THE MEN'S FURNISHING GOODS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1934.

In 1934 reports were received from 172 establishments whose principal output was men's and boys' furnishings, which was an increase of nine over the number reporting in 1933.

This industry has shown appreciable improvement during the year under review. The gross value of production increased by \$2,629,577 or more than 13 per cent over the production of 1933, while the capital invested also increased by \$339,810 or a little over 2 per cent. During the year the number of persons given employment increased by 484 or almost 6 per cent, and their total remuneration was \$464,173 or 9.5 per cent greater than in 1933. There was also an increase in the cost of materials used which advanced by \$2,074,75? or more than 19 per cent, and the value added by manufacture increased by \$554,820 or approximately 6.6 per cent.

Although establishments in this industry are located in all provinces with the exception of Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan, the industry is mainly centered the provinces of Quebec and Ontario. The factories located in the Province of Quebec accounted for 42.1 per cent of the total capital invested, 49.7 per cent of the employees, 42.9 per cent of the total salaries and wages paid, and 45.5 per cent of the gross production, while in the Ontario establishments was invested 43.1 per cent of the capital, and employment was given to 33.1 per cent of the employees who received 38.5 per cent of the total salaries and wages. Ontario factories produced 36.1 per cent of the total value of the output.

The distribution of the 172 establishments reporting in 1934 was as follows: -Quebec seventy-three, Ontario sixty-five, Manitoba sixteen, British Columbia twelve, Alberta three, New Brunswick two and Nova Scotia one.

The principal item of production of this industry in 1934 was men's and boys' shirts to the value of \$7,890,416 of which \$5,477,155 represented the factory value of fine shirts and \$2,413,261 the value of work shirts. Next in importance was overalls and smocks to the value of \$3,527,876, followed by neckties \$2,019,978, working pants and breeches \$1,685,448 and pyjamas at \$1,103,274. Further detailed information on production is given in table 3.

The imports of men's furnishings during 1934 amounted to \$1,074,538 or \$48,423 higher than in the previous year. Handkerchiefs to the value of \$1,029,816 were the chief item of import.

Exports in this industry were very small, and in 1934 consisted mainly of braces and suspenders which went to the United Kingdom, Newfoundland and the British West Indies.


