# GENERAL REVIEW OF ALL TEXTILES

## 1952

The year 1952 was one of widely fluctuating activity in the Canadian textile industry. Strongly contrasting levels obtained for different periods of the year with the various sections of the industry experiencing changes varying in direction and degree.

To begin with, quite contrasting results rewarded the endeavours of the two industrial groups which comprise the textile industry. The output of textiles except clothing fell from \$846,477,303 in 1951 to \$744,141,645 in 1952, a drop of \$102,335,658 or 12.1 per cent whereas the output of the clothing group rose from \$780,012,025 to \$853,151,206, a gain of \$74,139,181 or about 9 per cent.

For textiles except clothing it was a difficult year. The outbreak of war in Korea in June, 1950, was followed by a period of intense activity. The fear of shortages and increased prices gave rise to inventory accumulation of textiles at all levels. When the threatened shortages failed to develop the demand for textiles fell off abruptly necessitating a sharp curtailment in manufacturing. The recession which began about mid-1951 continued into 1952 reaching its worst point in May. This textile group began to recover in August and by year end was operating at a relatively satisfactory level. For the year as a whole, however, activity was 12 per cent lower than in 1951 and 9 per cent below the average of the past three years. Cotton textiles, the largest component of textiles except clothing, reported a gross value of production of \$246,397,090 in 1952 compared with \$297,285,085 in 1951, a drop of 17 per cent. The output of the wool textiles fell by 21 per cent from \$192,217,597 to \$150,935,470 and synthetic textiles and silk by 5 per cent from \$166,549,897 to \$157,628,515.

The clothing group on the other hand operated at record level. Several of the industries, notably the knitted goods, reported activity somewhat below 1951 but for the group as whole it was a banner year. Like textiles except clothing, the clothing industries entered 1952 in a state of recession. Recovery, however, began much earlier (about February) and activity became progressively higher throughout the remainder of the year. By December employment was 11 per cent above the 1951 level for the month and well above the average for the past three years. Men's, women's and children's factory clothing industries accounted for the major portion of the advance made by the clothing group in 1952. Their combined output rose from \$482,176,234 in 1951 to \$550,054,898 in the year under review, a 14 per cent gain. The children's factory clothing industry reported an impressive 25 per cent growth. The knitted goods suffered a fairly substantial drop in production while the miscellaneous clothing industries enjoyed a nice gain.

The value of output of the textile industry as a whole decreased from \$1,626,489,328 in 1951 to \$1,597,292,851 in 1952, a drop of less than 2 per cent. Employment fell from 197,443 in the former year to 190,407 in the latter while salaries and wages rose from \$407,395,436 to \$419,229,138 over the two years. The cost of materials used was \$900,651,220 in 1951 compared with \$862,479,114 in 1952.

A summary of the comparative record of the various sections of the textile industry for 1951 and 1952 is given in the following table. Separate summary reports are published on the two principal textile classifications. These are entitled "General Review of Textiles Except Clothing" and "General Review of the Clothing Industries".

The textile industry occupies an important position in manufacturing in Canada. Table 1 shows that in 1952 it accounted for 10.4 per cent of the number of establishments, 10.3 per cent of salaried employees, 15.9 per cent of wage-earners, 9.4 per cent of materials used and 9.4 per cent of total output. It is interesting to note, also, that the textile industries provide employment for a large number of female workers. Out of a total of 215,295 female wage-earners engaged in the manufacturing industries in Canada in the year under review, 93,382 or 43.4 per cent were to be found in textiles.

The Provinces of Ontario and Quebec dominate in the field of textile manufacturing. In 1952, Quebec accounted for 55.8 per cent of the gross value of production and 57.1 per cent of the employment given. The comparable percentages for Ontario were 36.7 and 34.9. Principal Statistics by economic area, by industry, are published for the two principal textile classifications in the two summary reports mentioned earlier.

A principal feature of this report is a detailed list of textile products for 1951 and 1952. Table 3 shows the total Canadian output of textile products and hence includes commodities reported by all firms no matter what their industrial classification.

Tables in this report on exports and imports give recent trends in terms of fibres and by degree of manufacture. The data in each case is divided to show the relative importance of the United States and the United Kingdom. In 1952 total imports of fibres, textiles and products amounted to \$359,440,017 of which \$197,369,463 came from the United States and \$86,431,634 from the United Kingdom. Total exports of fibres, textiles and products amounted to \$27,696,811 in 1952 of which \$17,441,531 went to the United States and \$1,013,187 to the United Kingdom.

Investment figures for the textile and clothing industries given in Table 10 indicate a decrease in 1952 from the previous year for both groups. New investment for textiles except clothing comprised \$24.1 million for machinery and equipment and \$6.8 million for construction. Clothing investment comprised \$11.1 million for machinery and equipment and \$1.6 million for construction.

Table 16 dealing with prices of fibres, textiles and textile products shows a steady decline in all sections in 1952. The wide variations which char-

acterized 1951, particularly in wool and cotton prices, were not present in this later year. Prices of cotton yarn and cotton fabrics were fairly stable throughout the year, being only 8 per cent and 3 per cent lower respectively in December than in January. A factor behind these reductions was the 21 per cent fall in the price of U.S. raw cotton over the period. Rayon yarn fell 10 per cent in price in February and then remained stable throughout the rest of the year while rayon fabric remained unchanged from May on after falling 16 per cent in the first 5 months of the year. The downward trend in raw wool and wool cloth prices which began in 1951 persisted well into 1952. Woollen cloth prices fell by 12 per cent from January to August, remained at the same level in September, and then rose very slightly from then until December. Raw wool prices declined until April at which time revival in the woollen goods industry at home and abroad reversed the trend. During the year the index of textile clothing prices fell by 5.3 per cent while the clothing component of the consumer price index fell by 4.5 per cent (114.9 to 109.7).

In addition to the data which has been specifically mentioned in the text, this report contains Tables covering size of establishment distribution, inventories, shipments, etc.

In 1952 the value of shipments f.o.b. plant was collected instead of gross value of production for all the industries covered by this report with the exception of the cotton, wool and synthetic textile industries. The latter three industries will be converted to shipments in 1953. These changes are in line with the Bureau's decision to convert the basis of its manufacturing to shipments instead of production. The changeover is expected to provide increased ease in reporting for the majority of plants while at the same time producing more reliable, more meaningful statistics in many cases.

The inventory change in finished goods between year ends represents an insignificant percentage of total production for the textile industries converted to shipments in 1952. Factory shipments for these industries closely approximate production and their value added to the value of production of the cotton, wool and synthetic textile industries gives a total which is reasonably comparable with the gross value of production figures for earlier years. It has, therefore, been considered unnecessary to differentiate between shipments and production in compiling 1952 figures and the totals have been designated production.

#### Consumption of Apparel Fibres in Canada

Several years ago the Nylon Division of Canadian Industries commenced a study of trends in the consumption of apparel fibres in Canada. The Bureau was asked to co-operate in this survey and did so willingly for it had long recognized the need for research of this nature and had intended undertaking just such a study when time and staff permitted. A table showing the total apparent consumption of apparel-type fibres in Canada from 1926-1950 was the first important product of the study. Data for the years 1951 and 1952 have since been prepared by the company and added to the Table. Because of its usefulness as background material for textile research, it is presented here with the kind permission of Canadian Industries Limited.

The figures shown in the table represent the volume of fibres as they enter final consumption in all textile uses. Consumption by products measured subsequent to the spinning process is calculated on an actual weight basis while consumption by products measured prior to the spinning process is calculated on a spinnable fibre content basis. The "spinnable fibre" concept denotes the volume of fibre which is actually consumed in textile uses and excludes that volume which is removed as waste or relegated to non-textile applications. Total Apparent Consumption is defined as domestic production, plus imports, less exports.


