

THE OILED AND WATERPROOFED CLOTHING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1942

In 1942 reports were received from 12 establishments whose principal output consisted of oiled and waterproofed clothing. The location of these establishments was as follows: Quebec 7, and Ontario 5.

The oiled and waterproofed clothing industry reported a gross value of production of \$5,274,534 in 1942, an increase of \$773,576 or 17 per cent over the 1941 output. Employment was furnished to 1,084 persons who received \$1,144,408 in salaries and wages. Materials used had a laid down value at the factory of \$3,171,757 while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$2,079,354.

Due to the undiminished demands by the armed forces for oiled and water-proofed clothing and equipment of all kinds, the industry continued to operate at a high level of production, and exceeded to some extent the output of the previous year. Compared with 1941, there were increases of 17 per cent in the gross value of production, 7 per cent in the number of persons employed, 22 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid, and 18 per cent in the value added by manufacture. Detailed statistics of the products made by this industry are given in Table 4.

Detailed statistics covering the quantities and cost of the various materials entering into the manufacture of oiled and water-proofed clothing are not collected. The total costs are, however, shown by provinces in Table 1.
