PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawm lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 391,259 M ft. in October, 1957 as compared with 434,054 M ft. in October, 1956 a decrease of 9.9 p.c. from the previous year but an increase of 0.4 p.c. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which accounts for 55.9 p.c. of the total, showed a decrease of 1.8 p.c. from the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 44.1 p.c. showed a decrease of 18.4 p.c. Shipments in October, 1957 totalled 385,958 M ft., as compared with 362,964 M ft. the previous year, an increase of 6.3 p.c. with Coast mills registering an increase of 6.8 p.c. and Interior mills an increase of 5.8 p.c. Total shipments for October increased by 0.9 p.c. over the September figure of 382,546 M ft. Stocks on hand at the end of October, 1957 amounted to 563,209 M ft., as compared with 558,029 M ft. at the end of October the previous year and 567,435 M ft. at the end of September of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 284,965 M ft., while Interior mills showed 278,244 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for September and October, 1956 and 1957. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from 428,490 M ft. in September, 1956 to 434,054 M ft. in October, 1956 and from 389,523 M ft. in September to 391,259 M ft. in October, 1957. Shipments totalled 382,546 M ft. in September. 1957 and 385,958 M ft. in October, 1957 as compared with 400,969 M ft. in September and 362,964 M ft. in October of 1956. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from 510,224 M ft. in September, 1956 to 558,029 M ft. in October but decreased from 567,435 M ft. in September, 1957 to 563,209 M ft. in October of this year.

Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawm lumber in Coast mills amounted to 216,865 M ft. in October, 1957 as compared with 169,285 M ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 1,898 M ft. in October as compared with 3,211 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 55.9 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in October, 1957 as compared with 51.3 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during September, 1957 and 1956 respectively, were 51.7 and 48.3 p.c.

Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 211,315 M ft. in October of 1957 and 206,495 M ft. in September, 1957 as compared with 197,867 M ft. in October, 1956 and 204,993 M ft. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped 174,643 M ft. and 165,097 M ft. in October, 1957 and 1956 and 176,051 M ft. and 195,976 M ft. in September, 1957 and 1956. Of all shipments actually reported for October, 36.3 p.c. went to points in Canada, 38.0 p.c. to points in United States, 13.1 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 12.6 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 30.1 p.c. of the total, while 46.5 p.c. went by rail, and 23.4 p.c. by truck.

Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in September and October, 1957 amounted to 263,765 M ft. and 284,965 M ft. as compared with 261,914 M ft. and 283,429 M ft. in September and October of 1956. Interior mills stocks increased from 248,310 M ft. in September to 274,600 M ft. in October, 1956 but decreased from 303,670 M ft. in September to 278,244 M ft. in October, 1957. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 35.9 p.c. of the total in October, 1957 as compared with 34.5 p.c. in October, 1956 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 92.9 and 88.8.

Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of September and October, 1956 and 1957 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of October, 1957 amounted to 274,672 M ft. as compared with 256,608 M ft. in October, 1956. Orders on hand at the end of September, 1957 and 1956, amounted to 275,366 M ft. and 240,220 M ft., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 8,351 M ft. in October, 1957 and 3,944 M ft. in October, 1956 as compared with 9,160 M ft. in September, 1957 and 5,446 M ft. in September, 1956.

Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for October accounted for 80.3 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1955 compared with 80.2 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for September, 1956 and 1957 were 78.5 and 81.3 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
