



EXPLANATORY NOTES

This report is one in a series of about 140 publications which present the results of the 1960 Census of Manufactures. Most reports in this series refer to specific industries, but there are summary reports for Canada and the provinces and for major industry groups. Adoption of the revised Standard Industrial Classification for 1960 compilations has necessitated changes in titles of many reports in this annual series. The content of many industries has also been affected (see following note on Industrial Classification).

Industry statistics given in these reports refer to number of establishments, employees, salaries and wages, cost of materials, supplies, fuel and electricity, gross value of shipments, inventories and value added by manufacturing. Details of materials used and products shipped are also given. Descriptions of the principal industry statistics, with special reference to 1960 are as follows:

Period Covered

Firms are asked to submit figures for the calendar year, if at all possible, and most reports are on this basis. Financial year reports for periods differing from the calendar year are accepted in instances where the firms find it impossible to supply calendar year data from accounting records. However the data on employees, salaries and wages are requested on a calendar year basis in all cases.

Establishment

Data for the annual census is collected on an establishment basis. A firm with more than one plant is required to file a report for each plant. In most cases an establishment is a complete factory: sometimes, however, a plant is divided into two or more establishments when it carries out operations classifiable to different industries and when separate accounting records are available. Usually the statistics for an establishment relate only to the manufacturing activities. Other activities such as construction at the plant by its own employees. wholesale or retail activities carried on at the plant location, etc., are not included. Plants engaged solely in repair work (except in the case of furniture, shipbuilding, boat building, aircraft and railway rolling stock industries) are not included but plants occupied in assembling parts into complete units are included.

Employees

Administrative and office employees include all executives and supervisory officials such as presidents, vice-presidents, secretaries, treasurers, etc., together with managers, professional and technical employees, superintendents and factory supervisors above the working foremen level, and clerical employees. Working owners and partners are also included in this category.

Production and related workers include all other factory workmen whether paid on a monthly, weekly, hourly or piece-work basis. Working foremen doing work similar to that of the employees they supervise are included, as are maintenance, warehousing and delivery staffs. Employees on new construction work, in retail or wholesale operations, on outside piece work etc. are not included.

Production workers are reported by months, an average for the year being obtained by summing the monthly figures and dividing by twelve. This procedure is followed even though the plant did not operate in all months. Figures on employment refer to calendar years whether or not some establishments reported other data on a financial year basis.

Salaries and Wages

Salaries and wages refer to gross earnings of the employees described above, including salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses, the value of room and board where provided, deductions for income tax and social services such as sickness and unemployment insurance, pensions, etc., as well as any other allowances forming part of the employees' wages. Payments for overtime are included.

Salaries refer to amounts paid to administrative and office employees. Withdrawals by working owners or partners for normal living expenses for self and family are included but not their withdrawals for income tax. Wages refer to the amounts paid to production and related workers as defined above. Data on earnings refer to the calendar year whether or not some establishments reported other data on a financial year basis.

Cost of Fuel and Electricity

Figures for fuel refer to amounts actually used, (including fuel used in cars and trucks), not to purchases unless the quantities are the same. Values refer to the laid-down cost at the works, including freight, duty, etc.

Materials and Supplies Used

Figures represent quantities and laid-down cost values, at the works, of materials and supplies actually used during the year whether purchased from others or received as transfers from other plants of the reporting company. Amounts paid to other manufacturers for work done on materials owned by the reporting company are included. Returnable containers or any other items charged to capital account are not included. Fuels are not included. Goods bought from others or received as transfers from other plants or reporting companies for resale without further processing are not included. Maintenance and repair supplies not chargeable to capital account are included.

Factory Shipments

Factory shipments refer to shipments of goods made from own materials either in the reporting plant or by other manufacturers on the basis of a charge to the reporting plant for work done. All products and by-products shipped from the establishment are included whether for domestic use, export, or for government departments. Transfer shipments to sales outlets, distributing warehouses or to other manufacturing units of the reporting firm are included. Goods bought or received as transfers

and resold without further processing are not included. Values are computed on f.o.b. plant or plant warehouse basis, and do not include sales tax or excise duties. Values of containers not returnable are included. Amounts received in payment for work done on materials owned by others are included.

In a few industries such as shipbuilding, aircraft, etc., where work on principal products extend over a relatively long period, the value of production is recorded rather than the value of shipments. For those industries production is computed from the value of deliveries of complete units during the year plus the value of work done during the year on unfinished units less the value of work done in previous years on finished units delivered in the year under review.

Inventories

Values represent the book values of manufacturing inventories owned and held at the reporting plant. Figures include inventories held in warehouses or selling outlets which have been included with plant operations for purposes of reporting shipments.

Value added by Manufacturing

Figures are computed from value of shipments plus or minus changes in inventories of finished goods and goods in process less cost of materials, fuel and electricity. This figure is sometimes referred to as net production.

Standard Industrial Classification

The revised Standard Industrial Classification which has been introduced with the 1960 Census of Manufactures provides for a breakdown of the universe into 140 industries arranged in 20 major groups compared with 135 industries in 17 major groups in the old classification which was used in the compilations for the years 1949 to 1959 inclusive. It incorporates changes considered desirable on the basis of experience in using the earlier classification as well as those which take account of changes in the structure of Canadian industries associated with the rapid developments of the past decade. Full details are contained in the Standard Industrial Classification Manual, Catalogue No. 12-501, which is available from either the Queen's Printer or the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. Reporting establishments are classified or allotted to specific industries on the basis of the value of principal products made or shipped.

Many industries remain unchanged in the new classification but in many instances there have been substantial changes in content because of the shifting of establishments from one industry to another or in re-grouping of establishments. Where

changes have occurred the principal statistics for 1957, 1958 and 1959 have been re-compiled to provide data on a basis comparable with those for 1960.

Short Forms

Between 1949 and 1957, in an effort to ease the reporting burden for smaller firms, a short form was used asking for the total value of shipments only or, in a few cases where losses of detail were significant, for quantities and values of principal products. For purposes of publication, missing data were estimated on the basis of appropriate ratios. In general the cut-off point for these short forms was set at \$50,000 value of shipments. About 40% of the total number of establishments reported on the short form and accounted for less than 3 per cent of the total value of shipments.

In 1958, in order to establish a new base year, the small firms were asked to report all items of principal statistics together with some detail on materials and products.

For the 1959 Census, the short form was used again, but further steps were taken to ease the respondents' burden. First, the general limit for short forms was raised to \$100,000 value of shipments. In addition, a new intermediate form was developed. This form is a shortened version of the long form in that most of the general questions were pared down and the detailed lists of materials and products were limited to the more important items. The general limits for firms in this category were set at between \$100,000-\$500,000 value of shipments, but in the case of both the short and intermediate forms there were lower cut-offs for a number of industries in which the smaller firms accounted for a larger share of total shipments. On the other hand, limits were raised where this could be done without a significant loss of coverage. On most of the short forms for 1959, in addition to total value of shipments, data on principal products were requested. In a few industries, where loss of employment and earnings data were considered too large because of higher cut-offs, a question on total payroll was placed on the short form. This practice was followed again in 1960.

The intermediate and long forms provide complete data for the compilation of all elements of principal industry statistics and the details of materials and products. The one-page short form, although containing data on principal products and total value of shipments, does not request information on other elements of principal statistics such as value of inventories, materials, fuel and electricity and, in most cases, employment and salaries and wages, nor does it contain detailed data on volume and value of materials used. For purposes of compiling aggregates of principal statistics by industry and by geographic location, the missing data for each establishment were estimated for 1959 by using, in general, ratios based on the change in the value of shipments between 1958 and 1959. The proportion of the estimated data was generally less than 5 per cent of the total in each category of principal statistics.

¹ To arrive at the National Accounts concept of ''gross domestic product at factor cost'', it would be necessary to subtract also the cost of office supplies used, advertising, insurance and other goods and services obtained from other businesses. Data on these inputs are not collected on the annual Census of Manufactures. Value added figures for ''The primary industries and construction'' are published in D.B.S. publication 61-202, Survey of Production.

SECTION 1. THE COMBINED WOMEN'S AND CHILDREN'S CLOTHING FACTORIES, 1960.

The Women's and Children's Clothing Industries, formerly known as the Women's and Children's Factory Clothing Industries, are defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing suits, coats, dresses, skirts, blouses, household apparel, sportswear, underwear, lingerie and neckwear. Both "regular" factories and "contract" factories making women's clothing are classified in this industry and establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing children's and infants' dresses, coats, snow suits and other outerwear".

Section I of this report presents the overall statistics for The Combined Women's and Children's Clothing Factories. The three other sections deal separately with the component industries, which are: Section II. Women's Clothing Factories; Section III. Children's Clothing Industry (Factories only); and Section IV. Women's and Children's Clothing Contractors. The developments within these industries are noted in their respective sections, and a list of firms classified to each industry will be found at the end of each section.

For the 1960 survey, the Bureau implemented a revised Standard Industrial Classification one of the results of which was minor revisions to this combined industry as a scrutiny of the revised Principal Statistics for the years 1957 to 1959, inclusive (Table 1), will show. It should be noted, however, that, with the exception of Table 2, the 1959 data shown in this section of the report refer to the revised figures. It should be emphasized at this point that only the Women's Clothing Factories and not the Children's Clothing Industry (Factories only) nor the Women's and Children Clothing Contractors were changed in this 1960 implementation of the revised Standard Industrial Classification. For this reason, Sections 1 and 2 of this report are on the revised basis and Sections 3 and 4 are not.

The value of manufactured products shipped by women's and children's clothing factories in 1960 was \$342,360,243, an increase of \$9,802,360, or 2.9 per cent over the preceding year's total of \$332,557,883. The absolute gain was greater in the case of the Women's Factories, \$6,933.243, than in the Children's Industry, \$3,847,472 (see Section III, no change in 1959). However, in terms of percentages, the increases were 2.7 in the former industry and 5.5 in the latter one respectively. Employment in the combined industries was up by 0.8 per cent, from 34,174 in 1959 to 34,435 in 1960. Salary and wage payments also rose, from \$90,517,298 to \$92,255,009 in the current year, an increase of 1.9 per cent. The cost of materials and supplies used was higher by 2.4 per cent, rising from \$179,113,172 in 1959 to \$183,472,412 in 1960, the year under review.

In the combined industries in 1960 there were 834 reporting establishments, 15 more than the year before. These firms were distributed as follows: Nova Scotia 1; New Brunswick 1; Quebec 551; Ontario 222; Manitoba 31; Saskatchewan 2; Alberta 6; and British Columbia 20. The heaviest concentrations of plants were in Montreal and Toronto. the two cities accounting for 81.8 per cent of the employment and for 83.2 per cent of the total value of factory shipments. Montreal continued to lead in both fields, with 21.407 employees and shipments valued at \$225,335,976, or 62,2 and 65.8 per cent of the Canada total, respectively. Toronto accounted for 6,518 employees and \$59,409,748 worth of shipments, 18.9 and 17.4 per cent, respectively. The standing of the two cities with regard to the number of persons employed and the value of factory sales, by sections, is given in the table at the top of the following page.

The Women's and Children's Clothing Industries are divided along commodity lines into six divisions, the principal statistics for which are presented in Table 2. The value of goods shipped in 1960 were reported by all six divisions as follows: women's dresses \$92,626,715; children's clothing \$73,835,896; women's coats and suits \$58,479,846; skirts, blouses, slacks and jackets \$59,897,041; lingerie \$38,543,471; and other outerwear \$18,977,274. As previously stated, the 1959 data presented in this table have not been revised.

Women's and Misses' wool coats regained their predominant commodity position in 1960 with shipments of 1,409,881 garments valued at \$36,872,717. Last year's leading product, women's and misses' rayon and rayon mixture dresses, was far behind with factory sales of 3,390,308 garments worth \$31,596,044. For further details see Table 3A.

In the 1960 survey, a special breakdown, introduced in 1959, was continued which requested the shipments of women's and misses' regular coats, of dresses (excluding housedresses) and of blouses by price range at the manufacturing level. This new enquiry covered the combined industries: the data will be found in Table 3B. It should be noted that only those shipments of these three commodities on which price data was obtained have been so presented, the residual shipments being shown as "undistributed by price range" in all cases.

Imports of clothing and furnishings increased by 2.1 per cent, from \$77,723,382 in 1959 to \$79,351,776 in 1960. Over the same two-year period exports rose substantially by 74.9 per cent from \$1,885,500 to \$3,298,630. The revised presentation of the import data, Table 4, should be noted.

Note on 1961—While the 1961 Census of Manufactures Survey, at the time of preparing this report, had just been started, data from other sources within the Bureau indicate the level of activity was about the same in 1961 as in the previous year. Based on a monthly sample survey, the value of factory shipments for the combined industries is estimated to have totalled \$344,163,000, an increase of 0.5 per cent from the 1960 figure. On the other hand, the 1961 retail sales of women's clothing (not including children's) was estimated to be slightly lower, 0.2 per cent, from the previous year's sales.

SECTION 2. WOMEN'S CLOTHING FACTORIES, 1960

For the 1960 survey, the Bureau implemented a revised Standard Industrial Classification one of the results of which was minor revisions to this industry as a scrutiny of the revised Principal Statistics for the years 1957 to 1959, inclusive (Table 8) will show. Because of these revisions, it has not been possible to publish the 1959 factory shipment data on the revised basis for the industry. However, wherever 1959 data are shown in this section, these are on the revised basis. The revised 1957 data have been shown where required, namely in Tables 17, 18, and 19.

The Women's Clothing Factories, formerly known as The Women's Factory Clothing Industry, is defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing suits, coats, dresses, skirts, blouses, household apparel, sportswear, underwear, lingerie and neckwear. Only "regular" factories making women's clothing are classified in this industry".

The Women's Clothing Factories in 1960 made shipments amounting to \$268,524,347 f.o.b. plant, \$6,933,243 or 2.7 per cent higher than the \$261,591,104 worth of goods shipped in 1959. Employment was greater, rising from 25,950 to 26,011 in the current year. Salary and wage payments also rose, from \$72,010,388 to \$73,125,069 in the year under review, an increase of 1.5 per cent. The total cost-of materials and supplies used in 1960, at \$141,660,936, was \$3,236,474, or 2.3 per cent, above the 1959 similar cost of \$138,424,462.

In 1960 this industry consisted of 648 establishments, eleven more than the year before. Their provincial distribution was: Nova Scotia 1; New Brunswick 1; Quebec 409; Ontario 184; Manitoba 25; Saskatchewan 2; Alberta 6; British Columbia 20. The location of 381 and 163, respectively, in Montreal and Toronto indicates the extent of con-

centration in those two cities. Montreal itself accounted for 61.7 per cent of the employment, and for 65.3 per cent of the total value of factory shipments.

The industry is comprised of five more or less distinct sections. The value of factory shipments from each of these segments in 1960 was as follows: dresses, \$92,626,715; coats and suits, \$58,479,846; skirts, blouses, slacks and jackets, \$59,897,041; lingerie, \$38,543,471; and other outerwear, \$18,977,274. From the foregoing it may readily be seen that the "dresses" section is much the largest with shipments amounting to 34.5 per cent of the grand total. Montreal, the centre of Canada's dress industry, reported sales of \$74,979,075, or 80.9 per cent of all the shipments of dresses. Comparable 1959 data are not available for the reasons given previously.

Table 14 gives, in as much detail as is possible and permissible, information on the industry's commodities. It will be seen that substantial quantities of children's garments are made by the Women's Clothing Factories. It will also be noted that statistics for a number of classifications cannot be given separately, because there are too few producers. There is a similar situation in the Children's Clothing Industry (see Table 24A). By combining the data of the two industries it has been found possible to publish detail in many more instances. These combined statistics are to be found in Table 3A.

Exports of women's clothing are not large in relation to the domestic market. Imports, on the other hand, represent a sizeable share of this market. Canadian trade classifications do not generally separate women's from children's clothing. For this reason, imports and exports of these two commodities are shown together in Section I, Tables 4 and 5.

SECTION 3. CHILDREN'S CLOTHING INDUSTRY, 1960

Although the Bureau has adopted a revised Standard Industrial Classification for the 1960 survey, there has been no change in this industry as can be seen from the scrutiny of the Principal Statistics in Table 20. The Children's Clothing Industry (Factories only), formerly known as The Children's Factory Clothing Industry, continues to be defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing children's and infants' dresses, coats, snow suits and other outerwear".

The Children's Clothing Industry in 1960 continued with its expansion, new records being established in both employment and output. Factory shipments during the year reached a total value of \$73,835,896, which was 5.5 per cent above the previous high of \$69,988,424 reported in 1959. Employment rose by 3.7 per cent, from 8,120 in 1959 to 8,424 in 1960. Salary and wage payments of \$19,129,940 in the year under review, were 5.0 per cent higher than the preceding year's \$18,217,996. The cost of materials used was also the highest ever, being up by 4.0 per cent to \$41,811,476 from the \$40,202,467 reported the year before.

In 1960 there were 186 establishments in this industry, 6 more than in 1959. These plants were confined to Quebec, with 142; Ontario, with 38; and Manitoba, 6. Three cities accounted for the bulk of this business. Montreal's 116 establishments shipped goods with a value of \$49,800,557, or 67.4 per cent of the total for the whole of the Dominion; Toronto was responsible for \$6,971,398, or 9.4 per cent; and Winnipeg for \$2,380,239, or 3.2 per cent.

Table 24A gives, in as much detail as is possible and permissible, information on the industry's commodities. It will be seen that substantial quantities of women's garments are made by the Children's Clothing Industry. It will also be noted that statistics for a number of classifications cannot be given separately, because there are too few producers. There is a similar situation for children's garments in the Women's Clothing Factories. By combining the data of the two industries it has been found possible to publish details in many more instances. These combined statistics are given in Table 3A.

Canadian trade classifications do not generally separate women's from children's clothing. For this reason imports and exports of the two commodities are shown in Section 1, Tables 4 and 5.

SECTION 4. WOMEN'S AND CHILDREN'S CLOTHING CONTRACTORS, 1960

Although the Bureau has adopted a revised Standard Industrial Classification for the 1960 survey, there has been no change in this industry as can be seen from the scrutiny of the Principal Statistics in Table 30. The Women's and Children's Clothing Contractors industry comprises the custom firms engaged in the activities as defined in Sections 1, 2, and 3, inclusive, of this report, i.e. those establishments not manufacturing on their own account.

In 1960, this industry was comprised of 169 establishments, of which 154 were in Quebec; 14 in Ontario; and 1 in Manitoba. The gross value of the work performed by these clothing contractors, \$10,993,650, was 13.0 per cent above the comparable 1959 figure of \$9,727,430. Employment was provided for 4,557 persons, 752 or 19.7 per

cent more than the 3,805 workers reported in 1959. Salary and wage payments of \$8,008,963 in 1960 were 17.5 per cent higher than the preceding year's disbursements of \$6,813,462. The cost of materials, supplied by the contractors themselves and consisting mostly of thread, buttons, etc., amounted to \$900,207, an increase of 10.6 per cent over the \$813,367 spent in 1959.

The majority of women's and children's clothing firms are to be found in Montreal. It follows, therefore, that there should be heavy concentration of clothing contractors in the same area. The value of the work performed by the contractors of this city in 1960 amounted to \$6,338,669, or 57.7 per cent of the total. They also accounted for 52.6 per cent of all employees, and for 55.8 per cent of the salary and wage payments within the whole industry.
