GENERAL REVIEW OF ALL TEXTILES

1949

The following report consists of a summary of the statistics of the entire textile industry in 1949 together with a list of total output of all textile products in Canada. In addition to the present report there is also published a general review of the clothing industries and a general review of all textiles except clothing.

The composition of the textile industrial group changed somewhat in the year under review. The introduction of the Standard Industrial Classification resulted in the addition of the fur goods and fur dressing and dyeing industries to the clothing group and the transfer of the fabric auto accessories industry from miscellaneous industries to miscellaneous textiles. Statistics in this report have been revised back to 1917 in accordance with this change. In addition flax fibre, reclassified to agricultural activity in 1949, has also been taken out of the 1948 statistics and consequently 1948 and 1947 are not comparable. It should also be noted that the 1949 statistics will include Newfoundland for the first time.

The gross value of production of the entire textile industry rose from \$1,314,635,037 in 1948 to \$1,364,322,966 in 1949, a gain of nearly 3.8 per cent or \$49,687,929. Reports were received from 3,905 textile establishments compared with 3,822 the previous year. They furnished employment to 195,525 persons or 4,604 more than the 190,921 persons employed in 1948. Salaries and wages were up by 8.9 per cent from \$332,868,616 in 1948 to \$362,679,336 in 1949. The cost of materials used was \$710,773,783 in 1949, an increase of \$17,613,723 or 2.5 per cent over the previous year's figure of \$693,160,060. The value added by manufacture was \$638,382,603 in 1949 compared with \$606,803,351 in 1948.

The 1949 gross value of production represented 10.9 per cent of the gross output of all manufacturing industries. The scope of the industry may also be suggested by the fact that 44.6 per cent of all women wage-earners in manufacturing in 1949 were to be found in the textile industries. Future expansion of these industries was indicated in the continued high level of investment which in 1949 involved approximately \$46,000,000 for new capital expenditures and over \$25,000,000 for repair and maintenance expenditures.

The overall gains in 1949 were achieved in the face of serious difficulties and conflicting trends. In general, the industry faced rising costs of material and labour and sold its products in an extremely competitive market. From the beginning of the year exports began to decline as foreign lending programs came to a close. After April 1, the 25 per cent increase in United States dollar quotas tended to stimulate the importation of cotton piece goods. Following devaluation, Canadian wage rates were sometimes as much as 245 per cent higher than their United Kingdom counterparts. While high prices of natural fibres were somewhat offset by an alternative use of synthetics, the adjustment involved problems of renewing equipment, uncertain buying and unknown consumer reaction. Moreover, negotiations at the Annecy Conference suggested further uncertainties in regard to tariff policy. Canadians in 1949 were among the world's largest consumers of fabrics and yarns and Canada also ranked first in per capita consumption of woollen goods and first as an importer of cotton textiles. On the other hand it was found that textile sales had not risen in proportion to overall increases in population and purchasing power, due to the pronounced tendency of consumers to allocate a greater share of their income to durable goods such as automobiles, household machinery and home furnishings.

The general expansion of the textile industry in 1949 by no means applies equally to its various components. While the clothing industry recorded solid gains, the hosiery and knitted goods industry suffered a 10 per cent reduction in employment and production. The woollen industry, too, did little more than hold its own in the altered circumstances following devaluation. On the other hand cotton textiles continued their growth and synthetic textiles established gains of over 15 per cent. In the tables immediately preceding are given employment and gross value of production totals for the leading industries of the textile groups for the years 1939, 1942, 1948 and 1949. The order of presentation is established by the gross value of production in 1949. It should be noted that "Women's and children's factory clothing" are now treated as two industries but are brought together here for comparative purposes. The same is true for "Hosiery and knitted goods".

The provinces of Quebec and Ontario dominated in the field of textile manufacturing. In 1949, Quebec accounted for \$759,239,247 or 55.6 per cent of the gross value of total textile production and 109,023 or 55.8 per cent of total employees in the industry. In the same year Ontario accounted for \$501,381,800 or 36.7 per cent of production and 70,981 or 36.3 per cent of employees.

The gross value of production of the entire textile industry was divided into \$727,498,836 for clothing (textile and fur) and \$636,824,130 for

textiles except clothing. In the clothing group Quebec accounted for a value of production of \$410,747,691 or 56.5 per cent of the total and Ontario for \$249,185,397 or 34.2 per cent of the total. In the group comprising textiles except clothing, Quebec dominated with a gross value of production of \$348,491,556 or 54.7 per cent of the total and Ontario reported \$252,196,403 or 39.6 per cent.

Total employment in the textile industry comprised 25,724 salaried workers who were paid \$81,253,194 and 169,801 wage-earners who received \$281,426,142. Of these wage-earners 73,024 were male and 96,777 were female. The monthly employment of all wage-earners in the textile industry varied from a high of 174,724 in March to a low of 163,781 in July.

The Canadian textile industry was becoming more deeply rooted in and more dependent upon the domestic economy. Total imports of fibres, textiles and textile products declined from \$390,589,069 in 1947 to \$350,619,180 in 1948 and finally \$333,031,836 in 1949. Exports of fibres, textiles, and textile products declined from \$49,347,319 in 1947 to \$45,553,909 in 1948 and finally \$25,217,322 in 1949. Exports of textiles to Commonwealth Countries declined from \$20,719,891 in 1948 to \$8,511,887 in 1949. Finally, a drastic decline was shown in the exports of cotton and manufactures of cotton to all countries, from a value of \$10,232,951 in 1948 to \$5,168,937 in 1949.
