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ADVANCE REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES OF CANADA, 1932.

From the standpoint of value of production, the Canadian textile group of industries showed further recessions in both 1931 and 1932. The yearly position of this industry, measured by its principal statistics, is shown in table 2, and it will be observed that in 1920, during a period of inflated values of raw materials and cost of manufacturing, the value of production reached its peak. A considerable decline occurred in the following year, but from then on the industry slowly and steadily resumed its upward climb until it reached its second peak in 1929 when all principal statistics, with the exception of the cost of materials and the gross value of production, showed the highest valuations in the history of the industry. Since 1929, however, the trend of production has been downward in both value and volume. In the latter case, taking the year 1926 as the base of 100, the index of volume of production declined from 114.9 in 1928 to 103.2 in 1931 and 98.5 in 1932.

Of the three basic commodities of this industry, cotton, wool and silk, the latter, both real and artificial, was the only one in 1932 to show any increase over the previous year. While some industries composing the woollen group were able to report slight increases in 1932, they were, however, more than offset by losses sustained in others. Generally, therefore, it can be stated that the cotton and woollen groups of industries, including the hosiery and knitted goods, the clothing and garment trades, all showed heavy declines in 1932 in comparison with the previous year.

COMPARISON OF PRINCIPAL STATISTICS. -- In 1932 reports were received from 2,002 establishments comprising the Canadian textile group of industries, which represented an increase of forty-seven over the number reporting in 1931. Their gross value of production amounted to \$274,411,736, the lowest valuation reported since 1918, and \$42,746,934 or 13.5 per cent below the 1931 valuation.

The total amount of capital invested in the industries was \$321,593,062, which also represented a decrease of \$30,751,011 or 8.7 per cent. The industries furnished employment to 102,116 persons, a decrease of 3,357 persons or 3.2 per cent from the previous year, while the salary and wage bill, amounting to \$82,817,944, also declined by \$9,686,144 or 10.5 per cent. The cost of all materials used, raw and partly manufactured, totalled \$129,468,738, which was \$23,722,637 or 15.5 per cent less than the 1931 cost, and the value added by manufacture, \$144,942,998, represented a decline of \$19,024,297 or 11.6 per cent.

The actual variations in the principal statistics of 1932 and 1931 are shown in the following table, by industries and provinces. An increase is denoted by a / sign and a decrease by a - sign.

PROVINCIAL DISTRIBUTION OF THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES. - The 2,002 establishments engaged in the production of textiles and textile products were located by provinces as follows: - Prince Edward Island 3, Nova Scotia 44, New Brunswick 34, Quebec 802, Ontario 862, Manitoba 97, Saskatchewan 19, Alberta 39, British Columbia 100 and the Yukon 2.

A table follows herewith showing the percentage distribution of the principal statistics for 1931 and 1932, by provinces, and it will be observed that in 1932 over ninety-one per cent of the entire industry was concentrated in Ontario and Quebec. The dyeing and finishing of textiles, and the dyeing, cleaning and laundry industries are included in the textile group, and if the latter industry was omitted concentration of all other textile industries in Ontario and Quebec would be even more noticeable.

VALUE OF PRODUCTION. - By referring to tables 4(a) and (b), it will be observed that in 1932 the hosiery and knitted goods industry had the highest value of production, displacing the women's factory clothing industry which had led in this regard for a number of years. It will also be noted that both of them showed a considerable reduction from 1931. In table 6, it will also be noted that the only industries to show increases in production in 1932 over 1931 were: woollen cloth, with an increase of \$22,263; woollen yarn, \$45,270; silk and artificial silk products, \$1,677,351 and corsets \$80,024. This table shows the value of production in each industry for 1931 and 1932 and also the actual and percentage variations. In comparing the total of the major groups for the two years, all of them, with the exception of silk showed decreases, some of them quite substantial. It will also be noted that a new industry is included in 1932 for the first time, that of clothing contractors.

Table 5 shows the principal statistics by economic areas and provinces in 1932. In the Maritime Provinces, cotton yarn and cloth had a production valuation of \$2,512,403 and hosiery and knitted goods \$2,064,884. The total value of production was \$7,050,432. These two industries, therefore, accounted for \$4,577,287 or 64.9 per cent of the total valuation.

In Quebec, the total value of output was \$131,178,148. Cotton yarn and cloth also headed the list in this province with an output valued at \$26,974,004. Next in order of valuation was women's factory clothing with \$23,193,839, followed by men's factory clothing with \$16,596,356, silk and artificial silk had an output of \$13,844,989, while that of hosiery and knitted goods was \$11,727,858. The aggregate value of production of these five leading industries was \$95,337,046 or 71.2 per cent of the value of production of textiles and textile products in Quebec in 1932.

Ontario had a production valued at \$120,109,717 in 1932, the hosiery and knitted goods industry leading with \$28,602,549. The production of women's factory clothing amounted to \$17,189,140, silk and artificial silk \$10,345,539, men's factory

clothing \$9,676,659 and cotton yarn and cloth \$9,068,963. These five leading industries had a total production valued at \$74,882,850, which was 62.3 per cent of Ontario's total of textiles and textile products in 1932.

Statistics of the three Prairie Provinces, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, have been combined in order that their industries might be shown in more detail. They had a total value of production of \$11,197,688, the dyeing, cleaning and laundry work industry heading the list with a value of work performed worth \$2,755,006. This industry was closely followed by the men's furnishing goods which had a production valued at \$2,723,048. Cotton and jute bags were produced to the value of \$2,478,855 in this area, while the manufacture of women's factory clothing was worth \$1,719,460. The output of the four industries was valued at \$6,676,369 or 86.4 per cent of the total.

The laundry, dyeing and dry cleaning industry is the most important in British Columbia and the Yukon with a value of work performed amounting to \$2,038,306 or 41.8 per cent of the total output valuation of \$4,875,751. The output of men's furnishing goods was valued at \$470,730, women's factory clothing \$379,617 and awnings, tents and sails \$199,262. The textile industry of the Yukon consists of two laundries which are grouped with those of British Columbia in order to avoid disclosing individual figures.

Since the main items of production in some industries are also produced as secondary ones in others, it is not always possible, therefore, in reviewing a report to obtain the complete Canadian production of specific articles. In the women's factory clothing industry for instance, the report for which is compiled from the statistics of firms whose principal production consists of factory clothing and ready-to-wear apparel for women, articles of men's wear, men's furnishings, etc., are also manufactured as by-products. Similarly, articles of women's apparel will be found to be important though secondary articles of production in the men's factory clothing, the men's furnishing goods, hosiery and knitted goods, silk and other industries.

A separate table (No. 7), has been compiled showing the total Canadian production of all articles produced by manufacturers of textiles and textile products. This is excepted, of course, in instances where the publishing of these figures would disclose the operations of individual establishments.

VOLUME OF PRODUCTION. - The index of the physical volume of production of textiles and textile products shows an increase of 16.0 per cent since 1923. The following table with its base of 1923 equalling 100, taken in conjunction with table 8 which has 1926 as the base of 100, illustrates fully the variations in the volume of production between the years 1923 and 1932 inclusive. It will be noted that tremendous advances have been made in the use of silk and artificial silk, the volume increasing from 100 in 1923 to 770.9 in 1932.

In table 8 it will be observed that the manufacture of wool, silk and knitted goods are the only ones to show increases in volume in 1931 and 1932 as compared with 1930. Some individual industries of the various groups, such as cotton and wool waste of the cotton group and woollen cloth and woollen yarn of the woollen group show increases in volume, but with these exceptions all industries and all groups, aside from wool, silk and artificial silk and hosiery and knitted goods made no gains in volume of production in 1931 and 1932.

The dyeing and finishing of textile goods was shown as a separate industry for the first time in 1931, having been grouped with the dyeing, cleaning and laundry industry previously. It showed an increase in volume of 13.7 in 1932.

CAPITAL INVESTMENT. - The year 1929 saw the largest capital investment in the textile group of industries with a total of \$383,153,797, made up of fixed capital, covering land, buildings, fixtures, plant equipment, tools, etc., amounting to \$193,841,995 and liquid or working capital, consisting of materials on hand, stocks in process, fuel and miscellaneous supplies, finished products at their inventory value, cash, bills and accounts receivable, prepaid insurance and other prepaid expenses, etc., amounting to \$189,311,802. By referring to table 10, it will be observed that the amount represented by fixed capital was larger in 1930, 1931 and 1932 than in 1929, with corresponding decreases of working capital in those years, but that the total amount of capital invested declined from \$383,153,797 in 1929 to \$352,344,073 in 1931 and \$321,593,062 in 1932. This difference in values may be explained by the fact that in the last several years the textile industry has renovated its plants to a great extent. Worn out and obsolete machinery has been scrapped and replaced by new and up-to-date equipment. New buildings have been erected where necessary, and older ones overhauled with the result that all buildings and equipment were placed in a state of high efficiency. This materially increased their value, and also of course the amount of fixed capital invested in them.

With regard to working capital, the reduced cost of raw materials, the lower prices prevailing for finished merchandise and the decline in the cost of manufacture had tended to reduce the value of the stocks of raw materials and finished products carried on hand. Then too, buying by retailers had been reduced to a minimum with a consequent reduction of bills and accounts receivable. All these factors tended to reduce the value of liquid or working capital held by the industry.

COST OF MATERIALS AND VALUE ADDED BY MANUFACTURE. - The value added by manufacture is obtained by deducting the cost of all materials used from the gross value of production. This difference represents the value added to the raw and other materials

by labour, and it is this value which the manufacturer uses to pay for the labour itself, the other overhead expenses and to provide his profits. In 1931, the gross value of production of textiles and textile products was \$317,158,670 and the cost of all materials used in their manufacture amounted to \$153,191,375. The value, therefore, left to the manufacturer for labour and other expenses and his profits was \$163,967,295. The figures for 1932 were: gross value of production \$274,411,736, cost of materials used \$129,463,738 and the value added by manufacture to pay salaries, wages and other expenses and provide profits was \$144,942,998.

In 1932 the only industries to show increases in the cost of their materials used over 1931 were: woollen cloth with \$92,414 or 1.5 per cent, woollen yarn \$201,791 or 9.1 per cent and silk, artificial silk and products \$1,375,907 or 21.2 per cent. Clothing contractors are included in 1932 for the first time and of course no comparison can be made with former years. A comparison of the cost of materials used in 1931 and 1932 together with the actual and percentage variation is shown in table 9.

EMPLOYEES, SALARIES AND WAGES. - In the last few years the trend of employment in the textile industry has been downward, in sympathy with its other phases of industrial activity. The peak year, from an employment standpoint, was 1929 with 115,620 employees, and a salary and wage bill of \$105,896,237. Of the number employed in that year, 10,026 were salaried employees in receipt of \$19,555,354, while wage-earners, numbering 105,594, received remuneration amounting to \$86,340,883. In 1931, however, employment had dropped to 105,473 persons who were paid \$92,504,088 in salaries and wages, 10,663 were salaried employees receiving \$20,448,227 and 94,810 wage-earners earning \$72,055,861. There was a further drop in 1932 to 102,116 employees and their salaries and wages to \$82,817,944. In this year, 10,557 salaried employees received \$18,955,951, while the wage-earners, numbering 91,559 earned \$63,861,993. It will be observed that the wage-earners declined in number from 105,594 in 1929 to 91,559 in 1932, a decrease of 14,035 and in the same period their wages also dropped from \$86,340,883 to \$63,861,993, a loss of \$22,478,890. Salaried employees, however, increased in number in 1932 over 1929, although their salaries showed a small decrease. In 1929 there were 10,026 salaried employees and they were paid \$19,555,354, while in 1932 returns showed 10,557 salaried employees who were paid \$18,955,951. In 1932 the salaried employees consisted of 7,130 males and 3,427 females while the wage-earners were composed of 38,623 males and 52,936 females.

The increase in the number of salaried employees and salaries paid is due to the following changes made in the instructions accompanying the schedules.

1. Prior to 1931, owners who were working as ordinary wage-earners, such as small bakers, reported themselves as wage-earners. In 1931, however, all such owners were required to report themselves as salaried employees.
2. In 1931, travelling salesmen who were attached to the plant and devoted all or the greater part of their time in selling the products of that plant were included with salaried employees. Prior to this they were not reported at all.

The high proportion of female wage-earners in the textile industry is interesting. As shown in table 1, all the manufacturing industries in Canada in 1932 provided employment for 99,020 female wage-earners, while in the textile group of industries employment was furnished to 52,936 or 53.5 per cent of the total. This naturally reflects in the lower annual average wage paid in the textile group of industries where the average in 1932 was

\$698 in comparison with an average wage of \$898 for all other groups. In the textile group, the average wage declined from \$818 in 1929 to \$698 in 1932 and the average salary from \$1,955 to \$1,796 in the same period.

From a perusal of table 13, it will be observed that the monthly employment of wage-earners remained fairly steady in this industry, there being no marked variations, and as a rule the spring and fall months appear to provide the maximum employment. In 1932 employment was at its peak in April and May with the months of February, March and June, however, not very far behind. September, October and November were also satisfactory months from a standpoint of employment. In 1931 there was only a difference of 7,247 wage-earners between the high month of April and the low month of January.

POWER EQUIPMENT. - Table 17 shows the power equipment used in the textile group from 1924 to 1932 inclusive, with the years 1931 and 1932 shown in detail by industries. It will be noted that electric motors are fast becoming the most important motive power. In 1924 out of a total primary power installation of 8,322 units with a horse-power rating of 139,482 there were 7,864 electric motors driven by purchased power and generating 81,208 horse-power. In 1932 there were installed 29,501 units of primary power with a rated capacity of 189,915 horse-power, and included in these were 29,137 electric motors operated by purchased power with a rating of 132,786 horse-power. Also, in addition to these motors there were in 1932, 4,532 motors with a rating of 38,536 horse power operated by power generated in the factory, making a total number of 33,669 motors operating with a horse-power capacity of 171,322. Other equipment in 1932 consisted of 231 steam engines with a horse-power capacity of 22,204 and 110 hydraulic turbines and water wheels with a capacity of 33,420 horse-power. The power employed in each industry composing the group is shown in detail in the above mentioned table for 1931 and 1932.

CONSUMPTION OF FUEL AND ELECTRICITY. - The cost of all fuel consumed in the textile industry in 1932 was \$3,274,218, while the bill for electricity amounted to \$2,460,602, making a total of \$5,734,820. Bituminous coal constituted the most important item, there having been consumed 445,539 tons costing \$2,634,300, this amounting to 80.5 per cent of the total cost of all fuel. 33,188 tons of anthracite worth \$194,229 were also used so that the total coal bill amounted to \$2,828,529 or 86.4 per cent of the total cost. Fuel oil is being used in increasing quantities, and in 1932, 2,987,222 gallons were consumed costing \$176,684. For 1931 the amount was 1,650,314 gallons worth \$106,730. In some sections of Canada the use of natural gas is increasing to a considerable extent also.

IMPORTS AND EXPORTS OF FIBRES, TEXTILES AND TEXTILE PRODUCTS. - The value of imports of all textiles in 1932 was \$68,949,025, a decrease of \$21,202,491 from the 1931 valuation of \$90,151,516. Imports from the United Kingdom were valued at \$27,180,937 in 1932 against \$31,966,128 in 1931, while from the United States the values were \$25,517,746 and \$35,017,342 in 1932 and 1931 respectively. From all other countries the value was \$16,250,292 in 1932 and \$23,163,046 in 1931.

It will be noted that the values of the groups shown in table 19 do not coincide with the values of groups shown in table 21. This is accounted for by the fact that the customs classification does not agree with the textile classification. For instance, cotton and wool waste is shown under "mixed textile products" in the customs classification, but in the textile group, as there is an industry called "cotton and wool waste", one of the cotton group of industries, such imports are

properly classified under and with its own textile industry. Therefore, it will be noted that, while the groups differ in value, the total values of the entire group of industries are the same in both tables.

Exports of textiles and textile products decreased from \$5,394,084 in 1931 to \$4,814,610 in 1932, all of this loss occasioned by lower shipments to the United States. The value of exports to the United Kingdom was \$1,238,597 in 1932 against \$1,284,772 in 1931; to the United States \$929,437 in 1932 and \$1,790,005 in 1931, while to all other countries they amounted to \$2,646,576 in 1932 and \$2,319,307 in 1931.

The following tables 1 to 21 inclusive illustrate the manufacturing operations of this industry in detail during the year 1932 with comparative figures for 1931.

NOTE: - A change has been made in the method of computing the average annual employment of wage-earners. Between 1925 and 1930 inclusive, the average was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation and not by dividing by twelve the sum of the monthly employment figures. For example, if a plant operated only during three months of the year with an employment of 100 persons the first month, 125 the second month and 75 the third month, its average annual employment was taken as 100 ($300 \div 3$); the same as that of another plant which operated the whole year with an average employment of 100 persons per month. In 1931, however, a change was made from the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figures is divided by 12. This method gives the man year that each plant operates, and is used throughout this report to show the average number of wage-earners employed.
