PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled $386,377 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1957 as compared with $440,537 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1956 a decrease of $12.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the previous year but an increase of $11.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for $51.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total, showed a decrease of $12.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 48.9 p.c. showed a decrease of 12.3 p.c. Shipments in March, 1957 totalled $354,560 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.} \mathrm{as} \mathrm{compared} \mathrm{with} 383,,802 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. the previous year, a decrease of $7.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. with Coast mills registering a decrease of $7.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and Interior mills a decrease of 8.0 p.c. Total shipments for March increased by 13.3 p.c. over the February figure of $312,973 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. Stocks on hand at the end of March, 1957 amounted to $670,137 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., as compared with $563,681 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of March the previous year and $623,708 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of February of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling $301,728 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.}$, while Interior mills showed $368,409 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$.

## Sumary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sammills for February and March, 1956 and 1957. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from $407,393 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In February, 1956 to $440,537 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1956 and from $346,514 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in February to $386,377 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1957. Shipments totalled $312,973 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{in} \mathrm{February}$,1957 and $354,560 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1957 as compared with $353,503 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in February and $383,802 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March of 1956. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from $545,214 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.in} \mathrm{February}$,1956 to $563,681 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March and increased from $623,708 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in February, 1957 to 670,137 $M \mathrm{ft}$. in March of this year.

## Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to $196,111 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1957 as compared with $184,989 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was $1,147 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March as compared with $4,130 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 51.1 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in March, 1957 as compared with 51.1 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during February, 1957 and 1956 respectively were 51.0 and 54.6 p.c.

Shipments
Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $201,641 \mathrm{Mft}$. in March of 1957 and $174,009 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in February, 1957 as compared with $217,577 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1956 and $200,233 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped $152,919 \mathrm{Mft}$. and $166,225 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1957 and 1956 and $138,964 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} \mathrm{and} 153,.270 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{in} \mathrm{February}$,1957 and 1956. Of all shipments actually reported for March, 44.0 p.c. went to points in Canada, 38.9 p.c. to points in United States, 8.1 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 9.0 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 21.8 p.c. of the total, while 49.5 p.c. went by rail, and 28.7 p.c. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmils by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in February and March, 1957 amounted to $306,767 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} \mathrm{and} 301,.728 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $299,100 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $298,687 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in February and March of 1956. Interior mills stocks increased from $246,114 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in February to $264,994 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1956 and increased from 316,941 M ft. in February to $368,409 \mathrm{M}$ ft. in March, 1957. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 33.6 p.c. of the total in March, 1957 as compared with 30.0 p.c. in March, 1956 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 92.9 and 88.8 .

## Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of February and March, 1956 and 1957 fqr Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of March, 1957 amounted to $295,241 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $339,806 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1956. Orders on hand at the end of February, 1957 and 1956 amounted to $278,655 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $337,806 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to $5,078 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1957 and $5,197 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{in} \mathrm{March}$,1956 as compared with $3,1 \mathrm{~S} 3 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in February, 1957 and $5,661 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{in} \mathrm{February} 1956.$,

## Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for March accounted for 77.2 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1955 compared with 79.5 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for February, 1956 and 1957 were 80.5 and 77.1 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.
