THE MEN'S FURNISHING GOODS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.

The operations of 167 establishments engaged in the manufacture of men's furnishings were reported in 1931, this being an increase of nine over the preceding year. They reported a gross value of production of \$20,978,478 which was a decrease of \$4,175,832 or 16.6 per cent from 1930. The amount of capital investment, \$16,649,101, also represents a decrease of \$947,911 or 5.4 per cent. Employment was furnished to 8,139 persons who were paid \$5,787,221 in salaries and wages, and in comparison with 1930 these figures represented decreases of 826 or 9.2 per cent in the number of persons and \$650,497 or 10.2 per cent in the salaries and wages. The cost of raw materials, \$11,534,873, dropped \$3,256,036 or 22.0 per cent while the value added by manufacture showed a decline of \$919,796 or 8.9 per cent. The following table illustrates by provinces the variations in the principal statistics in 1931 in comparison with 1930.

Of the 167 establishments reporting in 1931, seventy-three were located in Quebec, sixty in Ontario, fifteen in Manitoba, eleven in British Columbia, three in Alberta, two each in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and one in Saskatchewan. The following table shows the percentage distribution of the principal statistics in the various provinces.

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It should be borne in mind that the statistics published in this report include only those of manufacturers whose principal products are men's furnishings. Statistics relating to specific products such as shirts, overalls, underwear, neckwear, pyjamas, pants, etc., are not to be regarded as comprehensive, since they are also produced in the Men's and Women's Factory Clothing, Hosiery and Knitted Goods, Silk and other industries.

The largest single item in the list of products in 1931 was fine shirts of which 476,314 dozen valued at \$5,456,343 were produced. The average price per dozen was \$11.46. Production in 1930 was 439,418 dozen valued at \$6,371,539, an average of \$14.50 per dozen. 312,588 dozen work shirts valued at \$2,552,526 were also produced in 1931, an average of \$8.17 per dozen, while in the year 1930 the corresponding figures were 308,406 dozen worth \$3,134,226, an average of \$10.16 per dozen. Overalls, overall coats, etc., were valued at \$3,451,206 in 1931 and \$4,137,332 in 1930. Neckwear, including scarves and mufflers which was an important item in 1931 saw 497,825 dozen produced with a value of \$2,358,331. In 1930 the production was 415,795 dozen worth \$2,773,744.

Other important items produced in 1931 were working pants and breeches, woollen and cotton \$1,310,693; underwear \$623,154; pyjamas \$758,897 and collars and cuffs \$428,612.

Detailed statistics covering materials used were collected in 1931 for the first time in several years. The principal item in this category was cotton fabrics, including duck, drill and denim, of which 42,132,775 yards costing \$7,505,704 was used. Other fabrics used (wool, silk, artificial silk, linen, etc.), account for \$2,240,370. The cost of all fabrics amounted to \$9,746,074 and accounted for almost 85 per cent of the total cost of all materials used.

By referring to table 6 it will be observed that six establishments accounted for \$6,065,832 or 28.9 per cent of the total value of production, seven establishments supplied \$7,571,114 or 45.5 per cent of the total capital investment and seven establishments furnished employment to 2,552 persons or 31.3 per cent of the total employees.

Imports and exports are relatively small in this industry. Imports in 1931 were valued at \$1,192,373, compared with a valuation of \$1,966,182 in 1930. The value of exports amounted to \$12,319 in 1931 and \$22,081 in 1930.
