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THE MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

In 1932 reports were received from 163 factories whose principal output consisted of men's factory clothing. While this appears to be a decrease of seventeen from the number reporting in 1931, in reality it is only a decrease of ten, for seven establishments which were included with Men's Factory Clothing in 1931 have been grouped with clothing contractors in 1932, statistics of whose operations are treated in a separate section of this report.

In this industry, in recent years, there has been a tendency to have garments finished by outside contractors from materials furnished and cut by clothing manufacturers, and in order to measure this trend, we have endeavoured to collect statistics of the manufacturing activities of such clothing contractors for 1932. While we have received reports from ninety-five, it does not include them all by any means. These ninety-five report a gross value of work performed amounting to \$1,012,312, while the clothing manufacturers reported that they paid to outside contractors a total of \$1,680,969. Tables 15 to 21 inclusive cover the operations of clothing contractors, both men's and women's, in 1932.

The men's clothing industry showed a considerable recession in 1932. Without exception the various principal items declined in either values or numbers from 1931. The gross value of production declined by \$6,660,492 or 19.6 per cent, capital investment by \$5,165,344 or 23.9 per cent. 8,098 persons were furnished employment, a decrease of 1,603 or 16.5 per cent and they were paid \$7,269,994 in salaries and wages, which was \$2,315,468 or 24.1 per cent less than in 1931. The cost of all materials used was \$15,262,351, a drop of \$3,100,462 or 16.9 per cent, while the value added by manufacture, amounting to \$12,027,240, declined by \$3,560,030 or 22.8 per cent.

The following table illustrates by provinces the variations in the principal statistics in 1932 as compared with 1931.

Of the 163 establishments reporting in 1932, 107 were located in Quebec, forty-three in Ontario, eight in Manitoba, two each in Nova Scotia and Alberta and one in

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British Columbia. The following table shows the percentage distribution in these provinces in 1931 and 1932.

By referring to table 3 it will be noted that of the 163 establishments reporting, eighty-nine are located in Montreal. They accounted for an output of \$13,089,564 or 77.2 per cent of the total provincial production and 47.9 per cent of the total Dominion production. There were thirty-one establishments located in Toronto with a production of \$7,820,962, which was 80.9 per cent of the total provincial and 28.7 per cent of the Dominion output. These two cities, therefore, accounted for 120 establishments, supplied \$11,247,300 or 68.4 per cent of the capital invested in the industry, furnished employment to 5,508 persons or sixty-eight per cent of the total number employed. Their salary and wage bill amounted to \$5,227,510, 71.9 per cent of all salaries and wages paid. They purchased \$11,846,326, or 77.6 per cent, worth of all materials used, had a production valuation of \$20,910,526 or 76.6 per cent of the total and accounted for \$9,064,200 or 75.4 per cent of the entire value added by manufacture. The following table affords a comparison of these figures for 1931 and 1932.

It will be borne in mind that statistics published in this report include only those of such manufacturers whose principal item of production is men's factory clothing. Statistics of production are not to be regarded as comprehensive, as they are also produced to some extent in the Men's Furnishing Goods, Women's Factory Clothing and other industries.

The principal item of production in 1932 was men's woollen suits, comprising an output of 71,251 dozen valued at \$12,523,082. The corresponding figures for 1931 were

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78,999 dozen worth \$15,660,193. The production of boys' woollen suits was 27,805 dozen worth \$1,452,221 in 1932 and 33,099 dozen with a value of \$1,775,345 in 1931. Other important items of production in both years were men's separate woollen coats, men's separate woollen trousers and men's overcoats and topcoats. All the items of production are shown in detail in table 4.

The capital investment showed a decrease of \$5,165,344 in 1932 as compared with 1931, and of \$12,059,501 from the peak year of 1929. In 1932 fixed capital declined by \$1,938,806 and the decline in liquid was \$3,226,538, chiefly in the cash account and bills and accounts receivable.

In this industry the bulk of manufacturing is taken care of by a comparatively small number of plants. By referring to table 7 it will be noted that forty-one establishments had an output of \$19,336,044 or almost seventy-one per cent of the total, forty-seven establishments supplied \$12,577,593 or over seventy-six per cent of the capital investment and forty-three establishments furnished employment to 6,182 persons or over seventy-six per cent of the total number given employment.

The average number of wage-earners, 6,927 in 1932, showed a decrease of 1,413 in comparison with 1931. March was the month of highest employment with 7,159 persons, while December with 6,444 was the lowest. Corresponding figures for 1931 were March high with 8,861 and December low with 7,685.

With regard to imports and exports. There is no way of segregating men's or women's and children's clothing and, therefore, we can only include all clothing with each of these industries. The amount of imports in 1932 was relatively small, amounting to only \$1,929,698, a decrease of \$2,405,318 from the 1931 valuation of \$4,335,016. Two-thirds of this reduction is accounted for by lower imports from the United States, the value of which, from that country, dropped from \$2,344,498 in 1931 to \$778,946 in 1932.

Exports were valued at \$124,237 in 1932 and \$191,677 in 1931. Newfoundland was our best customer in both years, followed by the United States and St. Pierre and Miquelon.

SECTION II. -- CLOTHING CONTRACTORS, 1932.

As this branch of the clothing industry has been increasing in importance of late years, an effort was made to collect statistics concerning it for 1932, and while ninety-five responded with completed reports, many others failed to do so. These ninety-five include contractors of both men's and women's clothing.

The total value of work performed by them amounted to \$1,012,312, while the manufacturers of men's factory clothing advised that they alone had paid to outside contractors the sum of \$1,680,969. However, this was a new venture, and a greater measure of success may be expected for 1933.

The materials used and supplied by the contractors themselves is quite small, consisting usually of thread, buttons, etc. The amount reported in 1932 was \$62,763. With the value of work reported totalling \$1,012,312, the value added by manufacture is \$949,549.

Tables 15 to 21 inclusive, comprising this report, cover the principal statistics, capital investment, salaries, wages, employment, hours worked, power installation and consumption of fuel and electricity. Also a list of the ninety-five contractors is appended.
