THE MISCELLANEOUS CLOTHING INDUSTRIES

1950

The miscellaneous clothing group of industries as delineated by the Standard Industrial Classification includes Corsets, Fur dressing and dyeing, Fur goods, Fabric gloves and mittens, Hats and caps, Oiled and waterproofed clothing and Miscellaneous clothing, n.e.s. The publications in which these industries are reported upon are listed on the opposite page under O.P.Q.R and S.

Fabric gloves and mittens is included with the report on Hosiery and Knitted goods in order

to bring fabric and knitted gloves together. Fur dressing and dyeing and Fur goods appear together in one report. There are separate reports for Corsets as well as Hats and caps.

The present report includes both Oiled and waterproofed clothing and Miscellaneous clothing, n.e.s., a residual grouping impossible to classify elsewhere.

Section 1. The Oiled and Waterproofed Clothing Industry, 1950

Production of the oiled and waterproofed clothing industry increased from \$3,906,089 in 1949 to \$4,204,902 in 1950. There was a greater production of waterproofed and shower-proofed coats but fewer wool coats and windbreakers were produced. The industry was almost entirely concerned with the domestic market and exports dropped from \$199,385 in 1949 to \$87,806 in 1950. Imports also dropped from \$265,932 in 1949 to \$212,933 in the year under review.

Production of the oiled and waterproofed clothing industry in 1950 represented a 7.6 per cent gain over 1949 and was accompanied by a rise in the cost of materials from \$1,987,702 in 1949 to \$2,149,227 in 1950, an increase of \$161,525 or 8 per cent. Employment was up from 439 in 1949 to 475 in 1950 and salaries and wages increased from \$798,473 in 1949 to \$919,973 a year later.

Of the 14 establishments in the industry, 10 were located in Quebec and 4 in Ontario. Quebec accounted for \$3,158,138 or 75 per cent of total

production of the industry and 69 per cent of the employment. On the basis of size the industry was dominated by seven firms each with a value of production in excess of \$100,000 and this group accounted for nearly 90 per cent of the total value of production. There was no large seasonal movement in the industry's employment and wage-earners varied from a high of 436 in March to a low of 392 in July.

The chief specified type of production in the industry in 1950 consisted of waterproofed and shower-proofed coats and output grew from 4,486 dozen valued at \$737,696 in 1949 to 7,075 dozen worth \$1,340,883 in 1950. There was also an increase in the production of rubberized and oiled coats from 3,838 dozen valued at \$186,726 in 1949 to 4,903 dozen valued at \$328,360 a year later. On the other hand wool coats decreased from 6,958 dozen valued at \$1,785,143 in 1949 to 3,688 dozen at \$1,142,180 in 1950 and windbreakers decreased from 2,770 dozen worth \$377,945 to 2,139 dozen valued at \$270,915 over the two years.

Section 2. The Miscellaneous Clothing Industry, N.E.S., 1950

The value of production of the miscellaneous clothing industry, n.e.s., rose from \$7,230,170 in 1949 to \$8,187,133 in 1950, an increase of \$956,963 or 13 per cent. This gain, however, was limited to dollar value and physical quantities of many items were less than in the previous year. In 1950 the industry produced fewer tailors' canvas fronts, 724,008 dozen compared with 919,418 dozen in 1949. At the same time the value of tailors' canvas fronts rose from \$2,331,163 in 1949 to \$2,359,023 in 1950. Shoulder pads were produced to the extent of 1,895,995 dozen valued at \$1,502,462 in 1950 compared with 1,911,457 dozen worth \$1,341,906 in 1949. Suspenders were recorded at 230,805 dozen worth \$1,078,680 in 1950 compared with 250,647 dozen valued at \$890,167 the previous year.

In 1950 there were 61 establishments in the industry compared with 58 the previous year. Employees increased from 1,257 in 1949 to 1,392 in 1950 and salaries and wages were up by \$323,324, from \$2,048,608 in 1949 to \$2,371,932 in 1950. The cost of materials increased from \$3,717,540 to \$4,269,989 over the two years, a rise of \$552,449 or 15 per cent.

The miscellaneous clothing industry, n.e.s., in 1950 was dominated by 35 establishments in Quebec, which produced goods to the value of \$5,527,086

and accounted for 67.5 per cent of the industry's total production and 69 per cent of total employment. From the point of view of size, 3 establishments each with an output between \$500,000 and \$1,000,000 accounted for 28 per cent of production and 12 establishments whose output varied between \$200,000 and \$500,000 accounted for 42 per cent of production. There was some seasonal variation in the industry's employment of wage-earners which varied from a high of 1,232 in October to a low of 1,072 in July.

Most of the items of production in the miscellaneous clothing industry, n.e.s. cannot be separately specified as they are produced by only one or two firms. In addition to the items already noted the industry produces significant quantities of safety clothing including aprons, coats, gloves, mitts, leggings, sleeves, miner's hat linings, face shields and asbestos pads. Belts were produced to the extent of 158,680 dozen worth \$622,741 in 1950 compared with 188,082 dozen worth \$633,130 in 1949. Armlets and sleeve supporters were produced to the extent of 58,260 dozen valued at \$78,175 in 1950 compared with 16,912 dozen valued at \$23,423 the previous year. Other items of production included academic caps, ties, scarves and mufflers, dress shields, utility cloths, plastic baby supplies, shoulder straps and girdles.
