

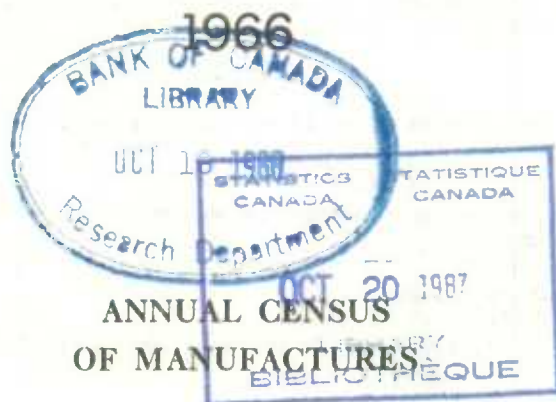

Section 1. Fabric Glove Manufacturers, 1966  
(S.I.C. 2491)

In terms of the revised Standard Industrial Classification and the New Establishment Concept, this industry is defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing fabric gloves".

The details of materials and supplies used in manufacturing are presented in Table 12, whereas Table 13 gives the shipments of goods of own manufacture by the industry. However, since fabric gloves are also made by other industries, the detail in the latter table has been somewhat abridged in order to show the shipments of these gloves by all industries in Table 14.

A list of the establishments classified to the industry in the 1966 survey will be found at the end of this section of the report.

In terms of the revised Standard Industrial Classification and the New Establishment Concept, this industry is defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing academic vests and gowns, theatrical costumes and other items of apparel not elsewhere classified".

No detailed information is collected on manufacturing materials and supplies used by this industry so that Table 12 presents these data with a minimum of breakdown. The shipments of goods of own manufacture by the industry are shown in Table 13. The shipments of certain goods of own manufacture by all Industries are shown in Table 14.

A list of the establishments classified to the industry in the 1966 survey will be found at the end of this section of the report.
