## PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

## Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $181,052 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in August of 1957 and 157,045 M ft, in July, 1957 as compared with $215,890 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in August, 1956 and $184,878 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped $216,251 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and 225,836 M ft. in August, 1957 and 1956 and $209,499 \mathrm{Mft}$. and $212,708 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.in} \mathrm{July}$,1957 and 1956. Of all shipments actually reported for August, 39.7 p.c. went to points in Canada, 41.4 p.c. to points in United States, 9.6 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 9.3 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 25.4 p.c. of the total, while 48.8 p.c. went by rail, and 25.8 p.c. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in July and August, 1957 amounted to $259,022 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $266,798 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $278,498 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $263,598 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July and August of 1956. Interior mills stocks increased from $240,450 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July to $250,917 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in August, 1956 but decreased from $299,778 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July to $285,265 \mathrm{~m} \mathrm{ft}$. in August, 1957. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 36.3 p.c. of the total in August, 1957 as compared with 31.2 p.c. in August, 1956 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 91.8 and 85.9.

## Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of July and August, 1956 and 1957 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of nonreporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of August, 1957 amounted to $271,807 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with 275,703 M ft . in August, 1956. Orders on hand at the end of July, 1957 and 1956 amounted to $249,118 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $275,013 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. , respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to $11,143 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in August, 1957 and $4,143 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in August, 1956 as compared with $8,567 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1957 and $5,659 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1956.

## Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for August accounted for 79.7 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1955 compared with 78.1 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for July, 1956 and 1957 were 80.1 and 78.1 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
