

#### THE OILED AND WATERPROOFED CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1938.

In 1938 reports were received from 13 establishments whose principal output consisted of ciled and waterproofed clothing. The location of these establishments was as follows: Quebec 8, Ontario 3, and Nova Scotia 2. To avoid disclosure of information concerning individual establishments, statistics for Nova Scotia and Ontario have been combined.

The oiled and waterproofed clothing industry reported a gross value of production of \$1,178,307 in 1938 and this represented a decrease of \$369,462 or nearly 24 per cent from the 1937 total. Employment was given to 349 persons, 90 persons or 20 per cent less than in 1937, and they were paid in salaries and wages the sum of \$264,462 which was \$77,697 or 22 per cent less than the amount so disbursed in 1937. Materials used in 1938 cost \$758,902 a decrease of \$194,071 or 20 per cent, while capital invested declined by \$108,651 or 14 per cent.

The principal single item of production was "rubberized coats" which were made to the extent of 8,861 dozen with a value at the factory of \$342,085. "Windbreakers and leather jackets" with a production of 6,523 dozen valued at \$294,090 came next in order of importance.

Detailed statistics covering the quantities and cost of the various materials entering into the manufacture of oiled and waterproofed clothing are not collected. The total costs are shown by provinces in Table 1.

Imports of clothing and raincoats of India rubber or of waterproofed cotton fabrics were valued at only \$100,160 in 1938, whereas exports of clothing (rubber), including waterproofed, amounted to \$453,151.




