

THE MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1937.

In 1937 reports were received from 198 establishments whose principal output consisted of men's factory made clothing, which was an increase of 10 over the number reported during the previous year.

In 1937 conditions in this industry improved materially. The gross value of production rose from \$40,526,745 in 1936 to \$45,249,174 in 1937, or a gain of more than 11 per cent, while the number of persons given employment increased from 10,578 to 12,176, or more than 15 per cent. The remuneration paid these employees required an additional \$1,873,698 bringing the total to \$12,135,443, or approximately 18 per cent more. The cost of the materials used in 1937 increased by \$2,866,453 or over 12 per cent more than that paid in 1936. There was also an expansion in the capital investment during 1937 when it amounted to \$20,868,845, an increase of \$2,297,886 or over 12 per cent as compared with 1936.

This industry is centered mainly in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario, 128 of the 198 establishments reporting in 1937 being located in Quebec and 53 in Ontario. Approximately 62 per cent of the total capital is invested in the Quebec establishments and these produced 62 per cent of the value of the total output, provided employment for 55 per cent of the total employees and paid 52 per cent of the total salaries and wages. The province of Ontario in its 53 factories produced 34 per cent of the total output, employed 33 per cent of the capital and 40 per cent of the employees who received 45 per cent of the total sum paid in salaries and wages. In the other provinces the location of the establishments was as follows:- Nova Scotia, 2; Manitoba, 12; Alberta, 2; and British Columbia, 1.

Upon referring to Table 3 it will be seen that out of the total of 198 establishments, 107 were located in Montreal and 40 in Toronto, and that these account for a production valued at \$22,120,822 and \$12,572,327, respectively. In these two cities, therefore, are located 147 of the establishments in which is invested \$14,841,020 or 71 per cent of the total capital of this industry, and employment is furnished to 8,181 or over 67 per cent of the total number of persons employed. The remuneration of these employees amounted to \$8,917,014 or over 73 per cent of the total salaries and wages paid. The cost of materials used was \$19,721,230 or 77 per cent, and the output was valued at \$34,693,149 or 76 per cent of the gross value of production.

Men's woollen suits formed the chief item of production in 1937 with an output of 1,412,671, valued at \$22,153,303 forming more than 48 per cent of the total value of production. The next most important item was men's overcoats of which 702,764 with a value of \$9,327,228 were manufactured, whilst third place was taken by men's woollen trousers with a production of 1,112,297 pairs valued at \$3,118,064. The output in most of the principal items shows an increase over the year 1936. Table 4 presents the production statistics of 1936 and 1937 in detail.

The capital investment shows an increase of \$2,297,886 over the \$18,570,959 reported in 1936 and this is made up almost entirely by an increase in the working capital as is shown in Table 6.

A large part of the manufacturing in this industry is confined to a comparatively small number of plants. On referring to Table 7 it will be seen that 60 establishments had an output valued at \$34,492,520. In capital investment 58 establishments contributed more than 74 per cent of the total invested and 33 factories employed more than 67 per cent of the total employees.

The month of highest employment in 1937 was October when 10,402 wage-earners were engaged in this industry. The lowest employment figure was 9,454 reported for the month of January. The monthly average for wage-earners in 1937 was 10,117 an increase of 1,280 over that of 1936. The year 1937, also shows an increase in the average rate of wages paid. In 1936 the average wage paid by this industry was \$872; in 1937 it rose to \$903.

THE MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1937.

Imports and exports of men's clothing are not shown separately, but are grouped with women's clothing. Imports and exports of all clothing show an increase during 1937. Imports, as will be seen in Table 13, increased from \$2,514,961 to \$2,782,930, while Table 14 shows the exports to have increased from \$1,793,377 in 1936 to \$2,505,059 in 1937.

SECTION II. - CLOTHING CONTRACTORS, 1937.

In this branch of the clothing industry, which embraces both men's and women's clothing manufactured under contract, reports were received from 129 establishments of which 105 were located in the Province of Quebec, mostly in the City of Montreal, and 24 in Ontario with Toronto being the principal centre of activity. The total value of work performed during 1937 was \$2,159,684 which represents an increase of \$184,099 over the amount reported for the previous year.

The materials used, which are supplied by the contractors themselves, consisting principally of thread, buttons, etc., amounted to \$156,492 in 1937. Tables 15 to 22 inclusive, cover the principal statistics - capital investment, salaries and wages, employment, hours of work, power installation and consumption of fuel and electricity. A list of the 129 contractors is given in Appendix 2.
