## PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS

IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled $405,664 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957 as compared with $439,543 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1956 a decrease of $7.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the previous year but an increase of 7.0 p.c. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which accounts for 49.3 p.c. of the total, showed a decrease of 14.0 p.c. from the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 50.7 p.c. showed a decrease of 0.6 p.c. Shipments in June, 1957 totalled $460,381 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.}$, , as compared with $419,947 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. the previous year, an increase of 9.6 p.c. with Coast mills registering an increase of 7.1 p.c. and Interior mills an increase of 12.9 p.c. Total shipments for June increased by 4.5 p.c. over the May figure of $440,371 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. Stocks on hand at the end of June, 1957 amounted to $524,310 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., as compared with $529,482 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of June the previous year and $593,689 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of May of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling $226,953 \mathrm{Mft}$, while Interior mills showed $297,357 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$.

## Sumary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for May and June, 1956 and 1957. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from $401,373 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1956 to 439,543 M ft . In June, 1956 and from $379,227 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1957 to $405,664 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In June, 1957. Shipments totalled $440,371 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1957 and $460,381 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957 as compared with $401,454 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In May and $419,947 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June of 1956 . Stocks on hand at sawnills decreased from $535,896 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In May, 1956 to $529,482 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June and decreased from $593,689 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1957 to $524,310 \mathrm{Mft}$. in June of this year.

## Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to $198,923 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957 as compared with $201,238 \mathrm{M}$ ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was $1,169 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June as compared with $4,334 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for $49.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in June, 1957 as compared with 53.0 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during May, 1957 and 1956 respectively, were 55.7 and 57.7 p.c.

## Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of nonreporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $255,926 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June of 1957 and 242,630 M ft . in May 1957 as compared with $238,858 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1956 and $244,913 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped $204,455 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $181,089 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957 and 1956 and 197, 741 M ft. and 156,541 M ft : in May, 1957 and 1956. Of all shipments actually reported for June, 47.4 p.c. went to points in Canada, 32.0 p.c. to points in United States, 10.7 p.c. to the United Ringdom and $9.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 23.7 p.c. of the total, while 45.5 p.c. went by rail, and 30.8 p.c. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in May and June, 1957 amounted to $268,933 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $226,953 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with 290,087 M ft . and $281,403 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May and June of 1956. Interior mills stocks increased from $245,809 \mathrm{Mft}$. in May to $248,079 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1956 but decreased from 324,756 M ft. in May to $297,357 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 39.3 p.c. of the total in June, 1957 as compared with 32.5 p.c. in June, 1956 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 92.9 and 84.1 .

Orders on Hand
Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of May and June, 1956 and 1957 for Coast milis on1y. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of nonreporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of June, 1957 amounted to $220,226 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with 275,171 M ft. in June, 1956. Orders on hand at the end of May, 1957 and 1956 amounted to $256,923 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $300,157 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. , respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to $10,750 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957 and $6,520 \mathrm{Mft}$. in June, 1956 as compared with $10,280 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1957 and $6,104 \mathrm{Mft}$. in May, 1956.

## Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for June accounted for 79.0 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1955 compared with 77.4 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for May, 1956 and 1957 were 78.5 and 77.9 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
