


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ADVANCE REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES OF CANADA, 1940.

The production of textiles and textile products constitutes an important branch of Canadian manufacture. In gross value of products the textile group ranked fourth with 12 per cent of the production for all industries; in number of employees it stood third with 13 per cent; in salaries and wages paid it came third with 14 per cent and in the amount of capital invested it ranked fifth with 10 per cent. It is interesting to note that the textile industries provide employment for a large number of female workers. Out of a total of 168,538 female employees engaged in the manufacturing industries of Canada, 72,372 or 43 per cent were found in this group.

In 1940 reports were received from 1,953 establishments with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$301,433,053. They furnished employment to 138,973 persons who were paid \$153,136,516 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$547,451,110. The materials used cost \$293,050,228 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$240,328,902. The leading industries of this group with the number of employees and the value of production are given in the table below.

Principal Statistics for 1940 compared with 1939. - Although the major groups comprised in the textile industries reflected the expanding war effort in 1939, further impressive advances may be noted in 1940. As compared with 1939 the group as a whole showed increases of \$154,793,356 or 30.4 per cent in the gross value of production, \$47,344,131 or 15.6 per cent in the capital invested, \$36,053,091 or 40.7 per cent in the cost of materials used, \$68,411,005 or 32.1 per cent in the net value or value added by manufacture, 17,951 or 14.3 per cent in the number of persons employed, and \$26,019,231 or 34.3 per cent in salaries and wages paid.

Tables 2, 4(a) and 4(b) present provincial and group totals for the years 1939 and 1940.

Provincial Distribution of the Textile Industries. - The provinces of Ontario and Quebec dominate in the field of textile manufacturing. In 1940, Quebec accounted for 50.7 per cent of the gross value of production and 52.1 per cent of the employment given. The comparable percentages for Ontario were 42.6 and 41.1.

Table 5 shows the principal statistics for 1940 by economic areas. In the Maritime Provinces, cotton yarn and cloth, with an output valued at \$6,137,583 was the leading industry. This was followed by hosiery and knitted goods with a production valued at \$3,824,431, and men's factory clothing, \$2,175,690. These three industries accounted for 78 per cent of the output and 82 per cent of the employees.

In Quebec, the total value of the output was \$277,541,620. Cotton yarn and cloth headed the list with an output valued at \$72,240,273. Next in order of production was men's factory clothing, \$55,591,436, followed by women's factory clothing, \$46,519,609, hosiery and knitted goods \$24,005,754 and natural and artificial silk \$20,347,531. The aggregate value of production of these five industries was \$218,704,668 or 73 per cent of the total for the province and they employed 60 per cent of the total number of employees.

In Ontario, the production of hosiery and knitted goods was the dominant textile industry in 1940 on the basis of both the value of production and the number of employees, for the output was valued at \$40,780,570 and the employees totalled 13,153. Next in order came men's factory clothing with a value of production of \$34,710,247, woollen cloth \$28,720,256, cotton yarn and cloth \$25,012,007, and women's factory clothing \$17,937,352. These five leading industries accounted for \$147,159,041 or 65 per cent of the Ontario total, and also employed 60 per cent of the total employees.

In the Prairie Provinces the men's factory clothing industry, with a production value of \$7,024,060 occupied first place. Following were women's factory clothing, \$3,246,893, and cotton and jute bags, \$3,250,284. The output of these three industries amounted to \$13,521,222 or 37 per cent of the total for the three provinces.

In British Columbia and the Yukon Territory the output of men's factory clothing amounted to \$1,158,330 and of women's factory clothing \$705,400.

Value of Production. - By referring to Table 4(b) it will be observed that in 1940, the cotton yarn and cloth industry had the highest value of production. This table also gives the principal statistics for all industries.

Since the main items of production in some industries are also produced as secondary ones in others, it is not always possible in reviewing a report on an industry to obtain the complete Canadian production of specific articles. In the women's factory clothing industry, for instance, the report for which is compiled from the statistics of firms whose principal production consists of factory clothing and ready-to-wear apparel for women, articles of men's wear, men's furnishings, etc., are also manufactured as by-products. Similarly, articles of women's apparel will be found to be important, though secondary articles of production, in the men's factory clothing, the men's furnishing goods, silk and other industries.

A separate table (No. 6), has been compiled showing the total Canadian production of all articles produced by manufacturers of textiles and textile products. This is excepted, of course, in instances where the publishing of figures would disclose the operations of individual establishments.

Volume of Production. - With the years 1935-1939 representing 100, the index of the physical volume of production for 1940 stood at 124.8. Table 7 shows the variations in the volume of production of the major groups for representative years.

The index figures for the various groups in 1940 were as follows: Cotton textiles, 132.1; Woollen textiles, 138.1; Silk, artificial silk and products, 95.3; Dyeing and finishing of textile goods, 132.8; Knitted goods (including hosiery and fabric gloves and mittens), 125.7; Garment trades, 123.6; Miscellaneous textiles, 133.5.

Employees, salaries and wages. - In 1940 the textile industries gave employment to 66,601 males and 72,372 females or a total of 138,973 persons and paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$133,136,316 and this established an all time high for these items.

In 1940 salaried employees totalled 15,924 and they received \$30,223,749. Wage-earners to the number of 123,049 were paid the sum of \$102,912,367. In this latter connection it should be noted that the large number of females employed as wage-earners in the textile industries tends to produce an average wage lower than that of other groups.

In 1940 the peak employment of wage-earners was reached in October with 129,132 employed while January with 113,186 was the month of lowest employment. Tables 12(a) and 12(b) give details of average, annual, weekly and hourly earnings, and average hours worked per week.

Capital Investment. - Capital investment in 1940 was the largest ever reported, the previous peak having occurred in 1929. In 1940, fixed capital represented \$132,829,163 and working capital \$211,663,895.

Imports and Exports. - Imports of fibres, textiles and textile products rose from \$100,866,078 in 1939 to \$147,328,745 in 1940. Imports of cotton and its manufactures increased by \$13,832,752 and wool and its manufactures by \$20,721,106. Exports were \$14,427,860 in 1939 and \$21,571,023 in 1940. Cotton and its manufactures showed an increase of \$5,836,014.

(1) Between 1935 and 1939 the average annual employment of wage-earners was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, but in 1939 a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figure is divided by twelve. However, the effect of this change of method is evident in seasonal industries only.

(2) In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of materials and the cost of fuel and electricity from the gross value of the products. However, figures for electricity are not available prior to 1934, and the net value as shown for 1917 and 1920 was arrived at by the old method of subtracting only the cost of materials used.

Note: Profits or losses cannot be estimated from Census figures as no data are collected for certain expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.
