
MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1928.

Ottawa, January, 1930.— A report on men's ready-to-wear clothing made in factories in Canada during the calendar year 1928 is presented herewith. Reports were received from 218 establishments in 25 of which the clothing was made by outside contractors from materials furnished by the firm reporting,-in consequence of which the number of employees, wages paid and the number of days the factories were in operation were omitted. A comparative summary for the years 1927 and 1928 showing the location of the factories by provinces is given in the following table:

In order that no information may be divulged concerning individual establishments, statistics for New Brunswick and Nova Scotia have been combined and are shown throughout this report under the head of Maritime Provinces.

Similar procedure has been adopted in the case of Alberta and British Columbia which are shown under the head of Western Provinces.





A threefold measure of the size of establishments is presented in the following series of tables. Table (a) affords a measure of establishments from the standpoint of employment, table (b) from the amount of Capital investment and table (c) the gross value of production.

From a study of these tables it will be noted that 27 establishments in a total of 204 employed 56.59 per cent of the total number at work in 1927 as compared with 27 establishments in a total of 218 employing 56.58 per cent in 1928. Similarly in capital investment 30 establishments had 66.94 per cent of the total investment in 1927 whilst in 31 establishments in 1928 the percentage to the total capital was 55.91. Again in gross value of production 58 establishments in 1927 produced 74.84 per cent of the total, whereas in 1928 with 64 establishments the percentage was 75.02 of the total gross value of production.

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Production

The total value of all articles of clothing manufactured during the calendar year 1928 is shown by provinces in Table 2. The total amount in 1927 was 43,286,614, whilst the amount reported for 1928 was 48,477,178, an increase of \$5,190,564.


In order of importance the province of Quebec leads with a total output valued at \$30,162,782, - Ontario follows next with \$16,863,164, - Western provinces take third place with \$735,486, the Maritime provinces occupy fourth position with \$404,177 and Manitoba last with \$311,569.

Capital Investment

The amount of capital invested in the industry is given by provinces in Table 3 for the calendar year 1928. The total capitalization rose from \$24,919,334 in 1927 to \$27,263,996 in 1928, an increase of \$2,344,662. The province of Quebec again takes precedence with a total investment of \$16,547,134, Ontario ranks second in importance with \$9,996,629, whilst Western Provinces, Maritime Provinces and Manitoba follow in the order named.

Employment Statistics


The number of persons employed in the industry during the calendar years 1927 and 1928 is given in table 4 by (a) classes of employment, (b) sex and (c) salary and wage payments.

The total number of persons on the payroll during the year 1927 was 11,479 whose united earnings amounted to \$12,675,048, whilst for the period covered by this report the total was 11,879 with a total payment of \$13,085,548, being an increase of 400 in the number of persons employed and an increase of \$410,500 in salary and wage-payments. In addition to this amount the sum of \$1,662,788 was paid to contractors but the number of persons they employed was not reported.

The number of days the factories exclusive of contractors, were in operation during the calendar years 1927 and 1928 together with the number of hours per day and per week normally worked by wage-earners is given in Table 5. The total number of wage-earners employed during the same period is given by sex and by months in table 6(a). Employment reached its maximum in September with 10,830, whilst the minimum number reported was 9,733 in the month of January.



The number and percentage of wage-earners in month of highest employment working specified hours is shown in table 5(b) for Canada and the provinces. From this table it will be noted that in Manitoba and the Western provinces the 8 hour day is general. In the Maritime provinces and Quebec the 9 hour day prevails. In Quebec only 9.9 per cent of the wage-earners work 10 hours.

The hoursworked per day in the month of highest employment and the standard working hours per week are shown by provinces in table 6(c). It should be noted that the statistics relating to hours of labour in columns 1, 2 and 3 are based on figures compiled for the month of highest employment, whilst those in columns 4 and 5 represent the total standard weekly hours of labour for the number of establishments reporting to the Bureau,

The average daily hours of labour computed on the above basis was for the Dominion 8.6, whilst the average weekly hours worked out at 45.3 per establishment.



Fuel Consumption

The quantity and value of the various kinds of fuel consumed in the industry during the calendar years 1927 and 1928 is given in table 7. The total expenditure for all fuel fell from \$76,924 in 1927 to \$73,759 in 1928, a decrease of \$3,165. Coal takes precedence over all other fuel with a total cost of \$47,741, gas takes second place with \$17,429, whilst fuel oil occupies third position with \$5,520. The cost of electricity purchased in 1928 was \$61,337 as compared with \$58,440 in 1927.

Power Installation

The power installation of the industry in the year 1928 is shown in table 8 by (a) classes of power, (b) number of units in each class and (c) the horse power capacity according to the manufacturers rating. In 1927 the power installed was reported at 397 units with a development of 1,491 horse power, whilst for the period covered by this report the number of units was 415 with a capacity of 1,436 horse power, an increase of 18 units but a decrease of 55 horse power over the two year period. The number of boilers installed in 1928 was 36 with a boiler h.p. capacity of 511.

Materials Used

The total cost of all materials used in the manufacture of ready-to-wear clothing is shown by orovinces in table 9 for the calendar years 1927 and 1928. The total cost rose from \$21,335,668 in 1927 to \$24,567,328 in 1928, an increase during the year of \$3,231,640.


