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## PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 362,975 M ft. in November, 1956 as compared with 319,846 M ft. in November, 1955 an increase of 13.5 p.c. over the previous year but a decrease of 11.8 p.c. from the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for 57.8 p.c. of the total, showed an increase of 5.1 p.c. over the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 42.2 p.c. showed an increase of 27.3 p.c. Shipments in November, 1956 totalled 345,620 M ft., as compared with 372,235 M ft. the previous year, a decrease of 7.2 p.c. with Coast mills registering an increase of 1.7 p.c. and Interior mills a decrease of 17.5 p.c. Total shipments for November decreased by 4.8 p.c. from the October figure of 362,964 M ft. Stocks on hand at the end of November, 1956 amounted to 570,660 M ft., as compared with 463,921 M ft. at the end of November the previous year and 558,029 M ft. at the end of October of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 290,011 M ft., while Interior mills showed 280,649 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawnills for October and November 1955 and 1956. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production decreased from 421,281 M ft. in October, 1955 to 319,846 M ft. in November, 1955 and from 411,506 M ft. in October to 362,975 M ft. in November, 1956. Shipments totalled 362,964 M ft. in October, 1956 and 345,620 M ft. in November, 1956 as compared with 392,014 M ft. in October and 372,235 M ft. in November of 1955. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from 513,221 M ft. in October, 1955 to 463,921 M ft. in November and increased from 558,029 M ft. in October 1956 to 570,660 M ft. in November of this year.

## Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to 208,122 M ft. in November, 1956 as compared with 148,407 M ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 1,821 M ft. in November as compared with 4,625 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 57.8 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in November, 1956 as compared with 62.4 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during October, 1956 and 1955 respectively, were 52.9 and 59.0 p.c.

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Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 203,903 M ft. in November of 1956 and 197,867 M ft. in October, 1956 as compared with 200,493 M ft. in November, 1955 and 200,993 M ft. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped 141,717 M ft. and 171,742 M ft. in November 1956 and 1955 and 165,097 M ft. and 191,021 M ft. in October, 1956 and 1955. Of all shipments actually reported for November, 35.6 p.c. went to points in Canada, 44.0 p.c. to points in United States, 8.5 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 11.9 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 27.2 p.c. of the total, while 48.7 p.c. went by rail, and 24.1 p.c. by truck.

Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in October and November, 1956 amounted to 283,429 M ft. and 290,011 M ft. as compared with 273,445 M ft. and 273,508 M ft. in October and November of 1955. Interior mills stocks decreased from 239,776 M ft. in October to 190,413 M ft. in November, 1955 but increased from 274,600 M ft. in October to 280,649 M ft. in November, 1956. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 34.3 p.c. of the total in November, 1956 as compared with 25.6 p.c. in November, 1955 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 90.9 and 85.7.

Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of October and November, 1955 and 1956 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of November, 1956 amounted to 275,480 M ft. as compared with 342,964 M ft. in November, 1955. Orders on hand at the end of October, 1956 and 1955 amounted to 256,608 M ft. and 318,788 M ft., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 4,604 M ft. in November, 1956 and 4,067 M ft. in November, 1955 as compared with 3,944 M ft. in October, 1956 and 6,146 M ft. in October, 1955.

Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for November accounted for 78.4 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1954 compared with 78.6 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for October, 1955 and 1956 were 78.9 and 80.2 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.
