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ADVANCE REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES OF CANADA, 1936.

The production of textiles and textile products constitutes an important branch of Canadian manufacture. In gross value of products the textile group ranked fifth with 12 per cent of the production for all industries, in number of employees it stood second with 19 per cent, in salaries and wages paid it came third with 16 per cent and in the amount of capital invested it ranked fourth with 10 per cent. It is interesting to note that the textile industries provide employment for a large number of female workers. Out of a total of 132,973 female employees engaged in the manufacturing industries of Canada, 59,381 or 45 per cent were found in this group.

In 1936 reports were received from 1,897 establishments with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$316,273,003. They furnished employment to 114,966 persons who were paid \$95,016,170 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$366,285,008. The materials used cost \$197,336,683 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$162,677,272. The leading industries of this group with the number of employees and the value of production are given in the table below.

According to table 2, which gives the principal statistics of the group as a whole, it will be observed that in 1920, during a period of inflated values of raw materials and manufacturing costs, the value of production reached its peak. A considerable decline occurred the following year, but from then on the industry slowly and steadily resumed its upward climb until it reached its second peak in 1929, when the items in the principal statistics, other than cost of materials and gross value of production attained the highest level in the history of the industry. It may be pointed out here that 1929 held the record for employment until 1934 in which year a new high was recorded for that item and further increases are evidenced in 1935 and 1936. Following 1929, the depression of 1930 created a downward trend in both volume and value of production, the low point being reached in 1932. In 1933 a slight recovery took place, and 1934, 1935 and 1936 show a continued improvement.

Principal Statistics for 1936 compared with 1935. - For the group as a whole there were increases of \$25,489,992 or 7.5 per cent in the gross value of production, \$9,843,307 or 3.2 per cent in the capital invested, \$15,155,181 or 8.3 per cent in the cost of materials used, \$10,032,699 or 6.6 per cent in the net value

or value added by manufacture, 5,019 or 4.6 per cent in the number of persons employed, and \$6,780,350 or 7.7 per cent in salaries and wages paid.

Gains were made in all major items of principal statistics by woollen textiles, hosiery and knitted goods, and the garment trades. Cotton textiles increased in all items with the exception of number of persons employed and miscellaneous textiles in all items except capital invested. Silk and artificial silk showed increases in employment and salaries and wages paid, while in dyeing and finishing of textiles the recorded advances were in employment and capital invested.

The province of Quebec made the greatest advance, the value of production increasing by \$15,098,035 and the number of employees by 2,734. Ontario reported an increase of \$8,522,384 in the value of production and 1,749 in the number of persons employed. All provinces showed gains in the gross value of production.

Provincial Distribution of the Textile Industries. - The table following shows the percentage distribution for 1935 and 1936 of the capital invested, number of employees and gross value of production. It will be observed that in 1936, 93.5 per cent of the capital, 93.6 per cent of the employees and 93.5 per cent of the value of products were reported by firms in Ontario and Quebec, with Quebec leading Ontario to some extent.

Table 5 shows the principal statistics for 1936 by economic areas. In the Maritime Provinces, cotton yarn and cloth, with an output valued at \$3,940,373 was the leading industry. This was followed by hosiery and knitted goods with a production valued at \$2,697,671. These two industries accounted for 72 per cent of the output and 70 per cent of the employees.

In Quebec, the total value of the output was \$189,206,601. Cotton yarn and cloth headed the list with an output valued at \$45,534,135. Next in order of production was women's factory clothing \$35,919,769 followed by men's factory clothing \$25,200,973, natural and artificial silk \$19,685,667, and hosiery and knitted goods \$15,199,088. The aggregate value of production of these five industries was \$141,539,632 or 75 per cent of the total for the province and they employed 72 per cent of the total number of employees.

In Ontario, the production of hosiery and knitted goods was the dominant textile industry in 1936 on the basis of both the value of production and number of employees, for the output was valued at \$30,810,103 and the employees totalled 11,949. Next in order came women's factory clothing with a value of production of \$16,933,879, cotton yarn and cloth \$16,160,857, woollen cloth \$15,560,110 and men's factory clothing \$14,093,591. These five leading industries accounted for \$93,558,540 or 61 per cent of the Ontario total, and also employed 65 per cent of the total employees.

In the Prairie Provinces the men's furnishing goods industry, with a production value of \$3,430,652, occupied first place. Following were cotton and jute bags, \$2,712,695, and women's factory clothing, \$2,564,908. The output of these three industries amounted to \$8,758,255 or 81 per cent of the total for the three provinces.

In British Columbia and the Yukon Territory the output of men's furnishing goods amounted to \$649,591 and of women's factory clothing \$639,440.

Value of Production. - By referring to table 4(b) it will be observed that in 1935 and 1936 the cotton yarn and cloth industry had the highest value of production. This table also gives the principal statistics for all industries.

Since the main items of production in some industries are also produced as secondary ones in others, it is not always possible in reviewing a report on an industry to obtain the complete Canadian production of specific articles. In the women's factory clothing industry, for instance, the report for which is compiled from the statistics of firms whose principal production consists of factory clothing and ready-to-wear apparel for women, articles of men's wear, men's furnishings, etc., are also manufactured as by-products. Similarly, articles of women's apparel will be found to be important, though secondary articles of production, in the men's factory clothing, the men's furnishing goods, hosiery and knitted goods, silk and other industries.

A separate table (No. 6), has been compiled showing the total Canadian production of all articles produced by manufacturers of textiles and textile products. This is excepted, of course, in instances where the publishing of these figures would disclose the operations of individual establishments.

Volume of production. - With the year 1923 representing 100, the index of the physical volume of production for 1936 stands at a new high of 155.4 or 20.1 above the pre-depression peak of the year 1928. The table given on page 5 shows the variations in the volume of production of the major groups between the years 1923 and 1936. The tremendous increase in the production of natural and artificial silk is particularly worthy of note. With the exception of 1924, the silk group recorded an increase each year to reach a peak of 1,344.6 in 1935. In 1936 a volume of 1,287.0, or 57.6 less than the previous year, was recorded.

The pre-depression peak for cotton textiles, woollen textiles, hosiery and knitted goods and the garment trades was the year 1928. However, all these groups have experienced a considerable upward movement during recent years and comparing 1936 with 1928 the following increases are evident: cotton textiles, 17.2; woollen textiles, 35.9; hosiery and knitted goods, 15.0; the garment trades, 5.6.

Miscellaneous textiles reached a high of 127.0 in 1929 and although the 120.5 shown in 1936 is an advance of 12.2 over 1935 and 32.9 over the 1933 low, it is still 6.5 below the 1929 volume.

Employees, salaries and wages. - In 1936 the textile industries gave employment to 55,585 males and 59,381 females or a total of 114,966 persons and paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$95,016,170. This represents an increase of 11,085 persons employed and \$46,737 paid out in salaries and wages over the 1929 totals, and an increase of 24,020 persons and \$21,218,667 over the totals for 1932, which year was the depression low in employment for these industries.

In 1936 salaried employees totalled 12,417, and they received \$21,698,875. Wage-earners to the number of 102,549 were paid the sum of \$73,317,295.

The 55,467 female wage-earners employed in the textile industries represent 50.4 per cent of the total number of females employed as wage-earners in all industries. This naturally is reflected in the average wage of \$715 paid in the textile group as compared with the \$944 for all other groups.

Monthly employment of wage-earners is fairly steady, with the spring and fall months usually showing the maximum employment. In 1936 the peak was reached in October, with 106,278 employed while July with 97,089 was the month of lowest employment.

Capital investment. - The year 1929 saw the largest capital investment reported, the total being \$360,762,534, of which fixed capital represented \$174,727,693 and liquid or working capital \$186,034,891. During the depression years low values of raw materials, etc., and of finished goods carried on hand and the reduction in bills and accounts receivable caused a considerable decline in the working capital reported. This was not fully reflected in the decline in all capital as, due to the extensive renovation of plants carried out during these years, the fixed capital reported in 1930, 1931 and 1932 was greater than that reported in 1929.

The total capital invested in 1936 amounted to \$316,273,003, an increase of \$9,843,307 over 1935 and of \$19,573,055 over 1932, which year represents the depression low for working capital and total capital invested in the textile industries. Working capital, which in 1932 fell to \$121,314,140, was reported to the amount of \$145,679,861 in 1936, the advance indicating higher values and greater business activity. Due chiefly to charges for depreciation, fixed capital had decreased to \$166,923,164 in 1934, but in both 1935 and 1936 a value of roughly \$170,000,000 was reported.

Power employed. - Electric motors are becoming an increasingly important motive power. In 1936 there were installed 44,902 units of primary power with a rated capacity of 221,830 horse-power, and included in these were 44,619 electric motors operated by purchased power and having a rating of 166,691 horse-power. There were also 3,484 electric motors rated at 21,406 horse-power and operated by power generated in the factory.

Consumption of fuel and electricity. - Fuel and electricity combined cost \$6,271,053 in 1936, the expenditure on fuel being \$3,123,700 and on electricity \$3,147,053. Coal, chiefly bituminous, accounted for \$2,576,502 or 82 per cent of the fuel bill. Fuel oil and gas are used to some extent.

Imports and Exports. - Imports of fibres, textiles and textile products in 1936 totalled \$98,915,100, an increase of \$13,724,585 over 1935. Cotton and its manufactures, \$36,720,597, and wool and its manufactures, \$27,573,314, were the leading items. Mixed textile products, \$10,489,307, flax, hemp, jute and their products, \$9,210,763, silk and its manufactures, \$6,780,074, other fibres and their products, \$5,592,436 and artificial silk and its manufactures \$2,548,609 followed in the order given.

Exports totalled \$12,227,387, an advance of \$2,587,157 over the 1935 value. Silk and its manufactures, \$2,979,881, and wool and its manufactures, \$2,737,996, occupied leading positions. Cotton and its manufactures, with a value of \$1,997,748, came next in order of importance, and was followed by artificial silk and its manufactures, \$838,277 and flax, hemp, jute and their manufactures, \$26,684. In the classification all other fibres and textile products, which had a total value of \$3,646,801, the two leading items were binder twine, \$1,115,514 and rags, \$900,577.

(1) Between 1925 and 1930 the average annual employment of wage-earners was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, but in 1931 a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figure is divided by twelve. However, the effect of this change of method is evident in seasonal industries only.

(2) In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of materials and the cost of fuel and electricity from the gross value of the products. However, figures for electricity are not available prior to 1924, and the net value as shown for 1917 and 1920 was arrived at by the old method of subtracting only the cost of materials used.


