The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has completed a preliminary report on the Men's Furnishing Goods industry for the calendar year 1919, covering the operations of 88 individual establishments distributed by location in the following provinces:- Ontario, 40; Quebec, 34; Manitoba, 9; British Columbia, 3; Alberta and Nova Scotia 1 each.

Capital Investment.



Other Labour Statistics.

The working time in all establishments in the industry totalled 23,985 days on full time and 4,632 on part time, leaving 1,435 days on which some plants were idle. The average of mills working on full or part time was approximately 287 days and on idle time 17 days. The average working time per day was 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours and the average per week 49 hours.
