62 per cent of the total, with Ontario in second place with 36 per cent, the two provinces providing 98 per cent of the total for the Dominion. The Province of Ontario leads in custom or merchant production with 52 per cent, with Quebec in second place with 24 per cent.

CAPITAL INVESTMENT

The amount of capital invested in the factory clothing section is shown in Table 3 by items and provinces. The province of Quebec provided 63 per cent of the invested capital, Ontario, 35 per cent and the remaining provinces 2 per cent.

For statistics of capital investment in merchant and custom shops see Table 1(a). In this section, Ontario leads with 55.6 per cent of the total, Quebec being next with 22 per cent, the other provinces providing the remaining 22.4 per cent.

CLASSIFIED WEEKLY WAGES

Table 5 shows a classification by provinces of employees as at December 15th, according to the amount of weekly wages they received. Of the total number of 8,576 at employment, 4,309 persons received under \$20 per week and 4,267 over \$20 per week. Of the number receiving less than \$20 per week, 885 were males and 3,424 females, while of those receiving \$20 per week and over, the males numbered 3,267 and the females 1,000.
