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ADVANCE REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES OF CANADA, 1931.

With two exceptions, the various industries comprising the textile group of industries showed a recession in gross value of production in 1931. These two exceptions were woollen cloth which had an increased production of \$757,861 or 6.1 per cent and the silk and artificial silk industry with an increase of \$378,894 or 2.1 per cent in its output. While cotton textiles, n.e.s., appear to show an increase, this is due solely to the inclusion of twelve establishments which were grouped elsewhere in 1930.

Reports were received from 1,955 establishments in the textile industries in 1931, an increase of sixty-nine over the number reporting in 1930. They reported a gross value of production of \$317,158,670, a decline of \$44,656,063 or 12.4 per cent from the previous year. This, however, was largely caused by the lower values of raw materials and finished products, for the index of the physical volume declined only by 2.2 per cent from 105.6 in 1930 to 103.2 in 1931. (In this instance, the year 1926 is taken as the base of 100). The amount of capital invested in 1931 amounted to \$352,344,073, a decrease of \$16,223,570 or 4.4 per cent. There were 105,473 persons employed who were paid \$92,504,088 in salaries and wages and in comparison with 1930 these figures represented decreases of 4,103 or 3.7 per cent in the number of persons and \$5,399,088 or 5.5 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages. The cost of raw and other materials used dropped to \$153,191,375, a loss of \$31,372,490 or 17.0 per cent, while the value added by manufacture, \$163,967,295, declined by \$13,283,573 or 7.5 per cent.

The following table illustrates by industries and provinces the variations in the principal statistics in 1931 in comparison with 1930. Increases are denoted by a (+) sign and decreases by a (-) sign.

The province of Quebec led in the production of textiles and textile products in 1931 with a gross value of \$149,947,453. The leading industry was that of cotton yarn and cloth with an output valued at \$30,749,771. The output valuation of other important industries was women's factory clothing \$28,755,336, men's factory clothing \$20,578,471, hosiery and knitted goods \$12,875,158, silk, artificial silk and products \$12,425,851 and men's furnishing goods \$10,205,807.

The gross value of production in Ontario in 1931 was \$141,218,804 with the hosiery and knitted goods industry leading with a gross value of \$32,132,789. Other industries of importance were women's factory clothing with an output of \$22,350,751, men's factory clothing \$12,492,251 and woollen cloth \$10,555,654.

In the Maritime Provinces, the gross value of production amounted to \$7,777,274 and the output of cotton yarn and cloth was valued at \$2,752,439. The hosiery and knitted goods industry had a production valued at \$2,021,240, while the value of work performed in the dyeing, cleaning and laundry industry was \$1,216,178.

In Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the gross value of production amounted to \$12,566,317. The dyeing, cleaning and laundry industry led with a value of work performed amounting to \$3,397,617. The production of men's furnishing goods accounted for \$2,609,299, while women's factory clothing had an output valued at \$2,287,798 and the production of cotton and jute bags was valued at \$2,723,128.

In British Columbia and the Yukon, the gross value of production was valued at \$5,648,822, the dominant industry being dyeing, cleaning and laundry work with a value of work performed amounting to \$2,502,710. The production of men's furnishing goods and women's factory clothing accounted for \$604,390 and \$591,325, respectively.

Detailed statistics covering the value of production, capital, employment, etc., by economic areas and industries are shown in table 5. Table 6 gives an alphabetical list of products manufactured in the textile industries, while table 7 makes a comparison of the gross value of production of these industries in 1930 and 1931.

The amount of capital invested in the textile industries in Canada in 1931 amounted to \$352,344,073 and is shown in detail in table 8. In this year, the total amount of capital invested decreased by \$16,223,570 from the 1930 investment of \$368,567,643.

Imports of fibres, textiles and textile products were valued at \$90,151,516 in 1931, a decrease of \$58,998,428 or 39.5 per cent from the 1930 value of \$149,149,944. Imports from the United Kingdom amounted to \$31,966,128, while from the British Empire, including the United Kingdom, the value was \$35,438,456. The corresponding figures for 1930 were United Kingdom \$56,396,963 and British Empire \$61,590,197. Imports from the United States were valued at \$35,017,342 in 1931 and \$55,121,535 in 1930, while from all other countries the importations were \$23,168,046 in 1931 and \$37,631,446 in 1930.

Exports of fibres, textiles and textile products manufactured in Canada in 1931 were valued at \$5,394,084 which was a decrease of \$1,908,012 or 26.1 per cent from the value in 1930 amounting to \$7,302,096. Of these exports, \$1,284,772 went to the United Kingdom and \$2,918,302 were to the British Empire, including the United Kingdom. In 1930, exports to the United Kingdom alone were \$1,064,976 with \$3,772,534 going to the British Empire. Exports to the United States in 1931 amounted to \$1,790,005 as against a value in 1930 of \$2,481,990. To all other countries, the value in 1931 was \$2,319,307 against a corresponding value in 1930 of \$3,755,130.
