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SECTION I

THE MEN'S FACTORY CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1943.

The men's factory clothing industry was one of the first to feel the effects of the present war. To supply the demand of the armed forces as well as the stimulated demands of the civil population the industry expanded its productive capacity accordingly. In 1943 there were 410 establishments operating. These plants employed 30,885 persons who received \$37,267,075 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$149,800,112.

In comparing the 1943 operations with that of the previous year, it is found that there was a slight increase of \$467,251 or .8 per cent in the capital invested and \$236,660 or .2 per cent in the gross value of production. The number of persons employed declined by 2,028 or 6.1 per cent. However, due to the higher wage scales prevailing in 1943, the amount of salaries and wages paid increased by \$342,543 or .9 per cent. Weekly earnings of male wage-earners advanced from \$29.28 in 1942 to \$31.80 in 1943, while earnings of female workers advanced from \$15.84 to \$17.02. The physical volume of production also declined.

Nineteen forty-two was the banner year for the industry as regards the physical volume of production and the number of persons employed. As compared with 1939 there was an increase of 10,487 or 46.7 per cent in the number of persons employed and 75 per cent in the physical volume of production.

In the men's factory clothing industry there are eight more or less distinct divisions as regards the nature of the products manufactured. These divisions are not, however, all inclusive and a certain amount of overlapping occurs. The classification of an establishment is, therefore, determined by its principal products. For example, a firm whose production is composed of \$100,000 worth of suits and overcoats, and \$35,000 worth of overalls and work shirts is placed in the "suits and overcoats" section; whereas a firm producing \$25,000 worth of fine shirts and \$10,000 worth of men's neckwear would be placed in the "fine shirts" section. These divisions together with the number of persons employed and the value of products manufactured in 1943 are given in the table following:

NOTE - The statistics published in this report include only those manufacturers whose principal item of production is men's factory clothing. Statistics relating to these specific products, however, are not to be regarded as representing the total Canadian production as they are also included to some extent in the Women's Factory Clothing and other industries. NOTE - Statistics covering materials used are not collected in detail. The total cost is shown by provinces in Table 1 and by industry in Table 4.

SECTION II. - CLOTHING CONTRACTORS, MEN'S, 1943.

In this branch of the clothing industry, reports were received from 106 establishments of which 94 were located in the Province of Quebec, mostly in the city of Montreal, which is the centre of the industry. There were also 12 establishments in Ontario, all of which were located in the city of Toronto. The total value of work performed during 1943 was \$3,702,605. The capital investment was \$936,176 whilst the number of persons employed was 2,591 who received \$2,900,897 in salaries and wages.

The materials used, which are supplied by the contractors themselves, consisting principally of thread, buttons, etc., amounted to \$212,513 in 1943. Tables 14 to 21 inclusive, cover the principal statistics - capital investment, salaries and wages, employment, hours of work, power installation and consumption of fuel and electricity.

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
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
