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THE MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1935.

In 1935 reports were received from 170 establishments whose principal output consisted of men's factory made clothing, five more than were in operation during the previous year.

In 1935 conditions in this industry improved materially. The gross value of production rose from \$35,731,740 in 1934 to \$36,578,897 or a gain of more than 8 per cent, while the number of persons given employment increased from 8,849 to 9,296 or more than 5 per cent. The remuneration paid these employees required an additional \$1,101,455, bringing the total to \$8,990,370 or approximately 14 per cent more. The cost of the materials used in 1935 increased by \$1,218,703 or over 6 per cent more than that paid in 1934. There was also an expansion in the capital investment during 1935 when it amounted to \$16,271,865, an increase of \$1,050,037 or nearly 7 per cent as compared with 1934.

This industry is centered mainly in the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, 113 of the 170 establishments reporting in 1935 being located in Quebec and 43 in Ontario. Approximately 59 per cent of the total capital is invested in the Quebec establishments and these produced 62 per cent of the value of the total output, provided employment for 52 per cent of the total employees and paid almost 49 per cent of the total salaries and wages. The Province of Ontario in its 43 factories produced 35 per cent of the total output, employed 37 per cent of the capital and 43 per cent of the employees who received 48 per cent of the total sum paid in salaries and wages. In the other provinces the location of the establishments was as follows: Nova Scotia 2, Manitoba 9, Alberta 2 and British Columbia 1.

Upon referring to table 3 it will be seen that out of the total of 170 establishments, 95 were located in Montreal and 50 in Toronto, and that these account for a production valued at \$17,132,938 and \$10,385,641 respectively. In these two cities, therefore, are located 125 of the establishments in which is invested \$10,826,579 or 66 per cent of the total capital of this industry, and employment is furnished to 6,390 or over 68 per cent of the total number of persons employed. The remuneration of these employees amounted to \$6,587,896 or 73 per cent of the total salaries and wages paid. The cost of materials used was \$15,535,641 or 75 per cent, and the output was valued at \$27,518,579 or 75 per cent of the gross value of production.

The statistics published in this report include only those manufacturers whose principal item of production is men's factory clothing. Statistics relating to these specific products, however, are not to be regarded as representing the total Canadian production as they are also included to some extent in the Men's Furnishing Goods, Women's Factory Clothing and other industries.

Men's woollen suits formed the chief item of production in 1935 with an output of 1,251,898 valued at \$17,587,296, forming more than 48 per cent of the total value of production. The next most important item was men's overcoats of which 455,272 with a value of \$5,674,201 were manufactured, whilst third place was taken by men's woollen trousers with a production of 1,031,491 pairs valued at \$2,915,640. The output in most of the principal items shows an increase over the year 1934. Table 4 presents the production statistics of 1934 and 1935 in detail.

The capital investment shows a slight increase of \$1,050,037 over the \$15,221,828 reported in 1934, and this is made up almost entirely by an increase in the working capital as is shown in table 6.

A large part of the manufacturing in this industry is confined to a comparatively small number of plants. On referring to table 7 it will be seen that 53 establishments, or roughly one third of the total, had an output valued at \$28,245,786, or more than two thirds of the total production. In capital investment 44 establishments contributed more than 70 per cent of the total invested and 26 factories employed more than 64 per cent of the total employees.

The month of highest employment in 1935 was October when 7,998 wage-earners were engaged in this industry. The lowest employment figure was 7,084 reported for the month of January. The monthly average for wage-earners in 1935 was 7,661, an increase of 318 over that of 1934. The year 1935 also shows an increase in wages. In 1934 the average wage paid by this industry was \$789; in 1935 it increased to \$877.

SECTION II. - CLOTHING CONTRACTORS, 1935.

In this branch of the clothing industry, which embraces both men's and women's clothing manufactured under contract, reports were received from 113 establishments of which 97 were located in the Province of Quebec, mostly in the City of Montreal, and 16 in Ontario with Toronto being the principal centre of activity. The total value of work performed during 1935 was \$1,918,575, which represents an increase of \$386,645 over the amount reported for the previous year.

The materials used, which are supplied by the contractors themselves, consisting principally of thread, buttons, etc., amounted to \$127,480 in 1935. Tables 15 to 22 inclusive cover the principal statistics—capital investment, salaries and wages, employment, hours of work, power installation and consumption of fuel and electricity. A list of the 113 contractors is given in Appendix 2.
