


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

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ADVANCE REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES OF CANADA, 1938.

The production of textiles and textile products constitutes an important branch of Canadian manufacture. In gross value of products the textile group ranked sixth with 10 per cent of the production for all industries, in number of employees it stood third with 18 per cent, in salaries and wages paid it came third with 14 per cent and in the amount of capital invested it ranked fifth with 9 per cent. It is interesting to note that the textile industries provide employment for a large number of female workers. Out of a total of 137,574 female employees engaged in the manufacturing industries of Canada, 59,099 or 43 per cent were found in this group.

In 1938 reports were received from 1,927 establishments with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$307,299,840. They furnished employment to 115,745 persons who were paid \$99,275,365 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$346,215,005. The materials used cost \$180,050,478 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$159,978,801. The leading industries of this group with the number of employees and the value of production are given in the table below.

According to Table 2, which gives the principal statistics of the group as a whole, it will be observed that in 1920, during a period of inflated values of raw materials and manufacturing costs, the value of production reached its peak. A considerable decline occurred the following year, but from then on the industry slowly and steadily resumed its upward climb until it reached its second peak in 1929, when the items in the principal statistics, other than cost of materials and gross value of production attained what was then the highest level in the history of the industry. Following 1929, the depression of 1930 created a downward trend in both volume and value of production, the low point being reached in 1932. In 1933 a slight improvement took place, and a continued advance was evidenced up to and including 1937. In 1938 all items of principal statistics were lower than in the preceding year, but both the value and volume of production were considerably in excess of 1929. It should be noted that the 1929 peak no longer holds good for employment and salaries and wages paid. The year 1937 must now be regarded as the all time high for these items.

Principal Statistics for 1938 compared with 1937. - For the group as a whole there were decreases of \$54,168,721 or 13.5 per cent in the gross value of production, \$14,904,340 or 4.6 per cent in the capital invested, \$39,763,297 or 18.1 per cent in the cost of materials used, \$14,098,144 or 8.1 per cent in the net value or value added by manufacture, 5,932 or 4.9 per cent in the number of persons employed, and \$5,780,686 or 5.5 per cent in salaries and wages paid.

Cotton textiles, woollen textiles, silk, artificial silk and products and the garment trades showed decreases in all major items of principal statistics. Dyeing and finishing of textile goods showed decreases in all items except capital, and knitted goods in all items except the number of establishments reporting and the amount of capital invested.

The province of Ontario showed the greatest decline, the value of production decreasing by \$27,817,277 and the number of employees by 3,612. Quebec reported a decrease of \$22,357,386 in the value of production and 1,742 in the number of persons employed. All provinces showed declines in the gross value of production.

Provincial Distribution of the Textile Industries. - The table following shows the percentage distribution for 1937 and 1938 of the capital invested, number of employees and gross value of production. It will be observed that in 1938, 94.2 per cent of the capital, 93.6 per cent of the employees and 93.4 per cent of the value of products were reported by firms in Ontario and Quebec, with Quebec leading Ontario to a fairly considerable extent.

Table 5 shows the principal statistics for 1938 by economic areas. In the Maritime Provinces, cotton yarn and cloth, with an output valued at \$3,450,182 was the leading industry. This was followed by hosiery and knitted goods with a production valued at \$2,070,596. These two industries accounted for 69 per cent of the output and 66 per cent of the employees.

In Quebec, the total value of the output was \$184,536,427. Cotton yarn and cloth headed the list with an output valued at \$39,568,088. Next in order of production was women's factory clothing \$39,113,490, followed by men's factory clothing \$36,702,455, natural and artificial silk \$17,313,788, and hosiery and knitted goods \$16,982,227. The aggregate value of production of these five industries was \$149,680,048 or 81.1 per cent of the total for the province and they employed 81 per cent of the total number of employees.

In Ontario, the production of hosiery and knitted goods was the dominant textile industry in 1938 on the basis of both the value of production and number of employees, for the output was valued at \$29,501,278 and the employees totalled 11,709. Next in order came men's factory clothing with a value of production of \$21,281,307, women's factory clothing \$14,928,282, cotton yarn and cloth \$14,037,345 and woollen cloth \$12,462,246. These five leading industries accounted for \$92,210,458 or 66 per cent of the Ontario total, and also employed 71 per cent of the total employees.

In the Prairie Provinces the men's factory clothing industry, with a production value of \$4,864,338, occupied first place. Following were women's factory clothing, \$2,523,966, and cotton and jute bags, \$2,285,335. The output of these three industries amounted to \$9,673,639 or 88 per cent of the total for the three provinces.

In British Columbia and the Yukon Territory the output of men's factory clothing amounted to \$754,820 and of women's factory clothing \$650,856.

Value of Production. - By referring to table 4(b) it will be observed that in 1937 and 1938 the cotton yarn and cloth industry had the highest value of production. This table also gives the principal statistics for all industries.

Since the main items of production in some industries are also produced as secondary ones in others, it is not always possible in reviewing a report on an industry to obtain the complete Canadian production of specific articles. In the women's factory clothing industry, for instance, the report for which is compiled from the statistics of firms whose principal production consists of factory clothing and ready-to-wear apparel for women, articles of men's wear, men's furnishings, etc., are also manufactured as by-products. Similarly, articles of women's apparel will be found to be important, though secondary articles of production, in the men's factory clothing, the men's furnishing goods, hosiery and knitted goods, silk and other industries.

A separate table (No. 6), has been compiled showing the total Canadian production of all articles produced by manufacturers of textiles and textile products. This is excepted, of course, in instances where the publishing of these figures would disclose the operations of individual establishments.

Volume of Production. - With the year 1926 representing 100, the index of the physical volume of production for 1938 stands at 124.6, which is 15.3 below the previous year, but 9.7 above the pre-depression peak of 1928. Table 7 shows the variations in the volume of production of the major groups between the years 1923 and 1938.

The great and almost continuous increase in the production of silk and artificial silk resulted in an index figure of 684.4 in 1935, which was the peak year for the industry. The index stands at 601.4 in 1938.

As compared with 1937, cotton showed a decline of 20.4, woollen textiles, 39.0, hosiery and knitted goods, 4.3, and the garment trades, 8.5. However, these industries were still in advance of the pre-depression peak of 1928.

Miscellaneous textiles, 101.7, were 13.0 below 1937 and 14.4 below the peak year of 1929.

Employees, salaries and wages. - In 1938 the textile industries gave employment to 56,646 males and 59,099 females or a total of 115,745 persons and paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$99,275,365. This represents a decrease of 5,932 persons employed and \$5,780,686 paid out in salaries and wages from the 1937 totals, but an increase of 24,799 persons and \$25,477,862 over the totals for 1932, which year was the depression low in employment for these industries.

In 1938 salaried employees totalled 13,836, and they received \$24,013,195. Wage-earners to the number of 101,909 were paid the sum of \$75,262,170.

The 55,131 female wage-earners employed in the textile industries represent 49.1 per cent of the total number of females employed as wage-earners in all industries. This naturally is reflected in the average wage of \$738 paid in the textile group as compared with the \$1,008 for all other groups.

Monthly employment of wage-earners is fairly steady, with the spring and fall months usually showing the maximum employment. In 1938 the peak was reached in April, with 105,213 employed while July with 96,251 was the month of lowest employment.

Capital investment. - The year 1929 saw the largest capital investment reported, the total being \$360,762,584, of which fixed capital represented \$174,727,693 and liquid or working capital \$186,034,891. In the years immediately following, a decline in total capital occurred. It is interesting to note, however, that this decline was due to a heavy decrease in working capital, caused by depression conditions, and that, owing to the renovation of plants, etc. carried out during this period, fixed capital actually increased to a considerable extent. An upward movement in total capital became apparent in 1933 and continued until 1937. In 1938 capital invested totalled \$307,299,840, a decrease of \$14,904,340 or 4.6 per cent as compared with 1937. Fixed capital decreased by \$4,525,297 or 2.7 per cent and working capital by \$10,379,043 or 6.8 per cent.

Imports and Exports. - Imports of fibres, textiles and textile products in 1938 totalled \$87,443,217, a decrease of \$27,829,985 from 1937. Cotton and its manufactures, \$29,535,139, and wool and its manufactures, \$25,184,471, were the leading items. Mixed textile products, \$10,115,160, flax, hemp, jute and products, \$8,542,578, silk and its manufactures, \$6,817,000, artificial silk and its manufactures, \$3,749,327 and other fibres and their products, \$3,499,542, followed in the order given.

Exports totalled \$13,054,660, a decrease of \$1,345,862 over the 1937 value. Silk and its manufactures, \$3,252,430, and cotton and its manufactures, \$2,614,942, occupied leading positions. Artificial silk and its manufactures, with a value of \$2,269,722, came next in order of importance, and was followed by wool and its manufactures, \$1,326,373, and flax, hemp, jute and their manufactures, \$103,046. In the classification "all other fibres and textile products", which had a total value of \$3,488,147, the leading specified item was binder twine, \$1,047,284.

Between 1925 and 1930 the average annual employment of wage-earners was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, but in 1931 a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figure is divided by twelve. However, the effect of this change of method is evident in seasonal industries only.

In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of materials and the cost of fuel and electricity from the gross value of the products. However, figures for electricity are not available prior to 1924, and the net value as shown for 1917 and 1920 was arrived at by the old method of subtracting only the cost of materials used.

Note: Profits or losses cannot be estimated from Census figures as no data are collected for certain expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.
