MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1929.

Ottawa, January, 1931. - A report on men's ready-to-wear clothing made in factories in Canada during the calendar year 1929 is presented herewith. Reports were received from 205 establishments in 27 of which the clothing was made by outside contractors from materials furnished by the firm reporting, in consequence of which the number of employees, wages paid and the number of days the factories were in operation were omitted. A comparative summary for the years 1928 and 1929 showing the location of the factories by provinces is given in the following table.

MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1929.

A threefold measure of the size of establishments is presented in the following series of tables. Table (a) affords a measure of establishments from the standpoint of employment, table (b) from the amount of capital invested and table (c) the gross value of production.

From a study of these tables it will be noted that 27 establishments in a total of 218 employed 56.58 per cent of the total number at work in 1928 as compared with 34 establishments in a total of 205 employing 54.28 per cent in 1929. Similarly in capital investment 31 establishments had 65.91 per cent of the total investment in 1928 whilst in 30 establishments in 1929 the percentage to the total capital was 67.87. Again in gross value of production 64 establishments in 1928 produced 75.02 per cent of the total, whereas in 1929 with 72 establishments the percentage was 81.04 of the total gross value of production.



MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1929.

Production

The total value of all articles of clothing manufactured during the calendar year 1929 is shown by provinces in Table 2. The total amount in 1928 was \$48,477,178, whilst the amount reported for 1929 was \$50,580,168, an increase of \$2,102,990.

In order of importance the province of Quebec leads with a total output valued at \$31,700,470, Ontario follows next with \$17,432,412, Alberta occupies third position with \$391,310, the Maritime provinces fourth with \$386,734, British Columbia fifth with \$368,481 and Manitoba last with \$300,761.

MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1929.

Capital Investment

The amount of capital invested in the industry is given by provinces in Table 3 for the calendar year 1929. The total capitalization rose from \$27,263,996 in 1928 to \$28,493,549 in 1929, an increase of \$1,229,553. The province of Quebec again takes precedence with a total investment of \$16,330,341, Ontario ranks second in importance with \$11,342,979, whilst Alberta, British Columbia, Maritime Provinces and Manitoba follow in the order named.

Employment Statistics

The number of persons employed in the industry during the calendar years 1928 and 1929 is given in table 4 by (a) classes of employment, (b) sex and (c) salary and wage payments.

The total number of persons on the payroll during the year 1928 was 11,879 whose united earnings amounted to \$13,085,548, whilst for the period covered by this report the total was 11,506 with a total payment of \$13,371,417, being a decrease of 373 in the number of persons employed and an increase of \$285,869 in salary and wage-payments. In addition to this amount the sum of \$1,548,614 was paid to contractors but the number of persons they employed was not reported.



The number of days the factories exclusive of contractors, were in operation during the calendar years 1928 and 1929 together with the number of hours per day and per week normally worked by wage-earners is given in Table 5. The total number of wage-earners employed during the same period is given by sex and by months in table 6(a). Employment reached its maximum in March with 10,375, whilst the minimum number reported was 8,939 in the month of December.



The number and percentage of wage-earners in month of highest employment working specified hours is shown in table 6(b) for Canada and the provinces. From this table it will be noted that in Ontario, Manitoba and the Western Provinces the 8 hour day is general. In the Maritime Provinces and Quebec the 9 hour day prevails. In Quebec only 19.0 per cent of the wage-earners work 10 hours.

The hours worked per day in the month of highest employment and the standard working hours per week are shown by provinces in table 6(c). It should be noted that the statistics relating to hours of labour in columns 1, 2 and 3 are based on figures compiled for the month of highest employment, whilst those in columns 4 and 5 represent the total standard weekly hours of labour for the number of establishments reporting to the Bureau.

The average daily hours of labour computed on the above basis was for the Dominion 8.7, whilst the average weekly hours worked out at 45.8 per establishment.

Fuel Consumption

The quantity and value of the various kinds of fuel consumed in the industry during the calendar years 1928 and 1929 is given in table 7. The total expenditure for all fuel fell from \$73,759 in 1928 to \$72,110 in 1929, a decrease of \$1,649. Coal takes precedence over all other fuel with a total cost of \$46,415, gas takes second place with \$15,717, whilst fuel oil occupies third position with \$4,902. The cost of electricity purchased in 1929 was \$56,911 as compared with \$61,337 in 1928.

Power Installation

The power installation of the industry in the year 1929 is shown in table 8 by (a) classes of power, (b) number of units in each class and (c) the horse power capacity according to the manufacturers rating. In 1928 the power installed was reported at 415 units with a development of 1,436 horse power, whilst for the period covered by this report the number of units was 440 with a capacity of 1,401 horse power, an increase of 25 units but a decrease of 35 horse power over the two year period. The number of boilers installed in 1929 was 36 with a boiler h.p. capacity of 617.

Materials Used

The total cost of all materials used in the manufacture of ready-to-wear clothing is shown by provinces in table 9 for the calendar years 1928 and 1929. The total cost rose from \$24,567,328 in 1928 to \$25,653,973 in 1929, an increase during the year of \$1,086,645.






