THE WOOLEN YARN INDUSTRY, 1918.

A preliminary report on the above industry for the Dominion has been prepared by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the calendar year 1918, covering the operations of 10 plants located by provinces as follows: Ontario 5, Quebec 1, New Brunswick 3 and Nova Sectia 1.

Capital Investment.

The capital invested in the industry was \$3,767,390, the principal items of which were - land, buildings and fixtures \$505.752; machinery and tools \$794.645; materials on hand, stocks in process, finished products, fuel and miscellaneous supplied \$1,655,969, and cash, trading and operating accounts and bills receivable \$750,014.

Employees, Salaries and Wages.

The number of persons at employment by classes and sex, together with the amounts paid each class in salaries and wages are given in the following table:-



Fuel and Miscellaneous Expenses.

Fuel consumption. - The total fuel used during the year was valued at \$51,834, of which Canadian fuel amounted to \$1,081 and foreign fuel to \$50,753. Coal and wood were the only fuels reported, there being 6,890 tons of the former worth \$50,808 and 217 cords of the latter worth \$1,026.

Miscellaneous expenses.- The total cost of the items of miscellaneous expense was \$391,950. Rent of offices, etc., cost \$151; rent of power \$10,970; insurance premiums \$11,440; taxes (internal revenue, war, etc.) \$127,205; taxes (provincial, municipal, etc.) \$9,827; royalties, use of patents, etc.,\$906; advertising expenses \$12,057; travelling expenses \$19,235; ordinary repairs to plant \$50,664, and all other sundry expenses \$149,135.

Equipment of plants.

Equipment of the plants consisted of 402 sets of cards, 6,763 mule spinning spindles, 11,520 frame spinning spindles, 4,594 doubling and twisting spindles, 55 broad looms 50 inches or over reed space, 87 narrow looms under 50 inches, 2 wool combing machines, 12 pickers and 2 garnet machines.
