### THE MEN'S FURNISHING GOODS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

A total of 153 establishments whose principal output consisted of men's furnishing goods and wearing apparel reported their production in 1932, this value being \$17,607,656, a decrease of \$3,370,822 or 16.1 per cent from the 1931 valuation. There was also a decrease of fourteen in the number of establishments reporting.

This industry showed a recession in every phase of its manufacturing activities in 1932 in comparison with 1931, and the totals of the principal statistics for the former year, together with the amount of decreases are shown herewith.

Capital investment, \$13,880,827, showed a decrease of \$2,768,274 or 16.6 per cent. Employees, salaried and otherwise, 7,565, a decrease of 574 persons or seven per cent, salaries and wages, \$4,969,615, a decrease of \$817,606 or fourteen per cent, cost of materials used, \$9,653,947, a decrease of \$1,880,926 or 16.3 per cent, and the value added by manufacture, \$7,953,709, a decrease of \$1,489,896 or 15.8 per cent. These variations in the principal statistics in 1932 in comparison with 1931 are shown herewith, by provinces.

It will be observed from the foregoing table that the province of Manitoba was the only one to show a gain in manufacturing in 1932, it having slight increases in the number of employees, the cost of materials and the value of output.

The 153 establishments reporting in 1932 were distributed by provinces at follows: Quebec sixty nine, Ontario fifty, Manitoba seventeen, British Columbia eleven, Alberta three, New Brunswick two and Nova Scotia one. The percentage distribution of the principal statistics for 1931 and 1932 is shown by provinces in the following table.

It should be borne in mind that the statistics published in this report include only those of manufacturers whose principal products are men's furnishings. Statistics relating to specific products such as shirts, overalls, underwear, neckwear, pyjamas, pants, etc., are not to be regarded as comprehensive, since they are also produced in the men's and women's factory clothing, hosiery and knitted goods, silk and other industries.

The manufacture of shirts leads all other articles turned out by this industry, and in 1932 the output was 671,008 dozen valued at \$6,636,058. Overalls of all kinds constitutes another important item. The total production for both 1931 and 1932 has been listed in table 3 in as detailed a manner as possible without disclosing the operations of less than three establishments.

Statistics covering materials used were not collected in detail in 1932. The cost of them is shown, by provinces, in table 1.

The amount of capital invested in the industry decreased by \$2,768,274, all of it in the working capital. Fixed capital, as a matter of fact, increased from \$4,713,959 in 1931 to \$4,974,766 in 1932.

By referring to table 5, it will be observed that the production of nineteen establishments was valued at \$9,146,228 or 51.9 per cent of the total output, that twenty-six establishments supplied \$9,571,291 or 68.9 per cent of the total capital investment and forty-two establishments furnished employment to 5,613 persons, 74.2 per cent of the total number employed.

The number of wage-earners employed in this industry decreased from 7,357 in 1931 to 6,883 in 1932. October with 7,063 employees was the month of maximum employment in 1932 and January with 6,397 was the minimum. In 1931, May with 7,731 was the maximum and January with 6,826 was the minimum.

Imports of furnishing goods had practically the same value in both 1931 and 1932, with \$1,192,373 in the former year and \$1,106,693 in the latter.

Exports, however, decreased from \$12,319 in 1931 to \$1,858 in 1932.
