

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REPORT ON THE TEXTILE INDUSTRIES, 1948

Stimulated by a decline in imports and the continued expansion of the Canadian economy, the output of the textile group of industries was carried to a new record of 1.2 billion dollars in the year 1948. At the same time record levels of investment continued in the industry and while great strides were made toward the elimination of wartime backlog demand, it was evident that entirely new levels of production and consumption were anticipated. It is noteworthy too that such expansion was not based on any increase in exports because the textile export market actually declined in the year under review. At the same time some concern was apparent in regard to the domestic industry maintaining its present share of the domestic market in the face of cheaper imports following the termination of temporary trading restrictions.

Relating the textile industries to other divisions of Canadian manufacturing it may be observed that in 1948 in gross value of products it ranked sixth with 10.4 per cent, and in salaries and wages paid it came third with 13.1 per cent. It is interesting to note, also, that the textile industries provide employment for a large number of female workers. Out of a total of 275,968 female employees engaged in the manufacturing industries of Canada in 1948, 101,792 or 36.9 per cent were found in this group.

In 1948 reports were received from 3,204 establishments. They furnished employment to 182,408 persons who were paid \$315,273,042 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$1,238,128,962. The materials used cost \$645,183,100 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$578,579,691.

In the tables immediately following are given employment and gross value of production totals for the leading industries of the group for the years 1939, 1942, 1947 and 1948. The order of presentation is established by the gross value of production in 1948.

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Principal Statistics for 1948 compared with 1947. As compared with 1947 the group as a whole showed increases of \$176,087,697 or 16.6 per cent in the gross value of production, 6,343 or 3.6 per cent in the number of persons employed and \$84,548,392 or 15.1 per cent in the cost of materials used. Salaries and wages paid were greater by \$47,168,153 or 17.6 per cent, and there was an increase in the value added by manufacture of \$89,596,647 or 18.3 per cent.

Tables 2 and 4(a) present provincial and group totals for the years 1947 and 1948.

Provincial Distribution of the Textile Industries. The provinces of Ontario and Quebec dominate in the field of textile manufacturing. In 1948, Quebec accounted for 55.8 per cent of the gross value of production and 55.3 per cent of the employment given. The comparable percentages for Ontario were 37.1 and 37.5.

Table 5 shows the principal statistics for 1948 by economic areas. In the Maritime Provinces cotton yarn and cloth, with an output valued at \$9,872,419 was the leading industry. This was followed by hosiery and knitted goods with a production valued at \$6,924,156 and men's factory clothing, \$2,548,373. These three industries accounted for 68.7 per cent of the output and 68.0 per cent of the employees.

In Quebec, the total value of the output was \$690,505,576. Women's factory clothing headed the list with an output valued at \$147,438,466. Next in order of production was cotton yarn and cloth, \$140,858,949, followed by men's factory clothing, \$122,151,-301, synthetic textiles and silk, \$75,698,647, hosiery and knitted goods, \$60,632,587. The aggregate value of production of these five industries was \$546,779,950 or 79.2 per cent of the total for the province and they employed 77.1 per cent of the total number of employees.

In Ontario, the production of hosiery and knitted goods was the dominant textile industry in 1948 on the basis of the value of production which totalled \$77,771,632. Men's factory clothing came second with \$64,613,475. Next in order were women's factory clothing \$57,433,325, cotton yarn and cloth \$52,715,533 and woollen cloth \$39,989,550. These five leading industries accounted for \$292,523,515 or 63.7 per cent of the Ontario total, and employed 69.0 per cent of the total employees.

In the Prairie Provinces the men's factory clothing industry, with a production value of \$17,309,163 occupied first place. Following were women's factory clothing \$14,562,214 and bags, cotton and jute \$8,736,823. The output of these three industries amounted to \$40,608,200 or 86.9 per cent of the total for the three provinces.

In British Columbia the output of women's factory clothing amounted to \$3,336,496, men's factory clothing, \$2,406,057 and woollen cloth, \$1,345,485.

Value of Production. - By referring to Table 4(b) it will be observed that in 1948 the women's factory clothing industry had the highest value of production. This table also gives the principal statistics for all industries.

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Since the main items of production in some industries are also produced as secondary ones in others, it is not always possible in reviewing a report on an industry to obtain the complete Canadian production of specific articles. In the women's factory clothing industry, for instance, the report for which is compiled from the statistics of firms whose principal production consists of factory clothing and ready-to-wear apparel for women, articles of men's wear, men's furnishings, etc., are also manufactured as by-products. Similarly, articles of women's apparel will be found to be important, though secondary articles of production, in the men's factory clothing, silk and other industries.

A separate table (No. 6), has been compiled showing the total Canadian production of all articles produced by manufacturers of textiles and textile products. This is excepted, of course, in instances where the publishing of figures would disclose the operations of individual establishments.

Employment, Salaries and Wages. - In 1948 the textile industries gave employment to 80,616 males and 101,792 females, or a total of 182,408 persons. The payroll amounted to \$315,273,042.

There were 21,603 salaried employees, who received the sum of \$66,109,581. Of these 13,323 were males and 8,280 females.

Wage-earners to the number of 160,805 received \$249,163,461. The total included 67,293 males and 93,512 females. In this latter connection, it should be noted that the large number of females employed in the textile industries tends to produce lower average earnings per person when compared with the earnings in other industries. The peak employment of wage-earners was reached in November with 164,251 recorded. July, with 156,245, was the month of lowest employment.

Table 13(a), Page 39, shows that during the last week of November male wage-earners earned on the average 90.1 cents per hour. The average wage received amounted to \$41.17 for an average of 45.7 hours of work. The comparable figures for female wage-earners for the same week were 58.6 cents per hour, \$23.08 per week and 39.4 hours. Table 13(a), together with Tables 13(b) and 13(c), were prepared from data collected by the Employment Section of Dominion Bureau of Statistics from firms having 15 or more employees.

(1) Between 1925 and 1930 the average annual employment of wage-earners was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, but in 1931 a change was made to the old method, whereby the aggregate of the monthly figure is divided by twelve. However, the effect of this change of method is evident in seasonal industries only.

(2) In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of materials and the cost of fuel and electricity from the gross value of the products. However, figures for electricity are not available prior to 1924, and the net value as shown for 1917 and 1920 was arrived at by the old method of subtracting only the cost of materials used.

(3) Information on capital not collected since 1943.

NOTE; Profits or losses cannot be estimated from Census figures as no data are collected for certain expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.


