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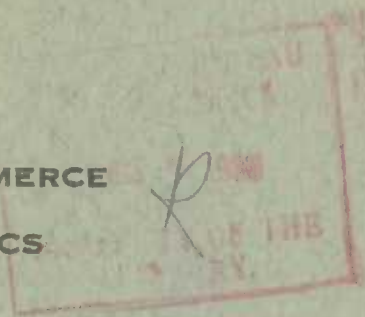

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THE MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1933.

In 1933 reports were received from 163 establishments whose principal output consisted of men's factory clothing, the same number as in the previous year. Of this total 2 were located in Nova Scotia, 108 in Quebec, 42 in Ontario, 8 in Manitoba, 2 in Alberta and 1 in British Columbia.

Although there was no change in the number of establishments reporting, there were slight decreases in all the principal items with the exception of the cost of materials used.

The total value of production fell from \$27,289,591 in 1932 to \$26,622,689 in 1933, a decrease of \$666,902. Capital investment declined in value from \$16,434,048 in 1932 to \$14,954,100 in 1933, a decrease of \$1,479,948. In employment 129 fewer persons were at work and their remuneration was \$722,001 less than the previous year. There was, however, an increase in the cost of materials used amounting to \$381,462. The value added by manufacture diminished to the extent of \$1,048,364.

The following table illustrates by provinces the variations in the principal statistics for the two year period 1932-1933.

Reference to table 3 shows that out of a total of 163 establishments, 88 were located in Montreal. They accounted for a total production of \$12,130,647. There were 28 establishments in Toronto with an output amounting to \$7,374,568. These two cities, therefore, accounted for 116 establishments, supplied \$9,976,216 or 66.7 of the total capital invested in the industry, furnished employment to 5,283 persons or 66.3 per cent of the total number employed. Their remuneration amounted to \$4,584,654 or 70.0 per cent of the total salaries and wages paid. The expenditure on account of materials used was \$11,653,616 or 74.5 per cent. The production was \$19,505,215 which was equivalent to 73.3 per cent of the entire output of the Dominion, whilst the value added by manufacture was \$7,851,599 or 71.5 per cent of the whole industry.

Statistics published in this report must not be considered as comprehensive as they cover only those manufacturers whose principal item of production is "men's factory made clothing". These are also produced to some extent in the "men's furnishing goods", "women's factory clothing" and other industries.

THE MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1933.

The principal item of production in 1933 was "men's woollen suits" with an output of 867,944 suits with a selling value of \$12,118,101. Next in importance were "men's overcoats and topcoats" with a production of 520,959 valued at \$5,449,418, whilst "men's woollen trousers" take third place with 1,055,180 worth \$2,620,904, followed by "boys' woollen suits" of which 407,490 were made with a selling value of \$1,701,635. All items of production are shown in detail compared for the two year period 1932-1933 in table 4.

The capital investment showed a decrease of \$1,479,948 in 1933 as compared with the previous year and of \$13,539,449 from the peak year of 1929. Fixed capital declined by \$538,471 whilst working capital decreased to the extent of \$941,477.

In this industry the bulk of manufacturing is confined to a comparatively small number of plants. By referring to table 7 it will be observed that forty establishments had a combined production of \$18,999,595 or 71.3 per cent of the entire output for the Dominion. In capital investment forty-one establishments contributed \$11,021,871 or 73.7 per cent of the total outlay and forty-two firms furnished employment to 6,331 persons which represents 79.4 per cent of the total employed in this industry.

The average number of wage-earners fell from 6,927 in 1932 to 6,859, a decrease of 68 during the two year period. October was the month in which the maximum number were employed with a total of 7,177, whilst the minimum number recorded was 6,395 in January. Details of monthly employment are given in table 9.

Articles of men's clothing are not shown separately in the custom's classification. Therefore, it is not possible to give the value of men's clothing imported or exported during 1933. Imports and exports of clothing of all kinds,--men's, women's and children's--during the calendar year 1933 will be found in tables 13 and 14.

SECTION 2. - CLOTHING CONTRACTORS, 1933.

In this branch of the clothing industry, which embraces both men's and women's clothing manufactured under contract, reports were received from 101 firms of which 89 were located in the province of Quebec, mostly in the city of Montreal, and 12 in Ontario of which Toronto was the principal centre of activity. The total value of work performed during the period covered by this report was \$1,237,828 which represented an increase of \$225,516 over the amount reported for the previous year which is partly due to the fact that 6 additional firms reported their operations.

The materials used which are supplied by the contractors themselves are quite small consisting principally of thread, buttons, etc., amounted to \$117,328 in 1933, thus the sum of \$1,120,500 represents the value added by manufacture. Tables 15 to 21 inclusive cover the principal statistics, capital investment, salaries, wages, employment, hours of labour, power installation and consumption of fuel and electricity. A list of the 101 contractors is given in Appendix No. 2.
