## 1922.

Ottava, Nay, 1924.- The Dominion Bumeau of Statistics presents herewith a renort on the Women's Cunthe fndistry in Caneda. for the calendar vear 1922. The repoer inciudes only factory production of tive articles of womer ${ }^{2}$ s wear, as outlined belcw:-
(I) Women's fuctuon clothing.
(2) Ladies' and children's wear.
(3) Womeris neckmoaz and t'emey gools.
(4) Embroidery and trimaimes.
(5) Laces, tapes and bind_ngs.

Cwistom clothins, includins dress and mantle making and millinery, the collection of which has ween discontinued for the present, does not form ny purt of this report.

The number of estakl ishments reporting under the avove named he ads during ly2n, vere located by p:o vine es as follows: British Columbia, 10; the Prairie Provinces. 9; Ontario, 150; Guebec, 121, and the Maxitime Frovinces, 3, makine a total for the Dominion of 293.

The value of production under each head in 1922 and the cost of materials enterine into tie product was as follows:-

To prevent disclosure of indiridual statistics it has been found nesessary to combine the Proinie provinces throrphout the tables of this report.

## PRINCIPAI STATI STICS

The total protuction in the Women's Factory Clothing industry for 1922 emounted to $\$ 41,653,514$, as compared vith $\$ 44,669,728$ in 1921, a decrease due to ádilling mariset of $\$ 3.016 .214$ or nearly seven per cent.

The cost of maerials during the period fell from $\$ 23,189.442$ to $\$ 21,340,782$, or a desrease of 5.8 rer cent.

Bmploment statictins, on we sther hand, show increases over 1921. Esistied employees rose rom 1,643 to 1,676 and wage earners, includine niece-womkers, from 20.372 to 11,732 , the total increase for a.11 classes teing $1,4.43$.

In the agtregate amounts paid for sal aries and wages, there vas a asorease of 1977,8 , as compared with 1021. The averase solary, ircespective of sex, winch in 1921 was approximately $\$ 2,286$ fell to $\$ 2,065$ in ig22, whilst tine average wage fell from \$903 in 1921 to $\$ 800$ in 1922.

The aggregate capital investment also shows a decrease when compared with 1921 of 3531,333 , of which fixed capital comprising land, buildings, machinery and tools repesented $\$ 221,699$ and ro rking capital, compris inf materials, stocks in process, cash and trading accounts, etc., by $\$ 309,634$.

The cost of fuel laid coma at the factory in 1922 amounted to $\$ 63,963$, as arainst an ovilay of $\$ 55,250$ in 1921 . Miscellaneous exrenses, including rents, taxes, insurance, advertising and travelling expenses, repairs to buildings and machinery, and all other sundry expenses totalled $\$ 4,204,7 \nexists 7$ in 1922, as compared with an expenditure of $\$ 4,407,437$ in 1921 .

The following sumaary taile presents a comparative view of the principai statistics of the industries for the calendar years 1921 and 1922 .

Comparison of Principal Statistics of the Women's Factory Clothing Inciustrv, 1921 and $122 ?$


An analysis of the cost of production for 1921 shows that 29.32 per cent was accountcd for in the parmert of sataries and wages, 30.01. per cent for fuel and miscellaneous arpenses, and 57.73 per cent for the cost, value of materials, the remainimg B. S4 pre cent constituting a fund for the payment of interest on canitaz investment and of profits on the year's operations. In 1922, the percentage of the cost of salaries and mases to the total irlue of prorivetion had risen to 31.02 , fuel and miscellaneous expersss to 10.25 and the cost of materials to 52.43, the balance for dictribution of interest and profits being 6.30 pei cent.

## CAPTM MTVSTSUS

The raount of cenital invested in the Womon' s Tactory Clotining industry is presented in Iuble , by items and by provinces. Firced cepital amounted to ba, 237,283 ar 26.3 per cont and workinc capital to $13,050,778$ or 73.7 per cont. The Province of Ont:ario furnished $\$ 11,409,105$ of the total for the Dominion, ox apncorimately 60 yer cent. Guebec's moportion of investod capital totalled $36,773,300$ or 36 per cent, whilst the remaining provinces represented only 4 per cent. The ratio of the ralue of production to canital investment was as 100 to 41, that is to say that :"41 of cawital was required for every $\$ 200$ of goods produced.

## OTIFR LIBOTR SNATISITCS

The working time of factorics and cmployecs is presented by provinces in Table 5. Operating time in factorics is sinown by the number of davs wo nked on (a) full time, (b) part time and (c) idle, wilst that of arployecs is shown jy tho number of hours worked (a) per day or shift and (b) per vock. The average time of plants operating on full and part time for the Dominion was 282.42 days and that of mployecs 8.05 hours per day and 45 hours per week.

The quantity and cost value at the factory or the prircipel matcrials used in tio industry are shown in Table 6 for the Deminion and the provincee. The total cost of meterials used during the vear was s?l, 840,782 , of which ontario' B propoition was over 63 per cent, Guebec's 33.3 per cent and the other provinces 3.7 por cert. Irices of materials vary when compared for the years 1921 and 1922. In 1921 Screco, twocds, etc. cosi on an averaçe $\$ 1.94$ ner yarc, as aceinst \$1.64 in 1222. Silks, satins, ewc., cost 41.43 per yard in 3921 , as apeinst 31.30 in 1922 . on the ouhe' haxd Cottons, coioured, etc. rose from 2 ri cents to 30 cents per yard, and hleachoc and arituacilcd cotion frora 24 cents to 25 cents per yard, the latter due to shortace in raw cotton procuction.
