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

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ADVANCE REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES OF CANADA, 1946.

From the standpoint of the physical volume of production, the textile group of industries operated at approximately the same level in 1946 as in 1945. However, these industries, which in 1945 were to a large extent occupied with military contracts, were in 1946 free to utilize almost their full productive capacity towards satisfying an abnormally large demand for civilian goods. It was this concentration on civilian production which enabled the textile group of industries-in spite of problems inherent in conversion from war to peacetime production, inadequate supplies of new machinery, shortages of certain raw materials, etc.-to effect a marked improvement in the supply situation by the end of the year.

Relating the textile industries to other divisions of Canadian manufacturing it may be observed that in 1946, in gross value of products it ranked fifth, with 11.1 per cent and in salaries and wages paid it came third with 13.1 per cent. It is interesting to note, also, that the textile industries provide employment for a large number of female workers. Out of a total of 268,455 female employees engaged in the manufacturing industries of Canada in 1946, 93,517 or 34.8 per cent were found in this group.

In 1946 reports were received from 3,082 establishments. They furnished employment to 164,737 persons who were paid \$228,018,323 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$888,658,943. The materials used cost \$459,664,221 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$418,263,665.

In the tables immediately following are given employment and gross value of production totals for the leading industries of the group for the years 1939, 1942, 1945 and 1946. The order of presentation is established by the gross value of production in 1946.

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Principal Statistics for 1946 compared with 1945. - As compared with 1945 the group as a whole showed increases of \$80,936,702 or 10.0 per cent in the gross value of production, 6,589 or 4.2 per cent in the number of persons employed and \$30,455,785 or 7.1 per cent in the cost of materials used. Salaries and wages paid were greater by \$20,388,852 or 9.8 per cent, and there was an increase in the value added by manufacture of \$50,282,960 or 13.7 per cent.

Tables 2 and 4(a) present provincial and group totals for the years 1945 and 1946.

Provincial Distribution of the Textile Industries. - The provinces of Ontario and Quebec dominate in the field of textile manufacturing. In 1946, Quebec accounted for 55.3 per cent of the gross value of production and 54.8 per cent of the employment given. The comparable percentages for Ontario were 37.2 and 38.0.

Table 5 shows the principal statistics for 1946 by economic areas. In the Maritime Provinces, cotton yarn and cloth, with an output valued at \$4,983,934 was the leading industry. This was followed by hosiery and knitted goods with a production valued at \$4,493,777, and men's factory clothing, \$2,135,795. These three industries accounted for 57.3 per cent of the output and 65.3 per cent of the employees.

In Quebec, the total value of the output was \$491,637,370. Women's factory clothing headed the list with an output valued at \$118,193,625. Next in order of production was men's factory clothing, \$89,933,365, followed by cotton yarn and cloth, \$78,418,260, natural and artificial silk, \$44,451,338, hosiery and knitted goods, \$43,372,805. The aggregate value of production of these five industries was \$374,369,393 or 76.2 per cent of the total for the province and they employed 75.0 per cent of the total number of employees.

In Ontario, the production of hosiery and knitted goods was the dominant textile industry in 1946 on the basis of the value of production which totalled \$55,380,305. Men's factory clothing came second with \$46,088,948. Next in order were women's factory clothing \$44,988,114, woollen cloth \$32,607,602, and cotton yarn and cloth \$26,426,256. These five leading industries accounted for \$205,491,- 225 or 62.1 per cent of the Ontario total, and employed 67.6 per cent of the total employees.

In the Prairie Provinces the men's factory clothing industry, with a production value of \$12,994,723, occupied first place. Following were bags, cotton and jute, \$8,943,389, and women's factory clothing \$8,848,032. The output of these three industries amounted to \$30,786,144 or 86.8 per cent of the total for the three provinces.

In British Columbia the output of women's factory clothing amounted to \$2,245,454, men's factory clothing, \$1,554,140, and woollen cloth, \$1,402,630.

Value of Production. - By referring to Table 4(b) it will be observed that in 1946, the women's factory clothing industry had the highest value of production. This table also gives the principal statistics for all industries.

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Since the main items of production in some industries are also produced as secondary ones in others, it is not always possible in reviewing a report on an industry to obtain the complete Canadian production of specific articles. In the women's factory clothing industry, for instance, the report for which is compiled from the statistics of firms whose principal production consists of factory clothing and ready-to-wear apparel for women, articles of men's wear, men's furnishings, etc., are also manufactured as by-products. Similarly, articles of women's apparel will be found to be important, though secondary articles of production, in the men's factory clothing, silk and other industries.

A separate table (No. 6), has been compiled showing the total Canadian production of all articles produced by manufacturers of textiles and textile products. This is excepted, of course, in instances where the publishing of figures would disclose the operations of individual establishments.

Volume of Production. - With the years 1935-1939 representing 100, the index of the physical volume of production for 1946 stood at 134.1, approximately the same as in 1945. Table 9 shows the variations in the volume of production of the major groups and industries for representative years.

Index gains were recorded by hosiery and knitted goods, garment trades, woollen textiles, silk and artificial silk products and by the textile dyeing and finishing industry, the index numbers, together with percentage increase in each case, being respectively 125.8 (4.5 per cent), 143.9 (1.4 per cent), 154.8 (8.0 per cent), 153.8 (10.3 per cent), and 213.8 (15.8 per cent). Losses were sustained by the remaining three groups of industries with index numbers and the percentage decreases as follows: narrow fabrics 47.8 (25.1 per cent); cotton textiles 115.1 (6.8 per cent); and the miscellaneous group, comprising cotton and jute bags, etc. 144.0 (14.1 per cent).

Employment, Salaries and Wages. - In 1946 the textile industries gave employment to 71,220 males and 93,517 females, or a total of 164,737 persons. The payroll amounted to \$228,018,323.

There were 19,805 salaried employees, who received the sum of \$52,-363,705. Of these, 12,316 were males and 7,489 females.

Wage-earners to the number of 144,932 received \$175,654,618. The total included 58,904 males and 86,028 females. In this latter connection, it should be noted that the large number of females employed in the textile industries tends to produce lower average earnings per person when compared with the earnings in other industries. The peak employment of wage-earners was reached in November with 149,046 recorded. July, with 133,668, was the month of lowest employment.

Table 15a, Page 51 shows that during the last week of November male wage-earners earned on the average 69.0 cents per hour. The average wage received amounted to \$31.53 for an average of 45.7 hours of work. The comparable figures for female wage-earners for the same week were 49.9 cents per hour, \$19.76 per week and 39.6 hours. Table 15a, together with Tables 15(b) and 15(c), was prepared from data collected by the Employment Section of Dominion Bureau of Statistics from firms having 15 or more employees.

(1) Between 1925 and 1930 the average annual employment of wage-earners was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, but in 1931 a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figure is divided by twelve. However, the effect of this change of method is evident in seasonal industries only.

(2) In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of materials and the cost of fuel and electricity from the gross value of the products. However, figures for electricity are not available prior to 1924, and the net value as shown for 1917 and 1920 was arrived at by the old method of subtracting only the cost of materials used.

(3) Information on capital not collected since 1943.

NOTE: Profits or losses cannot be estimated from Census figures as no data are collected for certain expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.


