

ADVANCE REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES OF CANADA, 1943

During the years 1940-1943 the textile group of industries were required to play an important part in the war effort. Not only the greatest possible expansion was necessary, but also, due to the differing demands of the armed forces, types of yarns, fabrics and other goods produced were radically altered. An all-time peak was reached in 1942, in which year employment was given to 165,478 persons who produced goods with a gross value at the plant of \$793,304,750.

Relating the textile industries to other divisions of Canadian manufacturing it may be observed that in 1943, in gross value of products it ranked sixth, with 12.9 per cent; in salaries and wages paid it came third with 9.6 per cent and in the amount of capital invested it ranked sixth with 7.2 per cent. It is interesting to note, also, that the textile industries provide employment for a large number of female workers. Out of a total of 349,535 female employees engaged in the manufacturing industries of Canada, 95,267 or 27 per cent were found in this group.

In 1943 reports were received from 2,384 establishments with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$455,056,029. They furnished employment to 157,987 persons who were paid \$191,305,628 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$790,659,927. The materials used cost \$446,136,675 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$334,242,717.

In the tables immediately following are given employment and gross value of production totals for the leading industries of the group for the years 1939, 1942 and 1943. The order of presentation is established by the gross value of production in 1943. Employment totals indicate the importance of 1942 activities, and the 1943 dollar value increase in certain industries, such as men's factory clothing, women's factory clothing, hosiery and knitted goods and silk and artificial silk, should be modified by reference to employment declines in these industries. (For the actual volume of production index numbers, see Table 7.)

Principal Statistics for 1942 compared with 1943. - The major groups comprised in the textile industries reflected the changing war demands in 1943. As compared with 1942 the group as a whole showed decreases of \$2,644,823 or .8 per cent in the gross value of production, \$9,105,544 or 2.0 per cent in the capital invested, 7,491 or 4.7 per cent in the number of persons employed and \$7,232,364 or 2.1 per cent in the net value added by manufacture. Salaries and wages paid were greater by \$5,574,315 or 3.0 per cent, and there was an increase in the cost of materials of \$4,418,623 or 1.0 per cent.

Tables 2, 4(a) and 4(b) present provincial and group totals for the years 1942 and 1943.

Provincial Distribution of the Textile Industries. - The provinces of Ontario and Quebec dominate in the field of textile manufacturing. In 1943, Quebec accounted for 54.4 per cent of the gross value of production and 54.8 per cent of the employment given. The comparable percentages for Ontario were 39.5 and 38.1

Table 5 shows the principal statistics for 1943 by economic areas. In the Maritime Provinces, cotton yarn and cloth, with an output valued at \$5,414,788 was the leading industry. This was followed by hosiery and knitted goods with a production valued at \$3,735,500, and men's factory clothing, \$3,566,571. These three industries accounted for 65 per cent of the output and 71 per cent of the employees.

In Quebec, the total value of the output was \$428,740,491. Cotton yarn and cloth headed the list with an output valued at \$95,568,886. Next in order of production was men's factory clothing, \$85,179,641, followed by women's factory clothing \$85,076,981, natural and artificial silk \$33,923,329, hosiery and knitted goods \$30,429,048. The aggregate value of production of these five industries was \$328,175,885 or 76 per cent of the total for the province and they employed 76 per cent of the total number of employees.

In Ontario, the production of men's factory clothing was the dominant textile industry in 1943 on the basis of the value of production which totalled \$48,660,447. Hosiery and knitted goods which came second with \$44,619,441, actually led in employment with 12,090 persons on the payrolls. Next in order came woollen cloth \$33,722,858, women's factory clothing \$33,185,455, and cotton yarn and cloth \$25,896,200. These five leading industries accounted for \$186,084,396 or 61 per cent of the Ontario total, and employed 68 per cent of the total employees.

In the Prairie Provinces the men's factory clothing industry, with a production value of \$11,231,198, occupied first place. Following were bags, cotton and jute, \$7,707,195; and women's factory clothing, \$7,119,764. The output of these three industries amounted to \$26,058,157 or 81 per cent of the total for the three provinces.

In British Columbia and the Yukon Territory the output of awnings, tents and sails amounted to \$1,413,307, women's factory clothing, \$1,360,135, and men's factory clothing, \$1,162,260.

Value of Production. - By referring to Table 4(b) it will be observed that in 1941, the cotton yarn and cloth industry had the highest value of production. This table also gives the principal statistics for all industries.

Since the main items of production in some industries are also produced as secondary ones in others, it is not always possible in reviewing a report on an industry to obtain the complete Canadian production of specific articles. In the women's factory clothing industry, for instance, the report for which is compiled from the statistics of firms whose principal production consists of factory clothing and ready-to-wear apparel for women, articles of men's wear, men's furnishings, etc., are also manufactured as by-products. Similarly, articles of women's apparel will be found to be important, though secondary articles of production, in the men's factory clothing, silk and other industries.

A separate table (No. 6), has been compiled showing the total Canadian production of all articles produced by manufacturers of textiles and textile products. This is excepted, of course, in instances where the publishing of figures would disclose the operations of individual establishments.

Volume of Production. - With the years 1935-1939 representing 100, the index of physical volume of production for 1943 stood at 140.2, a decrease of 8.0 per cent as compared with 1942. Table 7 shows the variations in the volume of production of the major groups for representative years.

The miscellaneous group, comprising cotton and jute bags, cordage, rope and twine, etc., stood at 195.3, an increase of 3.3 per cent. Losses were recorded by all the other groups. The index numbers, together with the percentage decrease in each case, were as follows: cotton textiles, 154.3 (13.9 per cent); woollen textiles, 140.4 (6.9 per cent); silk, artificial silk and products, 130.1 (6.3 per cent); dyeing and finishing of textile goods, 174.8 (5.8 per cent); narrow fabrics, 82.3 (19.3 per cent); knitted goods, including hosiery and knitted goods, and fabric gloves and mittens, 118.2 (5.8 per cent); and the garment trades, 151.9 (7.3 per cent).

Employees, salaries and wages. - In 1943 the textile industries gave employment to 64,720 males and 93,267 females or a total of 157,487 persons and paid out in salaries and wages the sum of \$191,305,628 and this established an all-time high for these items.

In 1943 salaried employees totalled 18,875 and they received \$43,890,793. Wage-earners to the number of 139,112 were paid the sum of \$147,414,835. In this latter connection it should be noted that the large number of females employed as wage-earners in the textile industries tends to produce an average wage lower than that of other groups.

In 1943 the peak employment of wage-earners was reached in February with 145,172 employed while December with 131,955 was the month of lowest employment. Tables 13(a), (b), (c), (d), give details of average, annual, weekly and hourly earnings, and average hours worked per week.

Capital Investment. - Capital investment in 1943 totalled \$455,056,029, which was an all-time high for the textile industries. Fixed Capital represented \$190,613,728 and Working Capital \$264,442,301.

(1) Between 1925 and 1930 the average annual employment of wage-earners was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, but in 1931 a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figure is divided by twelve. However, the effect of this change of method is evident in seasonal industries only.

(2) In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of materials and the cost of fuel and electricity from the gross value of the products. However, figures for electricity are not available prior to 1924, and the net value as shown for 1917 and 1920 was arrived at by the old method of subtracting only the cost of materials used.

Note: Profits or losses cannot be estimated from Census figures as no data are collected for certain expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.
